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9	[Oklahoma Aeronautics Commission - duties of the
10	Commission - effective date]
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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 3 O.S. 2011, Section 85, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 85. A. The Oklahoma Aeronautics Commission and its
16	Director acting under its authority is empowered and directed to
17	encourage, foster, and assist in the development of aeronautics in
18	this state and to encourage the establishment of airports and air
19	navigation facilities. It shall cooperate with and assist the
20	federal government, the municipalities of this state, and other
21	persons in the development of aeronautics, and shall seek to
22	coordinate the aeronautical activities of these bodies and persons.
23	Municipalities are authorized to cooperate with the Commission in
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SENATE FLOOR VERSION - SB254 SFLR (Bold face denotes Committee Amendments) the development of aeronautics and aeronautical facilities in this
 state.

B. The Commission may organize and administer a voluntary program of air-age education in cooperation with the schools, colleges, and for the general public, and may prepare and conduct voluntary flight clinics for airmen and issue such bulletins and publications as may be required.

8 C. The Commission shall assist in all aeronautical matters 9 related to emergency management actions in conformance with federal 10 directions and with the Emergency Operations Plan of the state.

11 D. The Commission may establish air markers throughout the 12 state.

E. The Commission may purchase and install roadside signs
directing highway traffic to airports, subject to approval of the
State Transportation Commission.

16 F. The Commission shall:

Draft and recommend necessary legislation to advance the
 interests of the state in aeronautics;

Represent the state in aeronautical matters before federal
 agencies and other state agencies; and

3. Participate as party plaintiff or defendant or as intervener
on behalf of the state or any municipality or citizen thereof in any
proceeding which involves the interest of the state in aeronautics.

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G. 1. The Commission may, insofar as is reasonably possible, make available its engineering and other technical services to any municipality or person desiring them in connection with the planning, acquisition, construction, improvement, maintenance, or operation of airports or navigation facilities.

The Commission may render financial assistance by grant or 6 2. 7 loan or both to any municipality or municipalities acting jointly in the planning, acquisition, construction, improvement, maintenance, 8 9 or operation of an airport owned or controlled, or to be owned or 10 controlled, by such municipality or municipalities, out of 11 appropriations or other monies made available by the Legislature for 12 such purposes. Such financial assistance may be furnished in connection with federal or other financial aid for the same 13 purposes. 14

The Commission shall be designated as the agent of this 15 3. state or political subdivision of this state for the purpose of 16 applying for, receiving, administering and disbursing federal funds 17 and other public monies for the benefit of general aviation 18 airports, except reliever airports, as may be available under 19 applicable federal law or other laws. If requested by a political 20 subdivision, the Commission may act as its or their agent in 21 contracting for and supervising such planning, acquisition, 22 construction, improvement, maintenance, or operation; and all 23 political subdivisions are authorized to designate the Commission as 24

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1 their agent for the foregoing purposes. The Commission, as 2 principal on behalf of the state, may enter into any contracts with 3 the United States or with any person, which may be required in connection with a grant or loan of federal monies for municipal 4 5 airport or air navigation facility purposes. All federal monies accepted under this section shall be accepted and transferred or 6 7 expended by the Commission upon such terms and conditions as are prescribed by the United States. All monies received by the 8 9 Commission pursuant to this section shall be deposited in the 10 Oklahoma Aeronautics Commission Fund in the State Treasury and shall 11 be paid out by the Commission in accordance with the terms and 12 conditions of any agreement entered into under the provisions of 13 this section.

The Commission is authorized on behalf of and in the 14 Η. 1. 15 name of the state, out of appropriations and other monies made 16 available for such purposes, to plan, zone, establish, construct, enlarge, improve, maintain, equip, operate, regulate, protect, and 17 police airports and air navigation facilities, either within or 18 without the state, including the construction, installation, 19 equipping, maintenance, and operation at such airports of buildings 20 and other facilities for the servicing of aircraft or for the 21 comfort and accommodation of air travelers. However, the regulatory 22 authority shall not extend to any airman employed by, nor to any 23 aeronautics facility or aircraft under the exclusive possession, 24

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1 operation, or control of, a person holding a certificate of public 2 convenience and necessity issued by any agency of the United States 3 to operate as a common carrier by air of persons and/or property in interstate commerce. For such purposes the Commission may, by 4 5 purchase, gift, devise, or lease, acquire property, real or personal, or any interest therein including easements in 6 aeronautical hazards or land outside the boundaries of an airport or 7 airport site, as are necessary to permit safe and efficient 8 9 operation of the state airports or to permit the removal, 10 elimination, obstruction-marking or obstruction-lighting of airport 11 hazards, or to prevent the establishment of airport hazards. In 12 like manner the Commission may acquire existing airports and air navigation facilities. However, the Commission shall not acquire or 13 take over any airport or air navigation facility owned or controlled 14 15 by a municipality of this or any other state without the consent of 16 such municipality. The Commission may, by sale, lease, or otherwise, dispose of any such property, airport, air navigation 17 facility, or portion thereof or interest therein. The disposal, by 18 sale, lease, or otherwise, shall be in accordance with the laws of 19 this state governing the disposition of other property of the state, 20 except that, in the case of disposals to any municipality or state 21 government or the United States for aeronautical purposes incident 22 thereto, the sale, lease, or other disposal may be effected in such 23

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1 manner and upon such terms as the Commission may deem in the best
2 interest of the state.

3 2. All airports owned by the state shall be within the primary jurisdiction of the State Oklahoma Aeronautics Commission for 4 5 purposes of design, development, and operation; provided, that airports owned and operated by the Oklahoma Space Industry 6 7 Development Authority shall be exempt from such provisions, and during the time of a national emergency, the Air National Guard 8 9 shall be exempt from such provisions, and provided further, that any 10 airport owned by the state may be leased by the Commission to a public or private agency, as it may deem fit. 11

Nothing contained in this act the Oklahoma Aeronautics
 <u>Commission Act</u> shall be construed to limit any right, power, or
 authority of the state or a municipality to regulate airport hazards
 by zoning.

The Commission may exercise any powers granted by this 16 4. section jointly with any municipalities or with the United States. 17 5. In operating an airport or air navigation facility 18 a. owned or controlled by the state, the Commission may 19 enter into contracts, leases, and other arrangements 20 for a term not exceeding twenty-five (25) years with 21 any persons granting the privilege of using or 22 improving such airport or air navigation facility or 23 any portion or facility thereof or space therein for 24

commercial purposes; conferring the privilege of supplying goods, commodities, things, services, or facilities at such airport or air navigation facility; or making available services to be furnished by the Commission or its agents at such airport or air navigation facility.

7 In each such case the Commission may establish the terms and conditions and fix the charges, rentals, or 8 9 fees for the privileges or services, which shall be reasonable and uniform for the same class of 10 privileges or services and shall be established with 11 12 due regard to the property and improvements used and the expenses of operation to the state; provided, that 13 in no case shall the public be deprived of its 14 15 rightful, equal, and uniform use of the airport, air navigation facility or portion or facility thereof. 16 The Commission may by contract, lease, or other b. 17 arrangement, upon a consideration fixed by it, grant 18 to any qualified person for a term not to exceed 19 twenty-five (25) years the privilege of operating, as 20 agent of the state or otherwise, any airport owned or 21 controlled by the state; provided, that no such person 22 shall be granted any authority to operate the airport 23 other than as a public airport or to enter into any 24

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contracts, leases, or other arrangements in connection with the operation of the airport which the Commission might not have undertaken under subparagraph a of this paragraph.

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5 с. To enforce the payment of any charges for repairs to, 6 or improvements, storage, or care of, any personal 7 property made or furnished by the Commission or its agents in connection with the operation of an airport 8 9 or air navigation facility owned or operated by the state, the state shall have liens on such property, 10 11 which shall be enforceable by the Commission as 12 provided by law.

In accepting federal monies under this section, the 13 6. Commission shall have the same authority to enter into contracts on 14 15 behalf of the state as is granted to the Commission under subsection G of this section with respect to federal monies accepted on behalf 16 of municipalities. All monies received by the Commission pursuant 17 to this section shall be deposited in the Oklahoma Aeronautics 18 Commission Fund in the State Treasury and shall be paid out of the 19 Commission Fund in accordance with the terms and conditions of any 20 agreement entered into under the provisions of this section. 21

7. The Commission shall grant no exclusive right for the use of any airport or air navigation facility under its jurisdiction. This shall not be construed to prevent the making of contracts, leases,

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and other arrangements pursuant to subsection (h) of this section
 subsection.

3 I. The Commission may enter into any contracts necessary to the execution of the powers granted it by this act the Oklahoma 4 5 Aeronautics Commission Act. All contracts made by the Commission, 6 either as the agent of the state or as the agent of any 7 municipality, shall be made pursuant to the laws of the state governing the making of like contracts. When the planning, 8 9 acquisition, construction, improvement, maintenance, or operation of 10 any airport or air navigation facility is financed wholly or 11 partially with federal monies, the Commission as agent of the state 12 or of any municipality may let contracts in the manner prescribed by the federal authorities acting under the laws of the United States 13 and any rules or regulations made thereunder. 14

15 J. 1. The Commission, the Director, or any officer or employee of the Commission designated by it shall have the power to hold 16 investigations, inquiries, and hearings concerning matters covered 17 by the provisions of this act the Oklahoma Aeronautics Commission 18 Act and the rules, regulations, and orders of the Commission. 19 Hearings shall be open to the public and shall be held upon such 20 call or notice as the Commission shall deem advisable. Each member 21 of the Commission, the Director, and every officer or employee of 22 the Commission designated by it to hold any inquiry, investigation, 23 or hearing shall have the power to administer oaths and 24

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1 affirmations, certify to all official acts, issue subpoenas, and 2 order the attendance and testimony of witnesses and the production 3 of papers, books, and documents. In case of the failure of any person to comply with any subpoena or order issued under the 4 5 authority of this subsection, or on the refusal of any witness to 6 testify to any matters regarding which he may be lawfully 7 interrogated, it shall be the duty of the district court of any county or of the judge thereof, on application of the Commission or 8 9 its authorized representative, to compel obedience by proceedings 10 for contempt, as in the case of disobedience of the requirements of 11 a subpoena issued from such court or a refusal to testify therein. 12 2. In order to facilitate the making of investigations by the Commission in the interest of public safety and promotion of 13 aeronautics the public interest requires, and it is therefore 14 15 provided, that the reports of investigations or hearings, or any part thereof, shall not be admitted in evidence or used for any 16 purpose in any suit, action, or proceeding growing out of any matter 17 referred to in the investigation, hearing, or report thereof, except 18 in case of any suit, action, or proceeding, civil or criminal, 19 instituted by or in behalf of the Commission or in the name of the 20 state under the provisions of this act the Oklahoma Aeronautics 21 Commission Act or other laws of the state relating to aeronautics; 22 nor shall any member of the Commission, or the Director, or any 23 officer or employee of the Commission be required to testify to any 24

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facts ascertained in, or information gained by reason of, such person's official capacity, or be required to testify as an expert witness in any suit, action, or proceeding involving any aircraft. Subject to the foregoing provisions, the Commission may in its discretion make available to appropriate federal, state and municipal agencies information and material developed in the course of its investigations and hearings.

K. 1. The Commission is authorized to confer with or to hold
joint hearings with any agency of the United States in connection
with any matter arising under this act the Oklahoma Aeronautics
<u>Commission Act</u> or relating to the sound development of aeronautics.

The Commission is authorized to avail itself of the
 cooperation, services, records, and facilities of the agencies of
 the United States as fully as may be practicable in the
 administration and enforcement of this act the Oklahoma Aeronautics
 <u>Commission Act</u>. The Commission shall furnish to the agencies of the
 United States its cooperation, services, records, and facilities,
 insofar as may be practicable.

19 3. The Commission shall report to the appropriate agency of the 20 United States all accidents in aeronautics in this state of which it 21 is informed and shall, insofar as is practicable, preserve, protect, 22 and prevent the removal of the component parts of any aircraft 23 involved in an accident being investigated by it until the federal 24 agency institutes an investigation.

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1 L. The Commission may organize and administer an aerospace education program in cooperation with universities, colleges and 2 schools for the general public. The Commission may also plan and 3 act jointly in a cooperative aviation research or high technology 4 5 program. As part of these programs, the Commission may issue aviation communication films and publications. 6 7 M. The Commission shall administer an airport inspection program for all public-use airports within the State of Oklahoma. 8 9 The inspection program shall occur on a three-year cycle and shall 10 be administered by the Oklahoma Aeronautics Commission. Airport 11 owners, including individuals and municipalities, shall provide 12 access to airport facilities for conducting the inspections. The 13 Commission shall provide a written report to each public-use airport detailing the findings of such inspections. 14 SECTION 2.
