Each 4 term is for a seven-year period and members may be reappointed to 5 subsequent terms. Board members shall meet the following criteria: 6 1. One member, who shall be a physician licensed to practice in this state, and one member, who shall be a psychiatrist certified as 7 a diplomate of the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology, shall 8 9 both be appointed from a list containing the names of not less than 10 three physicians and not less than three psychiatrists submitted to

11 the Governor by the Oklahoma State Medical Association;

<u>Two members shall be osteopathic physicians licensed to</u>
 <u>practice in this state, appointed from a list containing the names</u>
 <u>of not less than six osteopathic physicians submitted to the</u>
 Governor by the Oklahoma Osteopathic Association;

16 <u>3.</u> One member, who shall be an attorney licensed to practice in 17 this state and shall be appointed from a list of not less than three 18 names submitted to the Governor by the Board of Governors of the 19 Oklahoma Bar Association;

20 <u>3. 4.</u> One member, who shall be a psychologist, licensed to 21 practice in this state, who shall be appointed from a list of not 22 less than three names submitted to the Governor by the Oklahoma 23 State Psychological Association;

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1 4. <u>5.</u> Three members, qualified by education and experience in 2 the area of substance abuse recovery, who shall be appointed from a 3 list of not less than ten names submitted to the Governor by a state 4 association of substance abuse recovery programs or organizations; 5 and

5. Four <u>6.</u> Two members who shall be citizens of this state, at
least one of whom shall be either a current or former consumer of
mental health services.
