18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:		
19	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 19 O.S. 2011, Section 510, is		
20	amended to read as follows:		
21	Section 510. Any person, otherwise qualified, who has been a		
22	resident of the State of Oklahoma for two (2) years, has been a		
23	registered voter of the party whose nomination he or she seeks, or a		
24	registered Independent, within the county from which such person		

1 seeks election for the six (6) months next preceding the first day of the filing period, except in 2004, when such person must have 2 3 been a qualified registered elector no later than December 21, 2003, 4 is at least twenty-five (25) years of age next preceding the date of 5 filing for office, possesses at least a high school education and has served as a duly certified peace officer, in a full-time 6 7 capacity, for a period of four (4) years or more prior to the date of filing for the office of county sheriff, shall be eligible to 8 hold the office of county sheriff or to file therefor. Provided, 10 however, in counties with populations of five hundred thousand 11 (500,000) or more, the person seeking election shall also be a 12 current certified peace officer in good standing. Within twelve 13 (12) months of taking office, all newly elected or appointed 14 sheriffs shall complete a sheriff's administrative school which has 15 been developed by the Oklahoma Sheriff's Sheriffs' Association and 16 which has been approved by the Council on Law Enforcement Education 17 and Training (CLEET). Failure to complete the sheriff's 18 administrative school within the specified period shall preclude the 19 new sheriff from obtaining CLEET certification. New sheriffs with 20 prior CLEET certification, who fail to attend the sheriff's 21 administrative school, shall have their CLEET certification revoked. 22 Provided, however, the provisions of this section relating to 23 qualifications shall not apply to any person serving as a county

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1	sheriff or to any person previously serving as county sheriff prior
2	to the adoption of this statute.
3	For purposes of this section, "peace officer" shall mean a full-
4	time duly appointed or elected officer who is paid for working more
5	than twenty-five (25) hours per week and whose duties are to
6	preserve the public peace, protect life and property, prevent crime,
7	serve warrants, and enforce state, federal or military laws and
8	local ordinances of this state or any political subdivision thereof.

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        1. Has been a resident of the State of Oklahoma for two (2)
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    years<del>, has</del>;
        2. Has been a registered voter of the party whose nomination he
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    or she seeks, or a registered Independent, within the county from
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    which such person seeks election, for the six (6) months next
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    preceding the first day of the filing period, except in 2004, when
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    such person must have been a qualified registered elector no later
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    than December 21, 2003, is;
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        3. Is at least twenty-five (25) years of age next preceding the
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    date of filing for office, possesses;
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- 4. Possesses at least a high school education, shall be eligible to hold the office of county sheriff or to file therefor.

  Provided, however, in counties with populations of five hundred thousand (500,000) or more, the person seeking election shall also be a current certified peace officer in good standing.; and
  - 5. a. in counties with populations of twenty-five thousand

    (25,000) or more but fewer than one hundred thousand

    (100,000) according to the most recent federal

    decennial census, has served as a duly certified peace

    officer in a full-time capacity for a period of three

    (3) years or more or has served as a duly certified

    peace officer in a part-time capacity as a military

    police officer or reserve officer in this or any other

    state for a period of five (5) years or more, or
    - b. in counties with populations of one hundred thousand (100,000) or more according to the most recent federal decennial census, holds a current certification as a peace officer in good standing.

In counties with populations under twenty-five thousand (25,000) according to the most recent federal decennial census, no previous service or certification as a peace officer shall be required.

Provided, any person who previously served as a duly certified peace officer for a period of five (5) years or more and who has completed a program for refresher training conducted by the Council

- on Law Enforcement Education and Training as provided in Section

  3311.4 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall be deemed to have

  met the qualifications set forth in this paragraph.
- B. Within twelve (12) months of taking office, all newly 4 5 elected or appointed sheriffs shall complete a sheriff's administrative school which has been developed by the Oklahoma 6 7 Sheriff's Association and which has been approved by the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET). Failure to complete 9 the sheriff's administrative school within the specified period 10 shall preclude the new sheriff from obtaining CLEET certification. 11 New sheriffs with prior CLEET certification, who fail to attend the sheriff's administrative school, shall have their CLEET 12 certification revoked. 13
  - <u>C.</u> Provided, however, the provisions of this section relating to qualifications shall not apply to any person serving as a county sheriff or to any person previously serving as county sheriff prior to the adoption of this statute.
  - SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3311.16 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
