15	Section 353.30. A. The use of collaborative practice					
16	agreements in the practice of pharmacy shall be acceptable permitted					
17	within the rules promulgated by the State Board of Pharmacy under					
18	subsection C of this section and in consultation with the State					
19	Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision and the State Board of					
20	Osteopathic Examiners.					
21	B. The Board shall develop and prepare permanent rules relating					
22	to training requirements and administration of immunizations and					
23	therapeutic injections in consultation within the State Board of					
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<sup>1</sup> Medical Licensure and Supervision and the State Board of Osteopathic
<sup>2</sup> Examiners.

<sup>3</sup> C. A pharmacist who has completed a requisite course of <sup>4</sup> training as approved by the Board in consultation with the State <sup>5</sup> Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision and the State Board of <sup>6</sup> Osteopathic Examiners may administer:

<sup>7</sup> <u>1. Administer</u> therapeutic injections on orders from a licensed <sup>8</sup> prescriber, and may administer immunizations that have been approved <sup>9</sup> or authorized by the Food and Drug Administration without a patient-<sup>10</sup> specific prescription, standing order or similar arrangement;

11 2. Prescribe and dispense oral preventive contraceptive drugs 12 under a collaborative practice agreement with an allopathic 13 physician or osteopathic physician in accordance with the rules 14 promulgated by the Board under subsection C of this section; and 15 3. Administer preventive contraceptive injections under a 16 collaborative practice agreement with an allopathic physician or 17 osteopathic physician in accordance with the rules promulgated by 18 the Board under subsection C of this section.

19 <u>C. The Board shall, in consultation with the State Board of</u> 20 <u>Medical Licensure and Supervision and the State Board of Osteopathic</u> 21 <u>Examiners, promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this</u> 22 <u>section. Such rules shall include, but not be limited to, training</u> 23 <u>requirements pertaining to the services described in subsection B of</u> 24 <u>this section.</u>
