Retail sales of industrial hemp and hemp products may be 8 9 conducted without a license so long as the products and the hemp 10 used in the products were grown and cultivated legally in this state 11 or another state or jurisdiction and meet the same or substantially 12 the same requirements for processing hemp products or growing hemp. 13 The addition of derivatives of hemp, including hemp-derived 14 cannabidiol, to cosmetics, personal care products and products 15 intended for human or animal consumption shall be permitted without 16 a license and shall not be considered an adulteration of such 17 products. Nothing in this section shall exempt any individual or 18 entity from compliance with food safety and licensure laws, rules 19 and regulations as set forth under the Oklahoma Public Health Code. 20 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019."
