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## AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to oil and gas; creating the State Strategic Petroleum Reserve; directing certain funds to be appropriated for certain purpose; establishing maximum reserve amount; directing the Corporation Commission to maintain Reserve; defining term; establishing conditions to be met for release of oil from Reserve; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

- SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 281 of Title 52, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. 1. Beginning July 1, 2023, and each fiscal year thereafter, the Legislature is hereby directed to appropriate any surplus funds that are not constitutionally required to be deposited into the Constitutional Reserve Fund and are not otherwise encumbered to establish and maintain a State Strategic Petroleum Reserve. The Reserve shall contain up to fifteen million barrels of crude oil. The Corporation Commission shall maintain the Reserve and is

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authorized to promulgate rules necessary to effectuate the provisions of this act.

- 2. For the purposes of this act, "State Strategic Petroleum Reserve" means state-owned oil stocks maintained in oil wells within the boundaries of this state.
- B. Oil may be released from the Reserve by executive order of the Governor or by direction of the Legislature if a measure directing the release is enacted; provided, evidence of one or more of the following conditions or circumstances for release shall be established:
- 1. The state or any oil-producing entity operating in the state faces a disruption in supply;
- 2. An exchange agreement with another country, state, political subdivision, or oil company is entered into;
  - 3. The Governor has declared a state of emergency;
- 4. Non-emergency sales are deemed necessary to raise revenue or lessen supply disruptions; and
- 5. The price of gas has increased by more than twenty-five percent (25.0%) within a three-month period; provided, oil released to service stations under this act shall be used to lower the cost of gas and diesel to consumers in this state.
- SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
