L2	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified

 - B. The same deductibles, coinsurance, and other limitations as apply to similar services covered under the health benefit plan apply to coverage for the diagnosis, evaluation, and treatment of lymphedema required to be covered under this section. Nothing in this section requires a health benefit plan to provide a separate set of benefit limitations or maximums for the diagnosis, evaluation or treatment of lymphedema.
 - C. For purposes of this section, gradient compression garments:
 - 1. Require a prescription;
 - 2. Are custom-fit for the covered individual; and
- 3. Do not include disposable medical supplies such as over-thecounter compression or elastic knee-high or other stocking products.
 - D. "Health benefit plan" means any plan or arrangement as defined in subsection C of Section 6060.4 of Title 36 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.

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
