7	An Act relating to waters and water rights; creating the Regional Water Development Act; stating
8	Legislative findings promoting the development of regional water projects; stating purpose; stating
9	construction; authorizing the Oklahoma Water Resources Board to assist development of regional
10	water plans and projects; stating purpose of regional water plans and projects; authorizing Oklahoma Water
11	Resources Board to promulgate rules; providing for codification; providing for noncodification; and
12	declaring an emergency.
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1021.1 of Title 82, unless there
18	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Regional Water
20	Development Act.
21	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
22	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1021.2 of Title 82, unless there
23	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The Legislature hereby declares that, in order to efficiently 1 utilize and orderly develop the water resources available within 2 each geographic region of this state for the benefit of our 3 citizens, the public policy of this state is to promote and support 4 the planning and development of long-term water projects on a 5 regional basis and to achieve this policy through the use of 6 programs and incentives that first seek to maximize the efficient 7 use of water resources available within each region. 8 The Legislature finds that prioritizing efforts to more efficiently 9 develop intra-regional water resources to meet intra-regional needs 10 is consistent with the provisions of Section 105.12 of Title 82 of 11 12 the Oklahoma Statutes and further advances the objectives of the Water for 2060 Act, Section 1088.1 et seq. of Title 82 of the 13 Oklahoma Statutes. Provided, however, that nothing in this act 14 shall be construed as amending the provisions of law pertaining to 15 rights or permits to use water. Provided, further, that nothing in 16 this act shall be construed as prohibiting the transportation of 17 water for use outside the stream system wherein the water originates 18 pursuant to the conditions outlined in Section 105.12 of Title 82 of 19 the Oklahoma Statutes. 20

21 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 22 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1021.3 of Title 82, unless there 23 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Oklahoma Water Resources Board shall dedicate staff and resources, as available, to assist in the development of regional water plans and projects in furtherance of this act, including, but not limited to:

Promoting and assisting in the coordination of regional and
 local water planning efforts;

Providing assistance in the formation of voluntary regional
water planning efforts;

9 3. Compiling and sharing information and providing available
10 technical resources to assist in such regional water planning
11 efforts; and

4. Coordinating potential federal state, tribal, local and
 corporation partnership opportunities for financing and incentives
 to develop regional plans, technical studies, and related projects.

B. Contingent upon funding available and in addition to the
general assistance described above, the Oklahoma Water Resources
Board may provide analysis or guidance regarding options available
for regional water plans.

SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1021.4 of Title 82, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Regional water plans and projects should be developed to efficiently maximize the use of water resources within a region, and should include, but not be limited to the following:

Voluntary consolidation and regionalization of existing
 infrastructure and water supplies in order to utilize limited
 resources most efficiently;

2. Maximizing existing reservoirs through activities such as
raising dams, reallocating existing storage pools, and/or the
dredging of reservoirs;

3. Increasing water storage and minimizing transportation and
evaporative losses of water used for agricultural purposes;

9 4. Managing or augmenting aquifer recharge rates through
10 activities such as the land application or injection of excess fresh
11 or recycled water; and

12 5. Implementing conservation measures, such as system water
 13 loss audits, water reuse projects and system sustainability
 14 projects.

SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

The Oklahoma Water Resources Board is authorized to promulgate rules as necessary to implement the provisions of this act.

SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
