SENATE BILL 232

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to the practice of pharmacy; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 353.30, which relates to use of agreements; modifying terminology; authorizing pharmacist to perform certain services under certain conditions; directing promulgation of rules; clarifying language; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 353.30, is amended to read as follows:

Section 353.30. A. The use of collaborative practice agreements in the practice of pharmacy shall be ~~acceptable~~ permitted within the rules promulgated by the State Board of Pharmacy under subsection C of this section and in consultation with the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision and the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners.

~~B. The Board shall develop and prepare permanent rules relating to training requirements and administration of immunizations and therapeutic injections in consultation within the State Board of~~

3 ~~C.~~ A pharmacist who has completed a requisite course of
4 training as approved by the Board in consultation with the State
5 Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision and the State Board of
6 Osteopathic Examiners may administer:

7 1. Administer therapeutic injections on orders from a licensed
8 prescriber, and may administer immunizations that have been approved
9 or authorized by the Food and Drug Administration without a patient-
10 specific prescription, standing order or similar arrangement;

11 2. Prescribe and dispense oral preventive contraceptive drugs
12 under a collaborative practice agreement with an allopathic
13 physician or osteopathic physician in accordance with the rules
14 promulgated by the Board under subsection C of this section; and

15 3. Administer preventive contraceptive injections under a
16 collaborative practice agreement with an allopathic physician or
17 osteopathic physician in accordance with the rules promulgated by
18 the Board under subsection C of this section.

19 C. The Board shall, in consultation with the State Board of
20 Medical Licensure and Supervision and the State Board of Osteopathic
21 Examiners, promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this
22 section. Such rules shall include, but not be limited to, training
23 requirements pertaining to the services described in subsection B of
24 this section.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.

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
