7	An Act relating to charter schools; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 3-136, as amended by Section 1, Chapter
8	277, O.S.L. 2014 (70 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 3-136), which relates to charter school compliance with
9	certain regulations; prohibiting a charter school from entering into a contract with a teacher who does
10	not hold a valid certificate; allowing a charter school to enter into a contract with a teacher issued
11	an emergency or provisional certificate; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 3-136, as
16	amended by Section 1, Chapter 277, O.S.L. 2014 (70 O.S. Supp. 2016,
17	Section 3-136), is amended to read as follows:
18	Section 3-136. A. A charter school shall adopt a charter which
19	will ensure compliance with the following:
20	1. A charter school shall comply with all federal regulations
21	and state and local rules and statutes relating to health, safety,
22	civil rights and insurance. By January 1, 2000, the State
23	Department of Education shall prepare a list of relevant rules and
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statutes which a charter school must comply with as required by this
 paragraph and shall annually provide an update to the list;

2. A charter school shall be nonsectarian in its programs,
admission policies, employment practices, and all other operations.
A sponsor may not authorize a charter school or program that is
affiliated with a nonpublic sectarian school or religious
institution;

3. The charter school may provide a comprehensive program of 8 9 instruction for a prekindergarten program, a kindergarten program or 10 any grade between grades one and twelve. Instruction may be provided to all persons between the ages of four (4) and twenty-one 11 12 (21) years. A charter school may offer a curriculum which emphasizes a specific learning philosophy or style or certain 13 subject areas such as mathematics, science, fine arts, performance 14 arts, or foreign language. The charter of a charter school which 15 offers grades nine through twelve shall specifically address whether 16 17 the charter school will comply with the graduation requirements established in Section 11-103.6 of this title. No charter school 18 shall be chartered for the purpose of offering a curriculum for deaf 19 or blind students that is the same or similar to the curriculum 20 being provided by or for educating deaf or blind students that are 21 being served by the Oklahoma School for the Blind or the Oklahoma 22 School for the Deaf; 23

4. A charter school shall participate in the testing as
 required by the Oklahoma School Testing Program Act and the
 reporting of test results as is required of a school district. A
 charter school shall also provide any necessary data to the Office
 of Accountability;

5. Except as provided for in the Oklahoma Charter Schools Act
and its charter, a charter school shall be exempt from all statutes
and rules relating to schools, boards of education, and school
districts;

A charter school, to the extent possible, shall be subject
to the same reporting requirements, financial audits, audit
procedures, and audit requirements as a school district. The State
Department of Education or State Auditor and Inspector may conduct
financial, program, or compliance audits. A charter school shall
use the Oklahoma Cost Accounting System to report financial
transactions to the sponsoring school district;

17 7. A charter school shall comply with all federal and state
18 laws relating to the education of children with disabilities in the
19 same manner as a school district;

8. A charter school shall provide for a governing body for the
 school which shall be responsible for the policies and operational
 decisions of the charter school;

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9. A charter school shall not be used as a method of generating
 revenue for students who are being home schooled and are not being
 educated at an organized charter school site;

10. A charter school may not charge tuition or fees;
11. A charter school shall provide instruction each year for at
least the number of days required in Section 1-109 of this title;
12. A charter school shall comply with the student suspension
requirements provided for in Section 24-101.3 of this title;

9 13. A charter school shall be considered a school district for
10 purposes of tort liability under The Governmental Tort Claims Act;

11 14. Employees of a charter school may participate as members of 12 the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma in accordance with 13 applicable statutes and rules if otherwise allowed pursuant to law;

14 15. A charter school may participate in all health and related 15 insurance programs available to the employees of the sponsor of the 16 charter school;

17 16. A charter school shall comply with the Oklahoma Open
18 Meeting Act and the Oklahoma Open Records Act;

19 17. The governing body of a charter school shall be subject to 20 the same conflict of interest requirements as a member of a local 21 school board; and

18. No later than September 1 each year, the governing board of each charter school formed pursuant to the Oklahoma Charter Schools Act shall prepare a statement of actual income and expenditures for

1 the charter school for the fiscal year that ended on the preceding 2 June 30, in a manner compliant with Section 5-135 of this title. 3 The statement of expenditures shall include functional categories as defined in rules adopted by the State Board of Education to 4 5 implement the Oklahoma Cost Accounting System pursuant to Section 5-145 of this title. Charter schools shall not be permitted to submit 6 estimates of expenditures or prorated amounts to fulfill the 7 requirements of this paragraph; and 8

9 <u>19. A charter school shall not enter into any written contract</u>
10 with a teacher who does not hold a valid certificate issued or
11 recognized by the State Board of Education authorizing the teacher
12 to teach the grades or subject matter for which the teacher is
13 employed. A charter school may enter into a written contract with a
14 teacher who has been issued an emergency or provisional certificate,
15 as provided for in Section 6-187 of this title.

B. The charter of a charter school shall include a description of the personnel policies, personnel qualifications, and method of school governance, and the specific role and duties of the sponsor of the charter school.

20 C. The charter of a charter school may be amended at the 21 request of the governing body of the charter school and upon the 22 approval of the sponsor.

D. A charter school may enter into contracts and sue and besued.

E. The governing body of a charter school may not levy taxes or
 issue bonds.

3 F. The charter of a charter school shall include a provision specifying the method or methods to be employed for disposing of 4 5 real and personal property acquired by the charter school upon expiration or termination of the charter or failure of the charter 6 7 school to continue operations. Except as otherwise provided, any real or personal property purchased with state or local funds shall 8 9 be retained by the sponsoring school district. If a charter school 10 that was previously sponsored by the board of education of a school 11 district continues operation within the school district under a new 12 charter sponsored by an entity authorized pursuant to Section 3-132 13 of this title, the charter school may retain any personal property purchased with state or local funds for use in the operation of the 14 charter school until termination of the new charter or failure of 15 the charter school to continue operations. 16

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017.
SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
