SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 328.3, as  
last amended by Section 1, Chapter 397, O.S.L. 2019 (59 O.S. Supp.  
2020, Section 328.3), is amended to read as follows:

Section 328.3 As used in the State Dental Act, the following  
words, phrases, or terms, unless the context otherwise indicates,  
shall have the following meanings:

- 1        1. "Accredited dental college" means an institution whose  
2 dental educational program is accredited by the Commission on Dental  
3 Accreditation of the American Dental Association;
- 4        2. "Accredited dental hygiene program" means a dental hygiene  
5 educational program which is accredited by the Commission on Dental  
6 Accreditation of the American Dental Association;
- 7        3. "Accredited dental assisting program" means a dental  
8 assisting program which is accredited by the Commission on Dental  
9 Accreditation of the American Dental Association;
- 10       4. "Board" means the Board of Dentistry;
- 11       5. "Certified dental assistant" means a dental assistant who  
12 has earned and maintains current certified dental assistant  
13 certification from the Dental Assisting National Board (DANB);
- 14       6. "Coronal polishing" means a procedure limited to the removal  
15 of plaque and stain from exposed tooth surfaces, utilizing a slow  
16 speed hand piece with a prophylaxis/polishing cup or brush and polishing  
17 agent and is not prophylaxis. To be considered prophylaxis,  
18 examination for calculus and scaling must be done by a hygienist or  
19 dentist;
- 20       7. "Deep sedation" means a drug-induced depression of  
21 consciousness during which patients cannot be easily aroused but  
22 respond purposefully following repeated or painful stimulation. The  
23 ability to independently maintain ventilator function may be  
24 impaired. Patients may require assistance in maintaining a patent

1 airway, and spontaneous ventilation may be inadequate.

2 Cardiovascular function is usually maintained;

3 8. "Dentistry" means the practice of dentistry in all of its  
4 branches;

5 9. "Dentist" means a graduate of an accredited dental college  
6 who has been issued a license by the Board to practice dentistry as  
7 defined in Section 328.19 of this title;

8 10. "Dental ambulatory surgical center (DASC)" means a facility  
9 that operates exclusively for the purpose of furnishing outpatient  
10 surgical services to patients. A DASC shall have the same  
11 privileges and requirements as a dental office and additionally must  
12 be an accredited facility by the appropriate entity;

13 11. "Dental office" means an establishment owned and operated  
14 by a dentist for the practice of dentistry, which may be composed of  
15 reception rooms, business offices, private offices, laboratories,  
16 and dental operating rooms where dental operations are performed;

17 12. "Dental hygienist" means an individual who has fulfilled  
18 the educational requirements and is a graduate of an accredited  
19 dental hygiene program and who has passed an examination and has  
20 been issued a license by the Board and who is authorized to practice  
21 dental hygiene as hereinafter defined;

22 13. "Dental assistant or oral maxillofacial surgery assistant"  
23 means an individual working for a dentist, under the dentist's  
24 direct supervision or direct visual supervision, and performing

1 duties in the dental office or a treatment facility, including the  
2 limited treatment of patients in accordance with the provisions of  
3 the State Dental Act. A dental assistant or oral maxillofacial  
4 surgery assistant may assist a dentist with the patient; provided,  
5 this shall be done only under the direct supervision or direct  
6 visual supervision and control of the dentist and only in accordance  
7 with the educational requirements and rules promulgated by the  
8 Board;

9 14. "Dental laboratory" means a location, whether in a dental  
10 office or not, where a dentist or a dental laboratory technician  
11 performs dental laboratory technology;

12 15. "Dental laboratory technician" means an individual whose  
13 name is duly filed in the official records of the Board, which  
14 authorizes the technician, upon the laboratory prescription of a  
15 dentist, to perform dental laboratory technology, which services  
16 must be rendered only to the prescribing dentist and not to the  
17 public;

18 16. "Dental laboratory technology" means using materials and  
19 mechanical devices for the construction, reproduction or repair of  
20 dental restorations, appliances or other devices to be worn in a  
21 human mouth;

22 17. "Dental specialty" means a specialized practice of a branch  
23 of dentistry, recognized by the Board, where the dental college and  
24 specialty program are accredited by the Commission on Dental

1 Accreditation (CODA), or a dental specialty recognized by the Board,  
2 requiring a minimum number of hours of approved education and  
3 training and/or recognition by a nationally recognized association  
4 or accreditation board;

5 18. "Direct supervision" means the supervisory dentist is in  
6 the dental office or treatment facility and, during the appointment,  
7 personally examines the patient, diagnoses any conditions to be  
8 treated, and authorizes the procedures to be performed by a dental  
9 hygienist, dental assistant, or oral maxillofacial surgery  
10 assistant. The supervising dentist is continuously on-site and  
11 physically present in the dental office or treatment facility while  
12 the procedures are being performed and, before dismissal of the  
13 patient, evaluates the results of the dental treatment;

14 19. "Direct visual supervision" means the supervisory dentist  
15 has direct ongoing visual oversight which shall be maintained at all  
16 times during any procedure authorized to be performed by a dental  
17 assistant or an oral maxillofacial surgery assistant;

18 20. "Fellowship" means a program designed for post-residency  
19 graduates to gain knowledge and experience in a specialized field;

20 21. "General anesthesia" means a drug-induced loss of  
21 consciousness during which patients are not arousable, even by  
22 painful stimulation. The ability to independently maintain  
23 ventilator function is often impaired. Patients often require  
24 assistance in maintaining a patent airway, and positive pressure

1 ventilation may be required because of depressed spontaneous  
2 ventilation or drug-induced depression of neuromuscular function.  
3 Cardiovascular function may be impaired;

4 22. "General supervision" means the supervisory dentist has  
5 diagnosed any conditions to be treated within the past thirteen (13)  
6 months, has personally authorized the procedures to be performed by  
7 a dental hygienist, and will evaluate the results of the dental  
8 treatment within a reasonable time as determined by the nature of  
9 the procedures performed, the needs of the patient, and the  
10 professional judgment of the supervisory dentist. General  
11 supervision may only be used to supervise a hygienist and may not be  
12 used to supervise an oral maxillofacial surgery assistant or dental  
13 assistant;

14 23. "Indirect supervision" means the supervisory dentist is in  
15 the dental office or treatment facility and has personally diagnosed  
16 any conditions to be treated, authorizes the procedures to be  
17 performed by a dental hygienist, remains in the dental office or  
18 treatment facility while the procedures are being performed, and  
19 will evaluate the results of the dental treatment within a  
20 reasonable time as determined by the nature of the procedures  
21 performed, the needs of the patient, and the professional judgment  
22 of the supervisory dentist. Indirect supervision may not be used  
23 for an oral maxillofacial surgery assistant or a dental assistant;

24

1       24. "Investigations" means an investigation proceeding,  
2 authorized under Sections 328.15A and 328.43a of this title, to  
3 investigate alleged violations of the State Dental Act or the rules  
4 of the Board;

5       25. "Laboratory prescription" means a written description,  
6 dated and signed by a dentist, of dental laboratory technology to be  
7 performed by a dental laboratory technician;

8       26. "Minimal sedation" means a minimally depressed level of  
9 consciousness, produced by a pharmacological method, that retains  
10 the patient's ability to independently and continuously maintain an  
11 airway and respond normally to tactile stimulation and verbal  
12 command. Although cognitive function and coordination may be  
13 modestly impaired, ventilator and cardiovascular functions are  
14 unaffected;

15       27. "Mobile dental anesthesia provider" means a licensed and  
16 anesthesia-permitted dentist, physician or certified registered  
17 nurse anesthetist (CRNA) that has a mobile dental unit and provides  
18 anesthesia in dental offices and facilities in the state;

19       28. "Mobile dental clinic" means a permitted motor vehicle or  
20 trailer utilized as a dental clinic, and/or that contains dental  
21 equipment and is used to provide dental services to patients on-site  
22 and shall not include a mobile dental anesthesia provider. A mobile  
23 dental clinic shall also mean and include a volunteer mobile dental  
24 facility that is directly affiliated with a church or religious



1 organization as defined by Section 501(c)(3) or 501(d) of the United  
2 States Internal Revenue Code, the church or religious organization  
3 with which it is affiliated is clearly indicated on the exterior of  
4 the mobile dental facility, and such facility does not receive any  
5 form of payment either directly or indirectly for work provided to  
6 patients other than donations through the affiliated church or  
7 religious organization; provided, that the volunteer mobile dental  
8 facility shall be exempt from any registration fee required under  
9 the State Dental Act;

10 29. "Moderate sedation" means a drug-induced depression of  
11 consciousness during which patients respond purposefully to verbal  
12 commands, either alone or accompanied by light tactile stimulation.  
13 No interventions are required to maintain a patent airway, and  
14 spontaneous ventilation is adequate. Cardiovascular function is  
15 usually maintained;

16 30. "Prophylaxis" means the removal of any and all calcareous  
17 deposits, stains, accretions or concretions from the supragingival  
18 and subgingival surfaces of human teeth, utilizing instrumentation  
19 by scaler or periodontal curette on the crown and root surfaces of  
20 human teeth including rotary or power-driven instruments. This  
21 procedure may only be performed by a dentist or dental hygienist;

22 31. "Patient" or "patient of record" means an individual who  
23 has given a medical history and has been examined and accepted by a  
24 dentist for dental care;

1 32. "Residencies" are programs designed for advanced clinical  
2 and didactic training in general dentistry or other specialties or  
3 other specialists at the post-doctoral level recognized by the  
4 Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA) or the Board;

5 33. "Supervision" means direct supervision, direct visual  
6 supervision, indirect supervision or general supervision; ~~and~~

7 34. "Teledentistry" means the remote delivery of dental patient  
8 care via telecommunications and other technology for the exchange of  
9 clinical information and images for dental consultation, preliminary  
10 treatment planning and patient monitoring; and

11 35. "Treatment facility" means:

- 12 a. a federal, tribal, state or local public health  
13 facility,  
14 b. a ~~federal qualified health care facility~~ Federally  
15 Qualified Health Center (FQHC),  
16 c. a private health facility,  
17 d. a group home or residential care facility serving the  
18 elderly, handicapped or juveniles,  
19 e. a hospital or dental ambulatory surgery center (DASC),  
20 f. a nursing home,  
21 g. a penal institution operated by or under contract with  
22 the federal or state government,  
23 h. a public or private school,  
24 i. a patient of record's private residence,

- 1           j.    a mobile dental clinic,
- 2           k.    a dental college, dental program, dental hygiene
- 3                program or dental assisting program accredited by the
- 4                Commission on Dental Accreditation, or
- 5           l.    such other places as are authorized by the Board.

6           SECTION 2.        AMENDATORY        59 O.S. 2011, Section 328.21, as  
7 last amended by Section 3, Chapter 397, O.S.L. 2019 (59 O.S. Supp.  
8 2020, Section 328.21), is amended to read as follows:

9           Section 328.21 A. No person shall practice dentistry or dental  
10 hygiene without first applying for and obtaining a license from the  
11 Board of Dentistry.

12           B. Application shall be made to the Board in writing and shall  
13 be accompanied by the fee established by the rules of the Board,  
14 together with satisfactory proof that the applicant:

- 15           1. Is of good moral character;
- 16           2. Is twenty-one (21) years of age, or over, at the time of
- 17 making application to practice dentistry or eighteen (18) years of
- 18 age, or over, if the applicant is to practice dental hygiene;
- 19           3. Has passed a written theoretical examination and a clinical
- 20 examination approved by the Board; and
- 21           4. Has passed a written jurisprudence examination over the
- 22 rules and laws affecting dentistry in this state.

23           C. An application from a candidate who desires to secure a  
24 license from the Board to practice dentistry or dental hygiene in

1 this state shall be accompanied by satisfactory proof that the  
2 applicant:

3 1. Is a graduate of an accredited dental college, if the  
4 applicant is to practice dentistry;

5 2. Is a graduate of an accredited dental hygiene program, if  
6 the applicant is to practice dental hygiene; and

7 3. Has passed all portions of the National Board Dental  
8 Examination or the National Board Dental Hygiene Examination.

9 D. Pursuant to Section 328.15 of this title, the Board may  
10 affiliate as a member state, and accept regional exams ~~including,~~  
11 ~~but not limited to~~ from the Commission on Dental Competency  
12 Assessments (CDCA), the Western Regional Examination Examining Board  
13 (WREB), or the Central Regional Dental Testing Service (CRDTS) or  
14 ~~another regional exam that includes~~ if the following requirements  
15 are included:

16 a. ~~for~~

17 1. For dental licensing the following components:

18 ~~(1)~~

19 a. a fixed prosthetic component of the preparation of an  
20 anterior all porcelain crown and the preparation of a  
21 three-unit posterior bridge,

1        c.    an endodontic component,

5           E. When the applicant and the accompanying proof are found  
6 satisfactory, the Board shall notify the applicant to appear for the  
7 jurisprudence examination at the time and place to be fixed by the  
8 Board. A dental student or a dental hygiene student in their last  
9 semester of a dental or dental hygiene program, having met all other  
10 requirements, may make application and take the jurisprudence  
11 examination with a letter from the dean of the dental school or  
12 director of the hygiene program stating that the applicant is a  
13 candidate for graduation within the next six (6) months.

14           F. The Board shall require every applicant for a license to  
15 practice dentistry or dental hygiene to submit, for the files of the  
16 Board, a copy of a dental degree or dental hygiene degree, an  
17 official transcript, a recent photograph duly identified and  
18 attested, and any other information as required by the Board.

19           G. Any applicant who fails to pass the jurisprudence  
20 examination may apply for a second examination, in which case the  
21 applicant shall pay a reexamination fee as established by the  
22 statutes or rules of the State Dental Act.

23           ~~H. Any applicant who fails to pass the clinical examination as~~  
24 ~~described in paragraph 4 of subsection C of this section may be~~

1 ~~given credit for such subjects as the Board may allow, but such~~  
2 ~~credits shall be extended only to the succeeding examinations. If~~  
3 ~~the applicant fails to pass a second examination, before further re-~~  
4 ~~examination, the Board may require evidence of additional education,~~  
5 ~~as specified by the Board. After a third examination, the Board may~~  
6 ~~deny the applicant another examination.~~

7       ~~F.~~ A dentist or dental hygienist currently licensed in another  
8 state having met the qualifications in paragraphs 1 through 3 of  
9 subsections B and C of this section may apply for a license by  
10 credentials upon meeting the following:

11       1. A dentist holding a general dentist license in good standing  
12 and having practiced for at least five hundred (500) hours within  
13 the previous five (5) years immediately prior to application and  
14 having passed a regional examination substantially equivalent to the  
15 requirements for this state may apply for licensure by credentials;

16       2. A dental hygienist holding a dental hygiene license in good  
17 standing and having practiced for at least four hundred twenty (420)  
18 hours within the previous five (5) years immediately prior to  
19 application and having passed a regional examination substantially  
20 equivalent to the requirements for Oklahoma may apply for licensure  
21 by credentials. Applicants for credentialing must include:

- 22           a. a letter of good standing from all states in which the  
23           applicant has ever been licensed, and  
24           b. any other requirements as set forth by the rules;

1 3. An applicant applying for a dental or dental hygiene license  
2 by credentials shall only be required to pass the jurisprudence  
3 portion of the examination requirements as set forth in paragraph 4  
4 of subsection C B of this section; or

5 4. A dental hygienist applying for credentialing for advanced  
6 procedures by providing proof of passage of the advanced procedure  
7 in a CDCA, WREB or CRDTS exam.

8 ~~J. I.~~ There shall be two types of advanced procedure available  
9 for dental hygienists upon completion of a Commission on Dental  
10 Accreditation (CODA) approved program or course that has been  
11 approved by the Board:

12 1. Administration of nitrous oxide; and

13 2. Administration of local anesthesia.

14 ~~K. J.~~ All licensees and permit holders shall display their  
15 current permit or license in a visible place within the dental  
16 office or treatment facility.

17 K. The Board shall have the authority to temporarily change  
18 requirements of an examination due to availability or changes in the  
19 examination format, not to exceed one (1) year.

20 L. During a year in which governmental officials have declared  
21 a health pandemic, a state or federal disaster, or other natural or  
22 man-made disaster, the Board shall have the authority through a  
23 resolution to change or make allowances in requirements of all  
24 candidates for licensure and issue temporary licenses for extended



1 periods of time or as needed until the event passes. The resolution  
2 shall have a beginning and an end date and shall automatically  
3 expire no less than thirty (30) days after the end of the disaster  
4 is declared by governmental officials.

5 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 328.23, as  
6 last amended by Section 5, Chapter 397, O.S.L. 2019 (59 O.S. Supp.  
7 2020, Section 328.23), is amended to read as follows:

8 Section 328.23 A. The President of the Board, upon  
9 verification that a person meets the requirements provided for in  
10 this section and any other requirements provided for in the State  
11 Dental Act, may issue an emergency temporary license to practice  
12 dentistry for thirty (30) days. A temporary license may be extended  
13 but shall not exceed ninety (90) days or the next available  
14 regularly scheduled Board meeting.

15 B. The President of the Board, upon verification that a person  
16 meets the requirements provided for in the State Dental Act, may  
17 issue an emergency temporary license to practice dental hygiene,  
18 which shall expire as of the date of the next dental hygiene  
19 clinical examination in Oklahoma, as required by the Board.

20 C. An active duty military spouse residing with the active duty  
21 member having met the requirements for licensure shall be eligible  
22 for a temporary license.

23 D. Any applicant requesting an emergency temporary license  
24 shall submit a letter explaining the exigent circumstances along

1 with all application materials. The determination of whether or not  
2 to grant the emergency temporary license based upon the exigent  
3 circumstances shall be at the sole discretion of the President or  
4 acting President of the Board.

5 E. A holder of a temporary license to practice dentistry or  
6 dental hygiene shall have the same rights and privileges and be  
7 governed by the State Dental Act and the rules of the Board in the  
8 same manner as a holder of a permanent license to practice dentistry  
9 and dental hygiene.

10 F. The President of the Board may authorize patient treatment  
11 and care ~~to~~ by individuals taking the Commission on Dental  
12 Competency Assessments (CDCA) or the Western Regional Examining  
13 Board Exam exam, or other regional exams as approved by the Board,  
14 in order for such individuals to complete criteria related to Board  
15 examinations ~~and~~. The Board may authorize specialty examinations to  
16 be given throughout the year as needed.

17 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 328.23a, as  
18 amended by Section 10, Chapter 229, O.S.L. 2015 (59 O.S. Supp. 2020,  
19 Section 328.23a), is amended to read as follows:

20 Section 328.23a A. There is established a special volunteer  
21 license for dentists and a special volunteer license for dental  
22 hygienists who are retired from active practice or out-of-state  
23 licensees in active practice who are in the Oklahoma Medical Reserve  
24 Corps or assisting with emergency management, emergency operations,

1 or hazard mitigation in response to any emergency, man-made  
2 disaster, or natural disaster, or participating in public health  
3 initiatives, disaster drills, and community service events that are  
4 endorsed by a city, or county, ~~or state~~ health department ~~in the~~  
5 ~~state~~ or the State Department of Health and wish to donate their  
6 expertise for the dental care and treatment of indigent and needy  
7 persons of the state. The special volunteer license shall be:

- 8 1. Issued by the Board of Dentistry to eligible persons;
- 9 2. Issued without the payment of an application fee, license  
10 fee or renewal fee;
- 11 3. Issued or renewed without any continuing education  
12 requirements for a period less than one (1) calendar year; and
- 13 4. Issued for one (1) calendar year or part thereof.

14 B. A dentist or dental hygienist must meet the following  
15 requirements to be eligible for a special volunteer license:

- 16 1. Completion of a special volunteer dental or dental hygiene  
17 license application, including documentation of the dentist's dental  
18 or dental hygiene school graduation and practice history;
- 19 2. Documentation that the dentist or dental hygienist has been  
20 previously issued a full and unrestricted license to practice  
21 dentistry or dental hygiene in ~~Oklahoma~~ this state or in another  
22 state of the United States and that he or she has never been the  
23 subject of any reportable medical or dental disciplinary action in  
24 any jurisdiction. If the dentist or dental hygienist is licensed in

1 more than one state and any license of the licensee is suspended,  
2 revoked, or subject to any agency order limiting or restricting  
3 practice privileges, or has been voluntarily terminated under threat  
4 of sanction, the dentist or dental hygienist shall be ineligible to  
5 receive a special volunteer license;

6 3. Acknowledgement and documentation that the dentist's or  
7 dental hygienist's practice under the special volunteer license will  
8 be exclusively and totally devoted to providing dental care to needy  
9 and indigent persons in ~~Oklahoma~~ this state;

10 4. Acknowledgement and documentation that the dentist or dental  
11 hygienist will not receive or have the expectation to receive any  
12 payment or compensation, either direct or indirect, for any dental  
13 services rendered under the special volunteer license; and

14 5. A listing of all locations and dates that the person will be  
15 completing volunteer work under the special volunteer license.

16 C. The Board of Dentistry shall have jurisdiction over  
17 dentists, dental hygienists, dental assistants, and dental  
18 technicians who volunteer their professional services in the state.  
19 Dental assistants and dental technicians shall work under the direct  
20 supervision of a dentist.

21 D. Dental assistants may be issued a volunteer permit at the  
22 request of an entity that provides dental services to the needy.  
23 Volunteers in a volunteer initiative who are not dentists or dental  
24 hygienists shall be named and provided on a list to the Board by the

1 entity hosting the volunteer initiative with any other requirements  
2 as set forth by the Board. The Board shall provide written  
3 documentation to the host entity designating all persons who may  
4 participate in the volunteer initiative, including authorization of  
5 the timetable requested by the host entity for granting licensure  
6 exemption. Any person working under a volunteer dental assistant  
7 permit shall not receive payment or compensation for any services  
8 rendered under the volunteer dental assistant permit. Volunteer  
9 dental assistant permits shall be limited to specific dates and  
10 locations of services to be provided.

11 E. All persons providing care shall do so under the provisions  
12 specified in Section 328.1 et seq. of this title or rules  
13 promulgated by the Board. Only those functions authorized by law or  
14 administrative rule shall be performed by the named person approved  
15 by the Board.

16 F. Volunteers shall not use sedation or general anesthesia  
17 during volunteer procedures.

18 G. Volunteers shall use a form to be provided by the Board for  
19 any patient with clear instructions for any and all follow-up care.

20 H. At any time, the Board shall revoke a volunteer license  
21 based on documentation of failure to participate according to state  
22 laws or administrative rules.

23 I. A special volunteer license shall be restricted to services  
24 provided at the locations listed on the application or for a

1 specific not-for-profit treatment provider group as approved by the  
2 Board.

3 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 328.25, as  
4 last amended by Section 11, Chapter 363, O.S.L. 2019 (59 O.S. Supp.  
5 2020, Section 328.25), is amended to read as follows:

6 Section 328.25 A. No person shall practice as an oral  
7 maxillofacial surgery assistant without having obtained a permit as  
8 an oral maxillofacial surgery assistant from the Board of Dentistry.

9 B. Any person seeking to obtain an oral maxillofacial surgery  
10 assistant permit must have a supervising oral maxillofacial surgeon

2 surgery assistant shall not be extended beyond two (2) years.

3 F. All oral maxillofacial surgery assistants are required to be  
4 under direct supervision or direct visual supervision at all times  
5 by a licensed oral maxillofacial surgeon.

6 G. If an oral maxillofacial surgery assistant is not currently  
7 employed by an oral maxillofacial surgeon, the oral maxillofacial  
8 surgery assistant permit shall automatically revert to a dental  
9 assistant permit as set forth in Section 328.24 of this title and  
10 may be eligible for an expanded function assisting a dentist who  
11 holds a parenteral or pediatric anesthesia permit; provided, only  
12 the dentist may administer anesthesia and assess the patient's level  
13 of sedation. The oral maxillofacial surgery assistant permit may be  
14 reinstated upon employment under a licensed oral maxillofacial  
15 surgeon.

16 H. Any oral maxillofacial surgeon shall notify the Board within  
17 thirty (30) days of an oral maxillofacial surgery assistant no  
18 longer under his or her supervision.

19 I. An applicant for an oral maxillofacial surgery assistant  
20 permit shall provide satisfactory proof of:

21 1. Successful completion of the Dental Anesthesia Assistant  
22 National Certification Examination (DAANCE) provided by the American  
23 Association of Oral Maxillofacial Surgeons (AAOMS) or another  
24 program or examination as approved by the Board;

1           2. A valid BLS certification;

2           3. Employment and completion of a minimum of six (6) months of  
3 training under the direct supervision of a licensed oral  
4 maxillofacial surgeon prior to starting DAANCE or another program or  
5 examination as approved by the Board;

6           4. A Completion of a standardized course approved by the Board  
7 including a minimum of four (4) hours of didactic training that must  
8 include anatomy, intravenous access or phlebotomy, technique, risks  
9 and complications, and hands-on experience starting and maintaining  
10 intravenous lines on a human or simulator/manikin, and pharmacology;

11          5. Completion of an infection-control course as approved by the  
12 Board.

13          J. An oral maxillofacial surgery assistant who has completed  
14 all the requirements shall receive a permit to practice as an oral  
15 maxillofacial surgery assistant within a dental office, surgery  
16 center, dental ambulatory surgery center or hospital.

17          K. Oral maxillofacial surgery assistants shall be required to  
18 complete ~~twelve (12)~~ eight (8) hours of continuing education every  
19 ~~three (3)~~ two (2) years in classes approved by AAOMS that are  
20 certified by the American Dental Association CERP program or another  
21 program approved by the Board. The continuing education requirement  
22 shall include at least one (1) hour on infection control.

1 electronic back-up system and that backup is updated on a regular

1 C. An application from a candidate who desires to secure a

21 1. Issued by the Board of Dentistry to eligible persons;

22 2. Issued without the payment of an application fee, license  
23 fee or renewal fee;

1           3. Issued or renewed without any continuing education  
2 requirements for a period less than one (1) calendar year; and

3           4. Issued for one (1) calendar year or part thereof.

4           B. A dentist or dental hygienist must meet the following  
5 requirements to be eligible for a special volunteer license:

6           1. Completion of a special volunteer dental or dental hygiene  
7 license application, including documentation of the dentist's dental  
8 or dental hygiene school graduation and practice history;

9           2. Documentation that the dentist or dental hygienist has been  
10 previously issued a full and unrestricted license to practice  
11 dentistry or dental hygiene in ~~Oklahoma~~ this state or in another  
12 state of the United States and that he or she has never been the  
13 subject of any reportable medical or dental disciplinary action in  
14 any jurisdiction. If the dentist or dental hygienist is licensed in  
15 more than one state and any license of the licensee is suspended,  
16 revoked, or subject to any agency order limiting or restricting  
17 practice privileges, or has been voluntarily terminated under threat  
18 of sanction, the dentist or dental hygienist shall be ineligible to  
19 receive a special volunteer license;

20           3. Acknowledgement and documentation that the dentist's or  
21 dental hygienist's practice under the special volunteer license will  
22 be exclusively and totally devoted to providing dental care to needy  
23 and indigent persons in ~~Oklahoma~~ this state;

24

1 4. Acknowledgement and documentation that the dentist or dental  
2 hygienist will not receive or have the expectation to receive any  
3 payment or compensation, either direct or indirect, for any dental  
4 services rendered under the special volunteer license; and

5 5. A listing of all locations and dates that the person will be  
6 completing volunteer work under the special volunteer license.

7 C. The Board of Dentistry shall have jurisdiction over  
8 dentists, dental hygienists, dental assistants, and dental  
9 technicians who volunteer their professional services in the state.  
10 Dental assistants and dental technicians shall work under the direct  
11 supervision of a dentist.

12 D. Dental assistants may be issued a volunteer permit at the  
13 request of an entity that provides dental services to the needy.  
14 Volunteers in a volunteer initiative who are not dentists or dental  
15 hygienists shall be named and provided on a list to the Board by the  
16 entity hosting the volunteer initiative with any other requirements  
17 as set forth by the Board. The Board shall provide written  
18 documentation to the host entity designating all persons who may  
19 participate in the volunteer initiative, including authorization of  
20 the timetable requested by the host entity for granting licensure  
21 exemption. Any person working under a volunteer dental assistant  
22 permit shall not receive payment or compensation for any services  
23 rendered under the volunteer dental assistant permit. Volunteer

1 dental assistant permits shall be limited to specific dates and  
2 locations of services to be provided.

3 E. All persons providing care shall do so under the provisions  
4 specified in Section 328.1 et seq. of this title or rules  
5 promulgated by the Board. Only those functions authorized by law or  
6 administrative rule shall be performed by the named person approved  
7 by the Board.

8 F. Volunteers shall not use sedation or general anesthesia  
9 during volunteer procedures.

10 G. Volunteers shall use a form to be provided by the Board for  
11 any patient with clear instructions for any and all follow-up care.

12 H. At any time, the Board shall revoke a volunteer license  
13 based on documentation of failure to participate according to state  
14 laws or administrative rules.

15 I. A special volunteer license shall be restricted to services  
16 provided at the locations listed on the application or for a  
17 specific not-for-profit treatment provider group as approved by the  
18 Board.

19 SECTION 20. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 328.25, as  
20 last amended by Section 11, Chapter 363, O.S.L. 2019 (59 O.S. Supp.  
21 2020, Section 328.25), is amended to read as follows:

22 Section 328.25. A. No person shall practice as an oral  
23 maxillofacial surgery assistant without having obtained a permit as  
24 an oral maxillofacial surgery assistant from the Board of Dentistry.

1 B. Any person seeking to obtain an oral maxillofacial surgery  
2 assistant permit must have a supervising oral maxillofacial surgeon  
3 with a current Oklahoma license and complete the requirements set  
4 forth by the Board.

5 C. The application shall be made to the Board in writing and  
6 shall be accompanied by the fee established by the Board, together  
7 with the satisfactory proof that the applicant:

8 1. Passes a background check with criteria established by the  
9 Board; and

10 2. Has completed all of the training requirements for the oral  
11 maxillofacial surgery assistant permit as established by the Board.

12 D. An oral maxillofacial surgery assistant permit shall be  
13 considered a temporary training permit until all of the training  
14 requirements, as established by the Board for each oral  
15 maxillofacial surgery assistant, have been completed and approved by  
16 the Board.

17 E. A temporary training permit for each oral maxillofacial  
18 surgery assistant shall not be extended beyond two (2) years.

19 F. All oral maxillofacial surgery assistants are required to be  
20 under direct supervision or direct visual supervision at all times  
21 by a licensed oral maxillofacial surgeon.

22 G. If an oral maxillofacial surgery assistant is not currently  
23 employed by an oral maxillofacial surgeon, the oral maxillofacial  
24 surgery assistant permit shall automatically revert to a dental



1 assistant permit as set forth in Section 328.24 of this title and  
2 may be eligible for an expanded function assisting a dentist who  
3 holds a parenteral or pediatric anesthesia permit; provided, only  
4 the dentist may administer anesthesia and assess the patient's level  
5 of sedation. The oral maxillofacial surgery assistant permit may be  
6 reinstated upon employment under a licensed oral maxillofacial  
7 surgeon.

8 H. Any oral maxillofacial surgeon shall notify the Board within  
9 thirty (30) days of an oral maxillofacial surgery assistant no  
10 longer under his or her supervision.

11 I. An applicant for an oral maxillofacial surgery assistant  
12 permit shall provide satisfactory proof of:

13 1. Successful completion of the Dental Anesthesia Assistant  
14 National Certification Examination (DAANCE) provided by the American  
15 Association of Oral Maxillofacial Surgeons (AAOMS) or another  
16 program or examination as approved by the Board;

17 2. A valid BLS certification;

18 3. Employment and completion of a minimum of six (6) months of  
19 training under the direct supervision of a licensed oral  
20 maxillofacial surgeon prior to starting DAANCE or another program or  
21 examination as approved by the Board;

22 4. A standardized course approved by the Board including a  
23 minimum of four (4) hours of didactic training that must include  
24 anatomy, intravenous access or phlebotomy, technique, risks and

1 complications, and hands-on experience starting and maintaining  
2 intravenous lines on a human or simulator/manikin, and pharmacology;

3 5. Completion of an infection-control course as approved by the  
4 Board.

5 J. An oral maxillofacial surgery assistant who has completed  
6 all the requirements shall receive a permit to practice as an oral  
7 maxillofacial surgery assistant within a dental office, surgery  
8 center, dental ambulatory surgery center or hospital.

9 K. Oral maxillofacial surgery assistants shall be required to  
10 complete ~~twelve (12)~~ eight (8) hours of continuing education every  
11 ~~three (3)~~ two (2) years in classes approved by AAOMS that are  
12 certified by the American Dental Association CERP program or another  
13 program approved by the Board. The continuing education requirement  
14 shall include at least one (1) hour on infection control.

15 L. The anesthesia committee provided pursuant to Section 328.17  
16 of this title may make a recommendation to the Board for an oral  
17 maxillofacial surgery assistant holding a temporary training permit  
18 to substitute training received from another state university,  
19 dental school or technical training institute or training acquired  
20 in a surgery center or hospital while working under the authority of  
21 a licensed physician, to qualify as a partial substitute for the

7 b. draw up and prepare medications;

13 section, "administer" means to have the sole  
14 responsibility for anesthesia care, including

16 2015 (59 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 328.31b), is amended to read as

18 Section 328.31b. A. Every dental office or treatment facility,  
19 whether individual, group or multi-doctor practice operating under a  
20 name, trade name or other professional entity shall maintain written  
21 records on each patient treated at the facility and shall make these  
22 records available to the Board and other regulatory entities or be  
23 subject to the penalties as set forth in Section 328.44 of this  
24 title.

1 B. Each licensed dentist shall maintain written records on each  
2 patient that shall contain, at a minimum, the following information  
3 about the patient:

4 1. A health history listing known illnesses, other treating  
5 physicians, and current medications prescribed;

6 2. Results of clinical examination and tests conducted,  
7 including the identification, or lack thereof, of any oral pathology  
8 or diseases;

9 3. Treatment plan proposed by the dentist;

10 4. Treatment rendered to the patient. The patient record shall  
11 clearly identify the dentist and the dental hygienist providing the

15 5. Whenever patient records are released or transferred, the

18 in the retained records indicating to whom the records were released

20 6. All claims being submitted for insurance must be signed,  
21 stamped or have an electronic signature by the treating dentist.

22 C. Patient records may be kept in an electronic data format,  
23 provided that the dentist maintains a backup copy of information  
24 stored in the data processing system using disk, tape or other

1 electronic back-up system and that backup is updated on a regular  
2 basis, at least weekly, to assure that data is not lost due to  
3 system failure. Any electronic data system shall be capable of  
4 producing a hard copy on demand.

5 D. All patient records shall be maintained for seven (7) years  
6 from the date of treatment.

7 E. Each licensed dentist shall retain a copy of each entry in  
8 his or her patient appointment book or such other log, calendar,  
9 book, file or computer data used in lieu of an appointment book for  
10 a period of no less than seven (7) years from the date of each entry

22 20. Being involuntarily committed to an institution for  
23 treatment for substance abuse, until recovery or remission;

1       21. Using or attempting to use the services of a dental  
2 laboratory or dental laboratory technician without issuing a  
3 laboratory prescription, except as provided in subsection C of  
4 Section 328.36 of this title;

5       22. Aiding, abetting, or encouraging a dental hygienist  
6 employed by the dentist to make use of an oral prophylaxis list, or  
7 the calling by telephone or by use of letters transmitted through  
8 the mails to solicit patronage from patients formerly served in the  
9 office of any dentist formerly employing such hygienist;

10       23. Having more than the equivalent of three full-time dental  
11 hygienists for each dentist actively practicing in the same dental

6       E. A dental hygienist may advertise that he or she is  
7 practicing in the office of the supervising dentist in which he or  
8 she is employed.

9       SECTION 24.        AMENDATORY        59 O.S. 2011, Section 328.36a, is  
10 amended to read as follows:

11       Section 328.36a. A. A dentist may utilize a dental laboratory  
12 technician and a dental laboratory to perform or provide dental  
13 laboratory technology. Except as provided in subsection C of  
14 Section 328.36 of this title, a dentist who utilizes the services of  
15 a dental laboratory technician or dental laboratory shall furnish a  
16 laboratory prescription for each patient for whom a work product is  
17 prescribed.

18       B. Laboratory prescriptions issued by a dentist shall be on  
19 forms containing the minimum information required by subsection D of  
20 this section and shall be produced or printed by each dentist. Such  
21 forms shall be provided by the Board of Dentistry or downloaded from  
22 the Board's website. All forms shall be completed in full and  
23 signed by the prescribing dentist. The owner of a dental laboratory  
24 shall retain each original laboratory prescription received from a

1 prescribing dentist and produce the document for inspection and  
2 copying by a member of the Board or by an agent or employee of the  
3 Board, for a period of ~~three (3)~~ seven (7) years from the date of  
4 the laboratory prescription. The prescribing dentist shall retain  
5 the duplicate copy of each laboratory prescription and produce the  
6 document for inspection and copying by a member of the Board or by  
7 an agent or employee of the Board, for a period of ~~three (3)~~ seven  
8 (7) years from the date of the laboratory prescription.

9 C. The patient's name or the identification number of the  
10 laboratory prescription shall appear on all dental models and  
11 correspond to all dental restorations, appliances or other devices  
12 being constructed, reproduced or repaired. Any dental model,  
13 restoration, appliance or other device in the possession of a dental  
14 laboratory technician or dental laboratory without a laboratory  
15 prescription and corresponding number on the model, restoration,  
16 appliance or device shall be prima facie evidence of a violation of  
17 the State Dental Act. After completion, the prescribed work product  
18 shall be returned by the dental laboratory technician or dental  
19 laboratory to the prescribing dentist or the dental office of the  
20 dentist with the name or number of the laboratory prescription  
21 accompanying the invoice.

22 D. At a minimum, prescriptions shall contain the following  
23 information:

24 1. The name and address of the dental laboratory;

1           2. The patient's name and/or identifying number. In the event  
2 such identifying number is used, the name of the patient shall be  
3 written on a copy of the prescription retained by the dentist;

4           3. A description of the work to be completed with diagrams, if  
5 applicable;

6           4. A description of the type of materials to be used;

7           5. The actual date on which the authorization or prescription  
8 was written or completed;

9           6. The signature in ink or by electronic method of the dentist  
10 issuing the prescription and the state license number and address of  
11 such dentist; and

12           7. A section to be completed by the dental laboratory and  
13 returned to the issuing dentist that shall disclose all information  
14 and certify that the information is accurate by including the  
15 signature of a reasonable part of the primary contractor.

16           E. The Board shall make readily available a sample form on the  
17 Board's website for use by any licensee at no cost.

18           F. A dentist may produce, transfer and retain copies of the  
19 form electronically.

20           G. A dentist may refer a patient to a dental laboratory for the  
21 purpose of selecting the shading or matching shades of a prosthetic  
22 device being prepared for the dentist to deliver to the patient.  
23 The dentist must maintain a copy of the prescription written for the  
24 lab.

1 SECTION 25. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 328.41, as  
2 last amended by Section 9, Chapter 397, O.S.L. 2019 (59 O.S. Supp.  
3 2020, Section 328.41), is amended to read as follows:

4 Section 328.41. A. 1. On or before the last day of December  
5 of each year, every dentist, dental hygienist, dental assistant,  
6 oral maxillofacial surgery assistant and other licensee or permit  
7 holders previously licensed or permitted by the Board to practice in  
8 this state, with the exception of those listed in paragraph 2 of  
9 this subsection, shall submit a completed renewal application with  
10 information as may be required by the Board, together with an annual  
11 renewal fee established by the rules of the Board. Upon receipt of  
12 the annual renewal fee, the Board shall issue a renewal certificate  
13 authorizing the dentist, dental hygienist, dental assistant, or oral  
14 maxillofacial surgery assistant to continue the practice of  
15 dentistry or dental hygiene, respectively, in this state for a  
16 period of one (1) year. Every license or permit issued by the Board  
17 shall begin on January 1 and expire on December 31 of each year.

18 2. Beginning July 1, 2017, resident and fellowship permits  
19 shall be valid from July 1 through June 30 of each year and dental  
20 student intern permits shall be valid from August 1 through July 31

19          C. Upon failure of a dentist, dental hygienist, dental  
20 assistant, ~~or~~ oral maxillofacial surgery assistant to pay the annual  
21 renewal fee within two (2) months after January 1, the Board shall  
22 notify the dentist, dental hygienist, dental assistant, ~~or~~ oral  
23 maxillofacial surgery assistant in writing by certified mail to the  
24 last-known mailing address of the dentist, dental hygienist, dental

1 assistant, or oral maxillofacial surgery assistant as reflected in  
2 the records of the Board.

3 D. Any dentist, dental hygienist, dental assistant, or oral  
4 maxillofacial surgery assistant whose license or permit is  
5 automatically canceled by reason of failure, neglect or refusal to  
6 secure the renewal certificate may be reinstated by the Board at any  
7 time within one (1) year from the date of the expiration of the  
8 license, upon payment of the annual renewal fee and a penalty fee  
9 established by the rules of the Board. If the dentist, dental  
10 hygienist, dental assistant, or oral maxillofacial surgery assistant  
11 does not apply for renewal of the license or permit and pay the  
12 required fees within one (1) year after the license has expired,  
13 then the dentist, dental hygienist, dental assistant, or oral  
14 maxillofacial surgery assistant shall be required to file an  
15 application for and take the examination or other requirements  
16 provided for in the State Dental Act or the rules promulgated by the

18 E. The Board, by rule, shall provide for the remittance of fees  
19 otherwise required by the State Dental Act while a dentist or dental  
20 hygienist is on active duty with any of the Armed Forces of the  
21 United States.

22 F. In case of a lost or destroyed license or renewal  
23 certificate and upon satisfactory proof of the loss or destruction

1 thereof, the Board may issue a duplicate, charging therefor a fee  
2 established by the rules of the Board.

3 G. A dentist, dental hygienist, oral maxillofacial surgery  
4 assistant or dental assistant that is in good standing and not under  
5 investigation that notifies the Board in writing of a voluntary  
6 nonrenewal of license or requests retirement status shall have a  
7 right to renew or reinstate his or her license within five (5) years  
8 from the date of notice. The Board may require any training or  
9 continuing education requirements to be met prior to reinstatement.

10 H. A dentist, dental hygienist, oral maxillofacial dental  
11 assistant or dental assistant that has not had an active license or  
12 permit in excess of five (5) years shall be required to apply as a  
13 new applicant.

14 I. Any application for a license or permit that has remained  
15 inactive for more than one (1) year shall be closed.

16 SECTION 26. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 328.48, is  
17 amended to read as follows:

18 Section 328.48. It shall be the duty of the Board of Dentistry,  
19 annually, to have prepared a statement showing the total amount of  
20 receipts and expenditures of the Board for the preceding twelve (12)  
21 months. The statement shall be properly certified under oath by the  
22 president and ~~secretary-treasurer~~ Executive Director of the Board to  
23 the Governor ~~of this state~~ and may be sent electronically.
