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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 11 O.S. 2011, Section 50-112, as
14	amended by Section 4, Chapter 346, O.S.L. 2019 (11 O.S. Supp. 2020,
15	Section 50-112), is amended to read as follows:
16	Section 50-112. A. All persons employed as full-time duly
17	appointed or elected officers who are paid for working more than
18	twenty-five (25) hours per week or any person hired by a
19	participating municipality who is undergoing police training to
20	become a permanent police officer of the municipality shall
21	participate in the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System
22	upon initial employment with a police department of a participating
23	municipality. All such persons shall submit to a physical-medical
24	examination pertaining to sight, hearing, agility and other

1 conditions the requirements of which shall be established by the 2 State Board Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement Board. The 3 person shall be required to complete this physical-medical 4 examination prior to the beginning of actual employment. This 5 examination shall identify any preexisting conditions. Except as 6 otherwise provided in this section, a police officer shall be not 7 less than twenty-one (21) nor more than forty-five (45) fifty (50) 8 years of age when accepted for membership in the System. However, 9 if a municipality should be found to be in noncompliance with the 10 provisions of Article 50 of this title, as determined by the State 11 Board, then any current full-time active police officer employed by 12 a municipality as of July 1, 2001, shall not be denied eligibility 13 to participate in the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System 14 solely due to age. The State Board shall have authority to deny or 15 revoke membership of any person submitting false information in such 16 person's membership application. The State Board shall have final 17 authority in determining eligibility for membership in the System, 18 pursuant to the provisions of this article.

B. The police chief of any participating municipality may be exempt from membership in the System or may become a member provided the member is not a retired member and the requirements of this section are met at the time of employment.

C. A member of the System who has attained his or her normal retirement date may, if the member so elects, agree to terminate employment and retire as a member of the System and make an election to receive distributions from the System. If a retired member is reemployed by a participating municipality in the position of police chief or in a position which is not covered by the System, retirement shall include receipt by such retired member of inservice distributions from the System.

7 D. A former member of the System who terminates from covered 8 employment and who has neither retired from the System nor entered 9 the Oklahoma Police Deferred Option Plan and is later employed in a 10 covered position with a participating municipality shall not be 11 denied eligibility to become a member of the System because he or 12 she is forty-five (45) fifty (50) years of age or older. If such 13 member has withdrawn his or her contributions prior to re-entering 14 the System and the member desires to receive credit for such prior 15 service, then the member shall pay back such contributions and 16 interest pursuant to Section 50-111.1 of this title.

17 Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, Е. 18 a municipality that employs two (2) or fewer full-time police 19 officers may employ a police officer who is more than forty-five 20 (45) fifty (50) years of age and who has never participated in the 21 Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System, but such police 22 officer shall not be eligible to participate in the System. Such 23 police officer shall be counted in the limitation imposed by this 24 subsection. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, the State _ _
