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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 4104, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	Section 4104. A private educational institution shall grant
18	only those degrees authorized by the Oklahoma State Regents for
19	Higher Education unless approved otherwise by a national or regional
20	accrediting agency which is recognized by the Secretary of the
21	United States Department of Education as a reliable authority as to
22	the quality of education or training offered by institutions of
23	higher education for the purposes of the Higher Education Act of
24	1965, as amended.

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B. 1. This section shall not apply to religious degrees which are used solely for religious purposes within a religious organization or any institution of higher education whose primary purpose is to provide religious training or theological education and which is exempt from taxation pursuant to the provisions of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, 26 U.S.C., Section 501(c)(3).

- 2. Each degree title offered pursuant to this subsection shall include a religious modifier. The religious modifier must be placed on the degree, on the transcript and wherever the title of the degree appears in official school documents or publications.
- 3. Each religious organization offering degrees pursuant to
 this subsection shall be accredited by an accrediting service or
 company that has been in operation for a minimum of five (5) years
 and is in operation in more than one state within the United States.
 The accrediting service or company shall perform regular reviews of
 the religious organization using best practices.
 - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017.
- SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
