## 1 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES - FLOOR VERSION STATE OF OKLAHOMA 2 1st Session of the 59th Legislature (2023) 3 ENGROSSED SENATE 4 BILL NO. 410 By: Daniels of the Senate 5 and 6 Lepak of the House 7 8 9 An Act relating to elections; amending 26 O.S. 2021, Sections 7-108, 7-108.3, and 16-111, which relate to electioneering; modifying prohibited activities at 10 polling place or voting site; defining terms; modifying elements of certain misdemeanor offense; 11 and declaring an emergency. 12 13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 14 SECTION 1. 26 O.S. 2021, Section 7-108, is 15 AMENDATORY amended to read as follows: 16 Section 7-108. A. No person shall be allowed to electioneer 17 within three hundred (300) feet of any ballot box the entrance to a 18 polling place or in-person absentee voting site or a person who is 19 20 standing in line to vote outside the polling place or in-person absentee voting site while an election is in progress, nor shall 21 any. No person or persons, except election officials, voters 22 registered and voting at the polling place or in-person absentee 23 voting site, a minor child or dependent accompanying such voters and 24

the election enclosure or within fifty (50) feet of any ballot box
the entrance to a polling place or in-person absentee voting site
while an election is in progress. No printed material other than
that provided by the election board shall be publicly placed or
exposed within three hundred (300) feet of any ballot box, the
entrance to a polling place or in-person absentee voting site while
an election is in progress.

## B. For purposes of this title:

## 1. "Electioneering" means:

- a. advocating directly for or against a candidate or

  question that is or will be on the ballot at any
  election, either verbally or with visual materials,
  signs or clothing, audio recordings, electronic
  communication, or any other type of communication, or
- b. collecting signatures for a petition to place an issue or question on a future ballot or soliciting contact information or distributing information for any candidate or issue that might be on a future ballot; and
- 2. "Election enclosure" means the areas of a polling place
  where voters sign the precinct registry and are issued ballots,
  where voting booths are located, where a voting device or ballot box

1 is located, and any room, hallway or other space wherein such 2 activities take place. SECTION 2. 26 O.S. 2021, Section 7-108.3, is 3 AMENDATORY amended to read as follows: 4 5 Section 7-108.3. The prohibition against electioneering contained in Section 7--108 7-108 of this title shall apply to any 6 pollster. No pollster shall be permitted inside the election 7 enclosure or within fifty (50) feet of any ballot box the entrance 9 to a polling place or in-person absentee voting site while an 10 election is in progress. A pollster who violates the law prescribed for pollsters shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor. 11 12 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2021, Section 16-111, is 13 amended to read as follows: Section 16-111. Any person who electioneers within three 14 15 hundred (300) feet of any ballot box the entrance to a polling place or in-person absentee voting site or a person who is standing in 16 line to vote outside the polling place or in-person absentee voting 17 site while an election is in progress, and any person except 18 election officials, voters registered and voting at the polling 19 place or in-person absentee voting site, a minor child or dependent 20 accompanying such voters and other persons authorized by law who 21 remains within fifty (50) feet of any ballot box the entrance to a 22 polling place or in-person absentee voting site while an election is 23

in progress shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

1	SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
2	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
3	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
4	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
