16	establishing responsibility for election cost under specified circumstances; providing for supply of
17	ballots; providing for levy of annual assessment on certain property based on assessed value and
18	specifying purpose thereof; providing for a lien against property if assessment is unpaid; stating
19	priority of lien; directing specified accounting procedures by certain county officers; directing
20	certain costs be paid from the proceeds of the district; requiring interest to be charged on
21	delinquent assessment; permitting dissolution of a public safety protection district and discontinuation
22	of annual assessment and describing process therefor; providing for codification; and providing an
23	effective date.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

2 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 3 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 29-151 of Title 11, unless there 4 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

5 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma Public6 Safety Protection District Act".

7 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
8 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 29-152 of Title 11, unless there
9 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

10 A. The governing body of a municipality within a county may 11 adopt joint resolutions calling for a vote to:

Initiate the creation of a public safety protection
 district; and

14 2. Authorize the levy of an annual assessment based on the 15 assessed value of the property in the district, the proceeds of 16 which shall be used solely for support of a district initiated 17 pursuant to subparagraph 1 of this subsection.

No joint resolution shall combine the question of creation of a district and authorization for the levy of an assessment in the same question, but such separate resolutions may be submitted at the election.

B. Any joint resolution submitted to the registered voters of the municipality as provided in this section and in Section 6 of this act may be submitted at the next general election. When a

SENATE FLOOR VERSION - SB345 SFLR (Bold face denotes Committee Amendments) district is organized pursuant to paragraph 1 of subsection A of this section, it shall have the powers conferred by the Oklahoma Public Safety Protection District Act; provided, the power to levy and collect an annual assessment shall require approval of the voters of a question submitted pursuant to paragraph 2 of subsection A of this section.

SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 29-153 of Title 11, unless there
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

10 A. A public safety protection district shall include all11 territory located within the municipality.

B. Management of the public safety protection district, as well as management of any employee hired from district funds, shall be vested within the existing administration of the municipal government that created the district.

16 C. Budgetary oversight shall be vested within the existing 17 legislative body of the municipal government that created the 18 district.

D. A public safety protection district created pursuant to thisact shall be deemed a political subdivision of this state.

21 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 22 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 29-154 of Title 11, unless there 23 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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A. The municipality initiating the creation of the public safety protection district may pay the cost of the elections authorized in Section 2 of this act or the cost may be paid as provided in Section 6 of this act.

5 Β. The elections authorized in Section 2 of this act, and the notice thereof, shall be conducted in the same manner as other 6 7 municipal questions are submitted to the electorate of the municipality. The notice for an election to create a public safety 8 9 district shall require the registered voters of the municipality to 10 cast ballots which contain the words: "Public Safety Protection 11 District - Yes" and "Public Safety Protection District - No" or words equivalent thereto. The notice for an election to authorize 12 the levy of an assessment shall require the registered voters of the 13 municipality to cast ballots which contain the words: "Annual 14 15 Assessment to fund Public Safety Protection District - Yes" and "Annual Assessment to fund Public Safety Protection District - No" 16 or words equivalent thereto and shall specify the proposed number of 17 mills on the dollar of assessed value of property in the district. 18

C. All residents of the municipality who are qualified electors shall be qualified to vote on the propositions. The elections shall be conducted in accordance with the general election laws of the state, and the regular election officials shall be in charge at the usual polling place of each regular precinct, or part of a precinct, which shall include lands within the boundaries of the municipality.

 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 29-155 of Title 11, unless there
 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

If the certified election results show that a majority of all 4 5 the votes cast for the creation of a public safety protection district are "Public Safety Protection District - Yes", the 6 7 governing body of the municipality shall, by adoption of an ordinance and/or resolution, declare the public safety protection 8 9 district established. If the certified election results show that a 10 majority of all the votes cast for the levy of an assessment are 11 "Annual Assessment to fund Public Safety Protection District - Yes", 12 the governing body of the municipality shall, by adoption of an ordinance and/or resolution, be authorized to levy the assessment. 13 Such ordinances shall be filed in the office of the county clerk 14

15 in the county.

16 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 29-156 of Title 11, unless there 18 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The regular election in the district shall be held at the same time as the General Election in this state or on the second Tuesday in November in those years that a General Election is not held.

B. In those years that a General Election is not held theentire cost of the election shall be paid by the district. When the

1 election is held at the same time as the General Election, the 2 district shall pay only for the cost directly attributable to 3 district election.

C. All polling places of precincts, all or any part of which
include areas within the boundaries of the district, shall be
supplied ballots for the purpose of permitting electors of the
district to vote.

8 SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 9 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 29-157 of Title 11, unless there 10 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

11 If approved by the voters pursuant to the provisions of this 12 act, there shall be levied an annual assessment of the approved number of mills on the dollar of assessed value of the property in 13 the district, the proceeds of which shall be used solely for the 14 15 operation and maintenance of the public safety protection district, 16 including expenses related to purchasing and maintaining public safety equipment and payment of salaries and benefits of the city 17 employees who provide law enforcement and/or fire protection public 18 safety services within the district, and municipal expenses related 19 to housing prisoners. 20

21 SECTION 8. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 22 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 29-158 of Title 11, unless there 23 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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All assessments levied under the authority of the Oklahoma Public Safety Protection District Act shall be a lien against the tract of land on which they have been levied, until paid, and the lien shall be coequal with the lien of ad valorem and other taxes, including special assessments, and prior and superior to all other liens and the assessment shall draw interest and shall be collected in the same manner as ad valorem taxes.

8 SECTION 9. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 9 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 29-159 of Title 11, unless there 10 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

11 The county assessor shall compute and enter in respective 12 columns of the tax rolls the respective sums in dollars and cents to be paid on each piece of property therein enumerated, and the clerk 13 shall certify to the county treasurer in the county where the 14 district is located the amount of assessment in each fund levied 15 upon each tract by the board, and the county treasurer shall enter 16 the amount of each in separate columns of the tax list of the 17 county, and the assessments shall be collected by the county 18 treasurer at the same time and in the same manner as all other taxes 19 are collected in this state. If any assessment becomes delinquent, 20 it shall draw interest as a penalty after delinquency at the rate of 21 eighteen percent (18%) per annum. All assessments and penalties 22 collected or received by the county treasurer pursuant to the 23 Oklahoma Public Safety Protection District Act shall be paid to the 24

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municipal treasurers in their proportionate amounts for the benefit
 of the public safety protection district.

3	SECTION 10. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
4	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 29-160 of Title 11, unless there
5	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
6	A public safety protection district may be dissolved, or an
7	annual assessment for the public safety protection district may be
8	discontinued, by a majority vote of the registered voters voting at
9	an election called for that purpose by the governing body of the
10	municipality; provided, such questions shall be separated on the
11	ballot.
12	SECTION 11. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.
