1 used generally to describe any system capable of level 1-5 driving 2 automation, as specified in SAE International Recommended Practice 3 J3016 including, but not limited to, core vehicle functions as 4 listed in this section.

5 "Dynamic driving task" means all of the real-time в. 6 operational and tactical functions required to operate a vehicle in 7 on-road traffic, excluding the strategic functions such as trip 8 scheduling and selection of destinations and waypoints and including 9 without limitation:

Lateral vehicle motion control via steering; 1.

11 Longitudinal vehicle motion control via acceleration and 2. 12 deceleration;

13 3. Monitoring the driving environment via object and event 14 detection, recognition, classification and response preparation;

4. Object and event response execution;

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Only the State of Oklahoma may enact a law or take any other Α. 22 action to regulate the operation of motor vehicles equipped with 23 driving automation systems in Oklahoma.

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1	B. 1. Pursuant to subsection A of this Section, the State of
2	Oklahoma preempts the authority of a county or municipality to
3	prohibit, restrict or regulate the operation of motor vehicles
4	equipped with driving automation systems on the basis of those
5	vehicles being equipped with driving automation systems; and
6	2. Supersedes any existing law or ordinance of a county or
7	municipality that prohibits, restricts or regulates the testing or
8	operation of motor vehicles equipped with driving automation
9	systems.

11	the provisions of Section 58 of Article V of the Oklahoma
