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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 480, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	Section 480. Sections 481 through 518 of <del>Title 59 of the</del>
19	Oklahoma Statutes this title shall be known and may be cited as the
20	"Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure and Supervision
21	Act". It is the intent that this act shall apply <del>only</del> to
22	allopathic, osteopathic, and surgical practices and to exclude any
23	other healing practices. Allopathy is a method of treatment
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practiced by recipients of the degree of Doctor of Medicine, but specifically excluding homeopathy. The terms medicine, physician and drug(s) used herein are limited to allopathic and osteopathic practice. SECTION 2. REPEALER 59 O.S. 2011, Section 481, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 349, O.S.L. 2013 and Section 624, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 83, O.S.L. 2014 (59 O.S. Supp. 2014,
