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10 COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

11 An Act relating to the Protective Services for
12 Vulnerable Adults Act; amending 43A O.S. 2011,
13 Section 10-103, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 39,
14 O.S.L. 2016 (43A O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 10-103),
15 which relates to definitions; modifying definition;
16 adding definition for personal degradation; and
17 providing an effective date.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

19 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 43A O.S. 2011, Section 10-103, as
20 amended by Section 1, Chapter 39, O.S.L. 2016 (43A O.S. Supp. 2018,
21 Section 10-103), is amended to read as follows:

22 Section 10-103. A. When used in the Protective Services for
23 Vulnerable Adults Act:

24 1. "Protective services" means services which are necessary to
aid a vulnerable adult in meeting the essential requirements for

1 mental or physical health and safety that the vulnerable adult is
2 unable to provide or obtain without assistance. The term
3 "protective services" includes but is not limited to services
4 provided to or obtained for such person in order to prevent or
5 remedy the abuse, neglect, or exploitation of such person;

6 2. "Services which are necessary to aid an individual to meet
7 essential requirements for mental or physical health and safety"
8 include, but shall not be limited to:

- 9 a. the identification of vulnerable adults in need of the
10 services,
- 11 b. the provision of medical care for physical and mental
12 health needs,
- 13 c. the provision of social services assistance in
14 personal hygiene, food, clothing, and adequately
15 heated and ventilated shelter,
- 16 d. protection from health and safety hazards,
- 17 e. protection from physical mistreatment,
- 18 f. guardianship referral,
- 19 g. outreach programs, and
- 20 h. the transportation necessary to secure any of such
21 services.

22 The term shall not include taking the person into physical custody
23 without the consent of the person except as provided for in Sections
24

1 10-107 and 10-108 of this title, and the evaluation, monitoring, and
2 provision of protective placements;

3 3. "Meet essential requirements for mental or physical health
4 and safety" means those actions necessary to provide the health
5 care, food, shelter, clothing, personal hygiene and other care
6 without which physical injury or illness to the vulnerable adult is
7 likely to occur;

8 4. "Incapacitated person" means:

9 a. any person eighteen (18) years of age or older:

10 (1) who is impaired by reason of mental or physical
11 illness or disability, dementia or related
12 disease, mental retardation, developmental
13 disability or other cause, and

14 (2) whose ability to receive and evaluate information
15 effectively or to make and to communicate
16 responsible decisions is impaired to such an
17 extent that such person lacks the capacity to
18 manage his or her financial resources or to meet
19 essential requirements for his or her mental or
20 physical health or safety without assistance from
21 others, or

22 b. a person for whom a guardian, limited guardian, or
23 conservator has been appointed pursuant to the
24 Oklahoma Guardianship and Conservatorship Act;

1 5. "Vulnerable adult" means an individual who is an
2 incapacitated person or who, because of physical or mental
3 disability, including persons with Alzheimer's disease or other
4 dementias, incapacity, or other disability, is substantially
5 impaired in the ability to provide adequately for the care or
6 custody of himself or herself, or is unable to manage his or her
7 property and financial affairs effectively, or to meet essential
8 requirements for mental or physical health or safety, or to protect
9 himself or herself from abuse, verbal abuse, neglect, or
10 exploitation without assistance from others;

11 6. "Caretaker" means a person who has:

- 12 a. the responsibility for the care of a vulnerable adult
13 or the financial management of the resources of a
14 vulnerable adult as a result of a family relationship,
- 15 b. assumed the responsibility for the care of a
16 vulnerable adult voluntarily, by contract, or as a
17 result of the ties of friendship, or
- 18 c. been appointed a guardian, limited guardian, or
19 conservator pursuant to the Oklahoma Guardianship and
20 Conservatorship Act;

21 7. "Department" means the Department of Human Services;

22 8. "Abuse" means causing or permitting:

- 23 a. the infliction of physical pain, injury, sexual abuse,
24 sexual exploitation, unreasonable restraint or

1 confinement, ~~or~~ mental anguish or personal
2 degradation, or

- 3 b. the deprivation of nutrition, clothing, shelter,
4 health care, or other care or services without which
5 serious physical or mental injury is likely to occur
6 to a vulnerable adult by a caretaker or other person
7 providing services to a vulnerable adult;

8 9. "Exploitation" or "exploit" means an unjust or improper use
9 of the resources of a vulnerable adult for the profit or advantage,
10 pecuniary or otherwise, of a person other than the vulnerable adult
11 through the use of undue influence, coercion, harassment, duress,
12 deception, false representation or false pretense;

13 10. "Financial neglect" means repeated instances by a
14 caretaker, or other person, who has assumed the role of financial
15 management, of failure to use the resources available to restore or
16 maintain the health and physical well-being of a vulnerable adult,
17 including, but not limited to:

- 18 a. squandering or negligently mismanaging the money,
19 property, or accounts of a vulnerable adult,
20 b. refusing to pay for necessities or utilities in a
21 timely manner, or
22 c. providing substandard care to a vulnerable adult
23 despite the availability of adequate financial
24 resources;

1 11. "Neglect" means:

2 a. the failure to provide protection for a vulnerable
3 adult who is unable to protect his or her own
4 interest,

5 b. the failure to provide a vulnerable adult with
6 adequate shelter, nutrition, health care, or clothing,
7 or

8 c. negligent acts or omissions that result in harm or the
9 unreasonable risk of harm to a vulnerable adult
10 through the action, inaction, or lack of supervision
11 by a caretaker providing direct services;

12 12. "Personal degradation" means a willful act by a caretaker
13 intended to shame, degrade, humiliate or otherwise harm the personal
14 dignity of a vulnerable adult, or where the caretaker knew or
15 reasonably should have known the act would cause shame, degradation,
16 humiliation or harm to the personal dignity of a reasonable person.
17 Personal degradation includes the taking, transmitting, or display
18 of an electronic image of a vulnerable adult by a caretaker, where
19 the caretaker's actions constitute a willful act intended to shame,
20 degrade, humiliate or otherwise harm the personal dignity of the
21 dependent adult, or where the caretaker knew or reasonably should
22 have known the act would cause shame, degradation, humiliation or
23 harm to the personal dignity of a reasonable person. Personal
24 degradation does not include:

1 a. the taking, transmission or display of an electronic
2 image of a vulnerable adult for the purpose of
3 reporting vulnerable adult abuse to law enforcement,
4 the Department of Human Services or other regulatory
5 agency that oversees caretakers or enforces abuse or
6 neglect laws or rules,

7 b. the taking, transmission or display of an electronic
8 image of a vulnerable adult for the purpose of
9 treatment or diagnosis, or

10 c. the taking, transmission or display of an electronic
11 image of a vulnerable adult as part of an ongoing
12 investigation;

13 13. "Sexual abuse" means:

14 a. oral, anal, or vaginal penetration of a vulnerable
15 adult by or through the union with the sexual organ of
16 a caretaker or other person providing services to the
17 vulnerable adult, or the anal or vaginal penetration
18 of a vulnerable adult by a caretaker or other person
19 providing services to the vulnerable adult with any
20 other object, or

21 b. for the purpose of sexual gratification, the touching,
22 feeling or observation of the body or private parts of
23 a vulnerable adult by a caretaker or other person
24 providing services to the vulnerable adult, or

1 c. indecent exposure by a caretaker or other person
2 providing services to the vulnerable adult;

3 ~~13.~~ 14. "Indecent exposure" means forcing or requiring a
4 vulnerable adult to:

5 a. look upon the body or private parts of another person
6 or upon sexual acts performed in the presence of the
7 vulnerable adult, or

8 b. touch or feel the body or private parts of another;

9 ~~14.~~ 15. "Self-neglect" means the action or inaction of a
10 vulnerable adult which causes that person to fail to meet the
11 essential requirements for physical or mental health and safety due
12 to the vulnerable adult's lack of awareness, incompetence or
13 incapacity;

14 ~~15.~~ 16. "Sexual exploitation" includes, but is not limited to,
15 a caretaker's causing, allowing, permitting or encouraging a
16 vulnerable adult to engage in prostitution or in the lewd, obscene,
17 or pornographic photographing, filming or depiction of the
18 vulnerable adult as those acts are defined by state law; and

19 ~~16.~~ 17. "Verbal abuse" means the use of words, sounds, or other
20 communication including, but not limited to, gestures, actions or
21 behaviors, by a caretaker or other person providing services to a
22 vulnerable adult that are likely to cause a reasonable person to
23 experience humiliation, intimidation, fear, shame or degradation.
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1 B. Nothing in this section shall be construed to mean a
2 vulnerable adult is abused or neglected for the sole reason the
3 vulnerable adult, in good faith, selects and depends upon spiritual
4 means alone through prayer, in accordance with the practices of a
5 recognized religious method of healing, for the treatment or cure of
6 disease or remedial care, or a caretaker or other person
7 responsible, in good faith, is furnishing such vulnerable adult
8 spiritual means alone through prayer, in accordance with the tenets
9 and practices of a recognized church or religious denomination, for
10 the treatment or cure of disease or remedial care in accordance with
11 the practices of or express consent of the vulnerable adult.

12 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
