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1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

2 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1-109, as 3 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 6, O.S.L. 2016 (70 O.S. Supp. 4 2018, Section 1-109), is amended to read as follows: 5 Section 1-109. A. For all public schools in Oklahoma, school 6 shall actually be in session and classroom instruction offered: 7 1. For not less than one hundred eighty (180) days; or 2. For Through the 2019-2020 school year, for not less than one 8 9 thousand eighty (1,080) hours each school year, if a district board 10 of education adopts a school-hours policy and notifies the State Board of Education prior to October 15 of the applicable school 11 12 year; 13 Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, for not less than 3. 14 one thousand eighty (1,080) hours with a minimum of one hundred 15 sixty-five (165) days of instruction each school year, if a district 16 board of education adopts a school-hours policy and notifies the 17 State Board of Education prior to October 15 of the applicable 18 school year; or 19 4. Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, for not less than 20 one thousand eighty (1,080) hours each school year, if a district 21 board of education adopts a school-hours policy, notifies the State 22 Board of Education prior to October 15 of the applicable school year 23 and meets the requirements established by the State Board of 24 Education pursuant to subsection H of this section.

B. A school district may not count more than thirty (30) hours
each school year that are used for attendance of professional
meetings toward the one hundred eighty (180) days or one thousand
eighty (1,080) hours of classroom instruction time required in
subsection A of this section.

6 Teachers off contract with an employing district shall not С. 7 be required by the employing school district to attend professional meetings unless the teacher is paid additional compensation for the 8 9 additional time. Teachers may be paid additional compensation for 10 attending professional meetings in excess of their contract term. 11 Subject to district board of education policy or collective 12 bargaining agreement, additional paid professional days may be 13 granted for individual teachers to attend or participate in 14 professional meetings, staff development training, or National Board 15 certification portfolio development as provided for in Section 6-16 204.2 of this title.

D. A school district may authorize parent-teacher conferences to be held during a regular school day. If authorized by the school district, parent-teacher conferences shall be counted as classroom instruction time for no more than six (6) hours per semester, for a total of twelve (12) hours per school year.

E. A school district may maintain school for less than a full school year only when conditions beyond the control of school authorities make the maintenance of the term impossible and the State Board of Education has been apprised and has expressed
 concurrence in writing.

F. The State Board of Education shall establish criteria for an
extended-day schedule for schools subject to paragraph 1 of
subsection A of this section. The criteria shall:

6 1. Prescribe a lengthened school day within limits determined7 not to be detrimental to quality instruction;

8 2. Ensure that the schedule is equivalent in annual hours of
9 instruction to the one-hundred-eighty-day school year specified in
10 paragraph 1 of subsection A of this section; and

3. Be consistent with the provisions of this section and Sections 1-111 and 1-112 of this title, but may result in fewer annual days of instruction.

14 G. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection F of this 15 section, a school district board of education subject to paragraph 1 16 of subsection A of this section may adopt and implement an extended-17 day schedule subject to the following requirements:

The annual number of hours of instruction shall equal or
 exceed one thousand eighty (1,080) hours, which is the equivalent of
 one hundred eighty (180) days of instruction as specified in
 subsection A of this section for six (6) hours each day as specified
 in Section 1-111 of this title;

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2. The annual number of days of instruction shall equal or
 exceed one hundred eighty (180) days as specified in subsection A of
 this section;

3. The schedule adopted shall be consistent with the provisions
of Sections 1-111 and 1-112 of this title, except that for not more
than one (1) day per week, a school day shall consist of not less
than five (5) hours devoted to academic instruction in a regular
classroom setting;

9 4. The district shall hold a public hearing prior to the
10 adoption of an extended-day schedule authorized pursuant to this
11 subsection; and

12 5. The district shall document the impact on student 13 achievement as determined by the academic performance data score and 14 any other relevant factors that are a result of implementation of an 15 extended-day schedule authorized pursuant to this subsection and 16 provide an annual report to the State Board of Education of the 17 results. If improvement in student achievement cannot be documented 18 in the report, the district board of education shall revoke 19 authorization as provided by this subsection. If the district does 20 not revoke authorization after student achievement is not documented 21 in the report, the State Board of Education may deny accreditation 22 of any school in violation of this subsection.

H. <u>Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, a school district</u>
 board of education may adopt a school-hours policy as provided for

by paragraph 4 of subsection A of this section only if it meets or
exceeds the minimum guidelines for student performance and school
district cost savings established by the State Board of Education.
The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules subject to
approval by the Legislature establishing the minimum guidelines for
student performance and school district cost savings.

7 <u>I.</u> If subject to paragraph 2 of subsection A of this section, a 8 district board of education or designee may elect to close a school 9 during the school day for inclement weather purposes. In such an 10 event, the number of hours incurred in classroom instruction time 11 prior to school closure shall be counted toward the one thousand 12 eighty (1,080) hours per year requirement.

13 I. J. Nothing in this section shall be construed as affecting 14 the right of an employing school district to require teachers as 15 defined in Section 6-101.3 of this title to work in excess of the 16 one thousand eighty (1,080) hours required for student instruction. 17 In addition, nothing in this section shall be construed to affect 18 the Fair Labor Standards Act status of any school district employee.

<u>K. The provisions of this section shall not prohibit the</u>
<u>Oklahoma School for the Blind or the Oklahoma School for the Deaf</u>
<u>from adopting an alternative school-hours policy if the Oklahoma</u>
<u>School for the Blind or the Oklahoma School for the Deaf notifies</u>
<u>and receives approval from the State Board of Education prior to</u>
October 15 of the applicable school year.

1 B. 1. When determining the Minimum Salary Schedule, "fringe 2 benefits" shall mean all or part of retirement benefits, excluding the contributions made pursuant to subsection A of Section 17-108.1 3 4 of this title and the flexible benefit allowance pursuant to Section 5 26-105 of this title from the flexible benefit allowance funds disbursed by the State Board of Education and the State Board of 6 7 Career and Technology Education pursuant to Section 26-104 of this 8 title.

9 2. If a school district intends to provide retirement benefits 10 to a teacher such that the teacher's salary would be less than the amounts set forth in the minimum salary schedule Minimum Salary 11 12 Schedule specified in subsection A of this section, the district 13 shall be required to provide written notification to the teacher 14 prior to his or her employment or, if already employed by the 15 district, no later than thirty (30) days prior to the date the 16 district elects to provide retirement benefits such that the 17 teacher's salary would be less than the minimum salary schedule 18 Minimum Salary Schedule.

C. Any of the degrees referred to in this section shall be from a college recognized by the State Board of Education. The Board shall accept teaching experience from out-of-state school districts that are accredited by the state board of education or appropriate state accrediting agency for the districts. The Board shall accept teaching experience from out-of-country schools that are accredited

1 or otherwise endorsed by the appropriate national or regional 2 accrediting or endorsement authority. Out-of-country certification 3 documentation in a language other than English shall be analyzed by an educational credential evaluation service in accordance with 4 5 industry standards and quidelines and approved by the State Department of Education. The person seeking to have credit granted 6 7 for out-of-country teaching experience shall be responsible for all costs of the analysis by a credential evaluation service. 8 The Board 9 shall accept teaching experience from primary and secondary schools 10 that are operated by the United States Department of Defense or are 11 affiliated with the United States Department of State.

D. For the purpose of state salary increments and retirement, no teacher shall be granted credit for more than five (5) years of active duty in the military service or out-of-state or out-ofcountry teaching experience as a certified teacher or its equivalent. Nothing in this section shall prohibit boards of education from crediting more years of experience on district salary schedules than those allowed for state purposes.

E. The State Board of Education shall recognize, for purposes
of certification and salary increments, all the years of experience
of a:

22 1. Certified teacher who teaches in the educational program of
23 the Department of Corrections, beginning with fiscal year 1981;

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2. Vocational rehabilitation counselor under the Department of
 Human Services if the counselor was employed as a certified teacher
 by the State Department of Education when the Division of Vocational
 Rehabilitation was transferred from the State Board of Career and
 Technology Education or the State Board of Education to the Oklahoma
 Public Welfare Commission on July 1, 1968;

7 3. Vocational rehabilitation counselor which were completed
8 while employed by the Department of Human Services if such counselor
9 was certified as a teacher or was eligible for certification as a
10 teacher in Oklahoma;

4. Certified teacher which were completed while employed by the
 Department of Human Services Child Study Center at University
 Hospital, if the teacher was certified as a teacher in Oklahoma; and

14 5. Certified school psychologist or psychometrist which were 15 completed while employed as a doctoral intern, psychological 16 assistant, or psychologist with any agency of the State of Oklahoma 17 if the experience primarily involved work with persons of school- or 18 preschool-age and if the person was, at the time the experience was 19 acquired, certified as, or eligible for certification as, a school 20 psychologist or psychometrist.

F. The provisions of this section shall not apply to teachers who have entered into postretirement employment with a public school in Oklahoma and are still receiving a monthly retirement benefit.

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1 G. If a person employed as certified personnel, as defined in 2 Section 26-103 of this title, by a school district during the 2017-3 2018 school year was receiving a salary above the step level 4 indicated by the State Minimum Salary Schedule for the 2017-2018 5 school year, the person shall receive a salary increase amount equal to the amount indicated in subsection A of this section for the step 6 7 level indicated for the person, provided they remain employed by the same district, unless the hours or the duties of the certified 8 9 personnel are reduced proportionately.

10SECTION 3.AMENDATORY70 O.S. 2011, Section 4516, is11amended to read as follows:

Section 4516. The board of education of any school district operating pursuant to the provisions of this act Section 4511 et <u>seq. of this title</u> shall establish a school calendar whereby the teaching sessions and vacation periods during the school year are on a rotating basis.

Each selected school shall be closed for all students andemployees on regular school holidays.

The schools and classes shall be conducted for a total of no less than one hundred eighty (180) days or no less than one thousand eighty (1,080) hours during the academic year <u>as provided for in</u> <u>Section 1-109 of this title</u>.

The provisions of all other laws relating to compulsory fulltime education and the enrollment and attendance of pupils in the

2	with respect to the regular school days prescribed for the entire
3	academic year established for the school at which a program pursuant
4	to this act <u>Section 4511 et seq. of this title</u> is conducted, and to
