eighty (1,080) hours of classroom instruction time required in
subsection A of this section.

C. Teachers off contract with an employing district shall notbe required by the employing school district to attend professional

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1 meetings unless the teacher is paid additional compensation for the additional time. Teachers may be paid additional compensation for 2 3 attending professional meetings in excess of their contract term. Subject to district board of education policy or collective 4 5 bargaining agreement, additional paid professional days may be granted for individual teachers to attend or participate in 6 professional meetings, staff development training, or National Board 7 certification portfolio development as provided for in Section 6-8 9 204.2 of this title.

D. A school district may authorize parent-teacher conferences to be held during a regular school day. If authorized by the school district, parent-teacher conferences shall be counted as classroom instruction time for no more than six (6) hours per semester, for a total of twelve (12) hours per school year.

E. A school district may maintain school for less than a full school year only when conditions beyond the control of school authorities make the maintenance of the term impossible and the State Board of Education has been apprised and has expressed concurrence in writing.

F. The State Board of Education shall establish criteria for an extended-day schedule for schools subject to paragraph 1 of subsection A of this section. The criteria shall:

Prescribe a lengthened school day within limits determined
 not to be detrimental to quality instruction;

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2. Ensure that the schedule is equivalent in annual hours of
 instruction to the one-hundred-eighty-day school year specified in
 paragraph 1 of subsection A of this section; and

3. Be consistent with the provisions of this section and
5 Sections 1-111 and 1-112 of this title, but may result in fewer
6 annual days of instruction.

G. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection F of this
section, a school district board of education subject to paragraph 1
of subsection A of this section may adopt and implement an extendedday schedule subject to the following requirements:

The annual number of hours of instruction shall equal or
 exceed one thousand eighty (1,080) hours, which is the equivalent of
 one hundred eighty (180) days of instruction as specified in
 subsection A of this section for six (6) hours each day as specified
 in Section 1-111 of this title;

16 2. The annual number of days of instruction shall equal or 17 exceed one hundred eighty (180) days as specified in subsection A of 18 this section;

19 3. The schedule adopted shall be consistent with the provisions 20 of Sections 1-111 and 1-112 of this title, except that for not more 21 than one (1) day per week, a school day shall consist of not less 22 than five (5) hours devoted to academic instruction in a regular 23 classroom setting;

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4. The district shall hold a public hearing prior to the
 adoption of an extended-day schedule authorized pursuant to this
 subsection; and

The district shall document the impact on student 5. 4 5 achievement as determined by the academic performance data score and any other relevant factors that are a result of implementation of an 6 7 extended-day schedule authorized pursuant to this subsection and provide an annual report to the State Board of Education of the 8 9 results. If improvement in student achievement cannot be documented 10 in the report, the district board of education shall revoke 11 authorization as provided by this subsection. If the district does not revoke authorization after student achievement is not documented 12 in the report, the State Board of Education may deny accreditation 13 of any school in violation of this subsection. 14

15 Beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, a school district Η. 16 board of education may adopt a school-hours policy as provided for by paragraph 4 of subsection A of this section only if it meets or 17 exceeds the minimum guidelines for student performance and school 18 district cost savings established by the State Board of Education. 19 The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules establishing the 20 minimum guidelines for student performance and school district cost 21 22 savings.

<u>I.</u> If subject to paragraph 2 of subsection A of this section, a
 district board of education or designee may elect to close a school

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1 during the school day for inclement weather purposes. In such an 2 event, the number of hours incurred in classroom instruction time 3 prior to school closure shall be counted toward the one thousand 4 eighty (1,080) hours per year requirement.

5 I. J. Nothing in this section shall be construed as affecting 6 the right of an employing school district to require teachers as 7 defined in Section 6-101.3 of this title to work in excess of the 8 one thousand eighty (1,080) hours required for student instruction. 9 In addition, nothing in this section shall be construed to affect 10 the Fair Labor Standards Act status of any school district employee.

11 <u>K. The provisions of this section shall not prohibit the</u> 12 <u>Oklahoma School for the Blind or the Oklahoma School for the Deaf</u> 13 <u>from adopting an alternative school-hours policy if the Oklahoma</u> 14 <u>School for the Blind or the Oklahoma School for the Deaf notifies</u> 15 <u>and receives approval from the State Board of Education prior to</u> 16 <u>October 15 of the applicable school year.</u>

17 SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 4516, is 18 amended to read as follows:

Section 4516. The board of education of any school district operating pursuant to the provisions of this act Section 4511 et <u>seq. of this title</u> shall establish a school calendar whereby the teaching sessions and vacation periods during the school year are on a rotating basis.

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Each selected school shall be closed for all students and
 employees on regular school holidays.

The schools and classes shall be conducted for a total of no less than one hundred eighty (180) days or no less than one thousand eighty (1,080) hours during the academic year <u>as provided for in</u> Section 1-109 of this title.

7 The provisions of all other laws relating to compulsory full-8 time education and the enrollment and attendance of pupils in the 9 kindergarten, elementary and secondary grades shall be applicable 10 with respect to the regular school days prescribed for the entire 11 academic year established for the school at which a program pursuant 12 to this act Section 4511 et seq. of this title is conducted, and to 13 the attendance area established for such school.
