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1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
L2	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
L3	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4 of Title 75, unless there is
L 4	created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
L5	A. There is hereby created the Spring Cleaning Commission
L 6	within the legislative branch of state government to continue until
L7	November 1, 2023. The Commission shall have the duty to:
L 8	1. Identify outdated, redundant, unnecessary or obsolete state
L 9	laws;
20	2. Identify titles of law that are poorly organized due to
21	repeated amendment or other reason;
22	3. Identify sections of law that are written in archaic
23	language;

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4. Identify bureaucratic procedures or structures in state law that should be streamlined; and

- 5. Develop recommendations to implement its suggested changes, including but not limited to repeal of or amendment to the Oklahoma Constitution, statutes, administrative rules and agency policies.
- B. The Commission shall be composed of eight (8) former members of the Legislature who are not registered legislative or executive lobbyists or employees of this state, four each appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- C. The Commission shall be constituted by December 1, 2017, and initial appointments shall be made by that date.
- D. By mutual agreement of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Commission may be directed at any time to focus its efforts on certain titles of law, or any other purpose in keeping with the spirit of this section. The Commission may also choose, with agreement from a majority of five members, to explore areas of law not directed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- E. The Commission shall deliver reports to the President Pro
 Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
 Representatives as requested or as deemed appropriate by the Chair
 of the Commission. A majority of five members of the Commission

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must give its approval to any formal recommendation of the

Commission, but the Chair may deliver to the President Pro Tempore

of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives any

findings the Chair deems appropriate.
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- F. The members of the Commission shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority and shall continue to serve until a successor is appointed. No member of the Commission shall serve more than six (6) years.
- G. The Chair and Vice-Chair of the Commission shall be selected by the Commission from among the members.
 - H. A quorum of the Commission shall consist of five (5) members and shall be required for any final action by the Commission.
 - I. Staff support for the Commission shall be provided by the Senate and the House of Representatives. Nothing in this section shall preclude the Commission from requesting and utilizing the assistance and expertise of nonmembers.
- J. The Commission shall set its own meeting schedule and be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2017.

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
