12	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2011, Section 5-112, is
13	amended to read as follows:
14	Section 5-112. A. A declaration of candidacy must be
15	accompanied by a :
16	<u>1. A</u> petition supporting a candidate's filing signed by four
17	percent (4%) of the registered voters eligible to vote for a
18	candidate in the first election wherein the candidate's name could
19	appear on the ballot, as reflected by the latest January 15
20	registration report not fewer than two percent (2%) of the number of
21	registered voters in the district, county or state, as appropriate
22	for the office sought; or by a

9	B. A filing fee received by the Secretary of the State Election
10	Board shall be deposited in the State Election Board Revolving Fund
11	created pursuant to Section 3-107 of this title. A filing fee
12	received by a secretary of a county election board shall be
13	deposited in the County Election Board Special Depository Account
14	authorized by Section 3-108 of this title.
15	SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2011, Section 20-102, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	Section 20-102. A. Candidates for the nomination for President
18	of the United States shall file with the Secretary of the State
19	Election Board. Such candidates shall be members of political
20	parties recognized under the laws of the State of Oklahoma and shall
21	have filed a statement of candidacy with the Federal Election
22	Commission and shall have raised and expended not less than Five
23	Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for said the office. The candidates
24	shall be required to swear an oath or affirm that they meet the

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1 aforementioned qualifications, and their signatures shall be witnessed by a notary public. Such filing beginning at 8:00 a.m. on 2 the first Monday in December and ending at 5:00 p.m. on the next 3 succeeding Wednesday, or at a time prescribed by the State Election 4 5 Board for a Presidential Preferential Primary to be held on a date other than the first Tuesday in March. A statement of candidacy 6 7 must be accompanied by a petition supporting a candidate's filing signed by one percent (1%) of the registered voters in each 8 9 congressional district eligible to vote for a candidate or one 10 thousand (1,000) registered voters in each congressional district 11 eligible to vote for a candidate, whichever is less, as reflected by 12 the latest January 15 registration report; or by a cashier's check 13 or certified check in the amount of Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00). The State 14 Election Board shall cause the names of all candidates who have 15 filed within the proper time to be printed on the official ballots. 16 17 The ballots shall be prepared as provided for by law. Voters shall be restricted to one vote for the candidate of his or her choice of 18 the political party in which the voter is registered. 19

B. Each page of a petition supporting a candidate's filing
shall identify the county and the congressional district, and shall
contain the names of registered voters in only one congressional
district and in only one county.

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1	C. Each page of a petition supporting a candidate's filing
2	shall be verified. Verification shall be made in substantial
3	compliance with the provisions of Section 6 of Title 34 of the
4	Oklahoma Statutes.
5	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
