No commissioned officer of the Department shall, while in such position, be a candidate for any political office or take part in or contribute any money or other thing of value, directly or indirectly, to any political campaign or to any candidate for public office. Anyone convicted of violating the provisions of this paragraph shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished as provided by law.

4. The Commissioner or any employee of the Department shall not be a candidate for any political office, or in any way be active or participate in any political contest of any Primary, General, or Special Election, except to cast a ballot. No commissioned officer of the Department, while in the performance of the officer's

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1 assigned duty of providing security and protection, shall be 2 considered as participating in a political campaign. The Commissioner of Public Safety is hereby authorized to 7 send employees of the Department of Public Safety to schools such as 8 9 Northwestern University Center for Public Safety, Southern Police 10 Institute, the FBI National Academy, the Institute of Police 11 Technology and Management, or to any other schools of similar 12 training which would be conducive to improving the efficiency of the 13 Oklahoma Highway Patrol Division and the Department of Public Safety. While an employee is attending a school, the Commissioner 14 is authorized to permit the employee to use a state-owned vehicle 15 and to use a fuel-purchasing card for any expenses related to the 16 17 operation of the vehicle. In addition, while an employee is attending the FBI National Academy, a one-time expense allowance of 18 Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) for uniforms, fees, travel, room 19 and board, and other related expenses shall be paid to the employee 20 21 by the Department; provided, the employee shall not be further 22 compensated through the State Travel Reimbursement Act, and, if any other agency reimburses the employee for any expenses, the 23 reimbursement shall be given to the Department. All purchases made 24

by the employee with the expense allowance shall be considered
 property of the employee.

Any former commissioned officer of the Department whose 3 1. Η. separation from the Department was at such officer's own request and 4 5 not a result of such officer's own actions contrary to the policy of the Department or was not as a result of the retirement of that 6 officer from the Department may make application for reinstatement 7 as a commissioned officer of the division or section of the 8 9 Department in which such officer was previously employed, provided 10 such reinstated officer will be able to complete twenty (20) years 11 of credited service by the time the reinstated officer reaches 12 sixty-two (62) years of age. The Commissioner may waive the requirements of possessing the number of semester hours or degree as 13 required in subsection B of this section for any former commissioned 14 15 officer making application for reinstatement as a commissioned officer of the Department. The Commissioner may require the 16 17 applicant for reinstatement to attend selected courses of instruction, as prescribed by the Commissioner. 18

19 2. In the event of future hostilities wherein the Congress of 20 the United States declares this nation in a state of war with a 21 foreign nation, including military service brought about by the 22 Vietnam War, any period of military service served by a commissioned 23 officer of the Department shall be considered as continued service 24 with such Department, provided such commissioned officer returns to

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1	duty with the Department within sixty (60) days after release from
2	military service.
