## 1 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES - FLOOR VERSION 2 STATE OF OKLAHOMA 3 1st Session of the 56th Legislature (2017) ENGROSSED SENATE 4 BILL NO. 244 By: Stanislawski of the Senate 5 and 6 Jordan of the House 7 8 9 An Act relating to virtual charter schools; directing virtual charter schools to keep attendance records 10 for enrolled students; directing the governing bodies of virtual charter schools to adopt certain policy by 11 certain date; providing criteria for policy; providing definition; requiring a virtual charter 12 school to submit a report upon a student accumulating a certain number of absences; requiring virtual 13 charter schools to develop certain learning plans; requiring the governing bodies of virtual charter 14 schools to develop and adopt certain policy; providing minimum criteria for policy; providing for 15 promulgation of rules; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency. 16 17 18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 19 20 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-145.8 of Title 70, unless 21 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 22 It shall be the duty of each virtual charter school approved 23 and sponsored by the Statewide Virtual School Board pursuant to the 24

- provisions of Section 3-145.3 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes
  to keep a full and complete record of the attendance of all students
  enrolled in the virtual charter school.
  - B. By July 1, 2017, the governing body of each virtual charter school shall adopt an attendance policy. The attendance policy shall include the following provisions:
  - 1. A student who attends a virtual charter school shall be considered in attendance for a quarter if the student:
    - a. completes instructional activities on no less than ninety percent (90%) of the days within the quarter, or
    - b. is on pace for on-time completion of the course as defined by the governing board of the virtual charter school.
  - 2. For a student who does not meet either of the criteria set forth in paragraph 1 of this subsection, an absence shall be recorded for the school day on which the student did not complete any instructional activities.
  - C. For the purposes of this section, "instructional activities" shall include but not be limited to online logins to curriculum or programs offered by the virtual charter school, offline activities, completed assignments, testing, face-to-face communications with virtual charter school staff or service providers or meetings with

1 virtual charter school staff or service providers via 2 teleconference, videoconference, email, text or phone.

- D. The virtual charter school shall submit a report to the parent or legal guardian of a student who has accumulated ten (10) absences.
- E. 1. Each virtual charter school shall develop a personal learning plan for each student, in coordination with the student and the parents or legal guardians of the student.
- 2. The governing body of each virtual charter school shall develop and adopt a policy regarding failure to participate in instructional activities. The policy shall state, at a minimum, that if a student fails to comply with the personal learning plan after receiving a notification pursuant to subsection D of this section and reasonable opportunity to comply has been provided, a student shall be subject to certain consequences, including removal from the virtual charter school. If the governing body of the virtual charter school decides the student's removal is warranted, the virtual charter school shall provide the parents or legal guardians of the student with a written list of available education options.
- F. The Statewide Virtual Charter School Board shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section.
- 23 SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 24 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby

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declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
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    be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
