22	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2011, Section 5-112, is

1 Section 5-112. A. A declaration of candidacy must be 2 accompanied by <del>a</del>:

3	<u>1. A</u> petition supporting a candidate's filing signed by <del>four</del>
4	percent (4%) of the registered voters eligible to vote for a
5	candidate in the first election wherein the candidate's name could
6	appear on the ballot, as reflected by the latest January 15
7	registration report not fewer than two percent (2%) of the number of
8	registered voters in the district, county or state, as appropriate
9	for the office sought; or <del>by a</del>
10	2. A cashier's check or certified check in the amount of Two
11	Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for candidates filing with the Secretary
12	of the State Election Board or the secretary of a county election
13	board; provided, however, such cashier's check or certified check
14	shall be in the amount of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars
15	(\$1,500.00) for candidates for Governor, One Thousand Dollars
16	(\$1,000.00) for candidates for United States Senator and Seven
17	Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) for candidates for the United States
18	Congress, and Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for candidates for
19	Lieutenant Governor, Corporation Commission, Attorney General, State

3 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2011, Section 20-102, is 4 amended to read as follows:

5 Section 20-102. A. Candidates for the nomination for President of the United States shall file with the Secretary of the State 6 7 Election Board. Such candidates shall be members of political parties recognized under the laws of the State of Oklahoma and shall 8 9 have filed a statement of candidacy with the Federal Election 10 Commission and shall have raised and expended not less than Five 11 Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for said the office. The candidates 12 shall be required to swear an oath or affirm that they meet the 13 aforementioned qualifications, and their signatures shall be 14 witnessed by a notary public. Such filing beginning at 8:00 a.m. on 15 the first Monday in December and ending at 5:00 p.m. on the next 16 succeeding Wednesday, or at a time prescribed by the State Election 17 Board for a Presidential Preferential Primary to be held on a date 18 other than the first Tuesday in March. A statement of candidacy 19 must be accompanied by a petition supporting a candidate's filing 20 signed by one percent (1%) of the registered voters in each 21 congressional district eligible to vote for a candidate or one 22 thousand (1,000) registered voters in each congressional district 23 eligible to vote for a candidate, whichever is less, as reflected by 24 the latest January 15 registration report; or by a cashier's check

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or certified check in the amount of Two Thousand Five Hundred
Dollars (\$2,500.00) Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00). The State
Election Board shall cause the names of all candidates who have
filed within the proper time to be printed on the official ballots.
The ballots shall be prepared as provided for by law. Voters shall
be restricted to one vote for the candidate of his or her choice of
the political party in which the voter is registered.

B. Each page of a petition supporting a candidate's filing
shall identify the county and the congressional district, and shall
contain the names of registered voters in only one congressional
district and in only one county.

12 C. Each page of a petition supporting a candidate's filing 13 shall be verified. Verification shall be made in substantial 14 compliance with the provisions of Section 6 of Title 34 of the 15 Oklahoma Statutes.

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1 aforementioned qualifications, and their signatures shall be 2 witnessed by a notary public. Such filing beginning at 8:00 a.m. on 3 the first Monday in December and ending at 5:00 p.m. on the next succeeding Wednesday, or at a time prescribed by the State Election 4 5 Board for a Presidential Preferential Primary to be held on a date other than the first Tuesday in March. A statement of candidacy 6 must be accompanied by a petition supporting a candidate's filing 7 signed by one percent (1%) of the registered voters in each 8 9 congressional district eligible to vote for a candidate or one 10 thousand (1,000) registered voters in each congressional district 11 eligible to vote for a candidate, whichever is less, as reflected by 12 the latest January 15 registration report; or by a cashier's check or certified check in the amount of Two Thousand Five Hundred 13 Dollars (\$2,500.00) Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00). The State 14 Election Board shall cause the names of all candidates who have 15 filed within the proper time to be printed on the official ballots. 16 17 The ballots shall be prepared as provided for by law. Voters shall be restricted to one vote for the candidate of his or her choice of 18 the political party in which the voter is registered. 19

B. Each page of a petition supporting a candidate's filing
shall identify the county and the congressional district, and shall
contain the names of registered voters in only one congressional
district and in only one county.
