14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:							
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2011, Section 5-112, is

17	Thereafter, the Secretary shall update such amounts every ten (10)					
18	years according to the percent difference between the price index					
19	for the twelve (12) months preceding the beginning of the calendar					
20	year during which the adjustment is made and the price index for the					
21	year when the most recent preceding adjustment was made. If the					
22	adjusted amount is not a multiple of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00),					
23	the fee shall be rounded to the nearest multiple of One Hundred					
24	Dollars (\$100.00). For purposes of this section, "price index"

shall mean the average over a calendar year of the Consumer Price
Index (all items - United States city average) published monthly by
the Bureau of Labor Statistics. The adjusted fees shall be
published on the website of the State Election Board and shall be
otherwise communicated as the Secretary determines appropriate.

B. A filing fee received by the Secretary of the State Election
Board shall be deposited in the State Election Board Revolving Fund
created pursuant to Section 3-107 of this title. A filing fee
received by a secretary of a county election board shall be
deposited in the County Election Board Special Depository Account
authorized by Section 3-108 of this title.

12 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2011, Section 20-102, is 13 amended to read as follows:

Section 20-102. A. Candidates for the nomination for President 14 of the United States shall file with the Secretary of the State 15 Election Board. Such candidates shall be members of political 16 parties recognized under the laws of the State of Oklahoma and shall 17 have filed a statement of candidacy with the Federal Election 18 Commission and shall have raised and expended not less than Five 19 Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for said the office. The candidates 20 shall be required to swear an oath or affirm that they meet the 21 aforementioned qualifications, and their signatures shall be 22 witnessed by a notary public. Such filing beginning at 8:00 a.m. on 23 the first Monday in December and ending at 5:00 p.m. on the next 24

1 succeeding Wednesday, or at a time prescribed by the State Election Board for a Presidential Preferential Primary to be held on a date 2 other than the first Tuesday in March. A statement of candidacy 3 must be accompanied by a petition supporting a candidate's filing 4 5 signed by one percent (1%) of the registered voters in each congressional district eligible to vote for a candidate or one 6 7 thousand (1,000) registered voters in each congressional district eligible to vote for a candidate, whichever is less, as reflected by 8 9 the latest January 15 registration report; or by a cashier's check or certified check in the amount of Two Thousand Five Hundred 10 11 <del>Dollars (\$2,500.00)</del> Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00). The State Election Board shall cause the names of all candidates who have 12 13 filed within the proper time to be printed on the official ballots. The ballots shall be prepared as provided for by law. Voters shall 14 be restricted to one vote for the candidate of his or her choice of 15 the political party in which the voter is registered. 16

B. Each page of a petition supporting a candidate's filing
shall identify the county and the congressional district, and shall
contain the names of registered voters in only one congressional
district and in only one county.

C. Each page of a petition supporting a candidate's filing shall be verified. Verification shall be made in substantial compliance with the provisions of Section 6 of Title 34 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
