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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:			
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new	r sect	tion of law to be codified	
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section	3-104	4.8 of Title 70, unless	
19	there is created a duplication in nu	mberi	ing, reads as follows:	
20	A. Subject to the availability	of fu	unds, the State Department	
21	of Education shall be authorized to	dired	ctly contract with educators	
22	who are current or retired employees	of (Oklahoma public school	
23	districts, for services to assist th	le Dep	partment as may be necessary	
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when such services require the expertise and qualifications of an
 Oklahoma certified educator.

B. The contract shall not:

Be subject to the competitive bidding requirements of the
 Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act; and

Be included in the calculation of the educator's salary for
 purposes of meeting the district or statutory minimum salary
 schedule or for purposes of calculating Teachers' Retirement System
 of Oklahoma contributions or benefits.

10 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 85.12, as 11 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 76, O.S.L. 2016 (74 O.S. Supp. 12 2016, Section 85.12), is amended to read as follows:

Section 85.12. A. The provisions of this section shall not be construed to affect any law relating to fiscal or accounting procedure except as they may be directly in conflict herewith; and all claims, warrants, and bonds shall be examined, inspected, and approved as now provided by law.

B. Except as otherwise provided by this section, the
acquisitions specified in this subsection shall be made in
compliance with Section 85.39 of this title but are not subject to
other provisions of The Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act:

22 1. Food and other products produced by state institutions and 23 agencies;

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1 2. The printing or duplication of publications or forms of 2 whatsoever kind or character by state agencies if the work is 3 performed upon their own equipment by their own employees. Pursuant to this paragraph, the state agency may only use equipment owned or 4 5 leased by the agency and may only utilize that equipment for printing services required by the agency in performing duties 6 7 imposed upon the agency or functions authorized to be performed by the agency. Any use of the equipment by the agency pursuant to an 8 9 agreement or contract with any other entity resulting in delivery of 10 intermediate or finished products to the entity purchasing or using 11 the products shall be subject to the provisions of The Oklahoma 12 Central Purchasing Act;

3. Department of Transportation and Transportation Commission 13 contractual services or right-of-way purchases; contracts awarded 14 pursuant to bids let by the Transportation Commission for the 15 maintenance or construction of streets, roads, highways, bridges, 16 17 underpasses, or any other transportation facilities under the control of the Department of Transportation, the acquisitions of 18 equipment or materials accruing to the Department of Transportation 19 required in Federal-Aid contracts; and contracts for public service 20 type announcements initiated by the Department of Transportation; 21 but not contractual services for advertising or public relations or 22 employment services; 23

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4. Utility services regulated by a state or federal regulatory
 commission, or by municipal ordinance, or by an Indian Tribal
 Council;

5. Acquisitions by the University Hospitals Authority. The Authority shall develop standards for the acquisition of products and services and may elect to utilize the Purchasing Division. The standards shall foster economy and short response time and shall include appropriate safeguards and record-keeping requirements to ensure appropriate competition and economical and efficient purchasing;

Contracts for custom harvesting by the Department of
 Corrections for the Department or its institutions;

13 7. Contracts with private prison contractors which are subject
14 to the contracting procedures of Section 561 of Title 57 of the
15 Oklahoma Statutes;

16 8. Acquisitions by the Oklahoma Municipal Power Authority;

17 9. Acquisitions by the Grand River Dam Authority;

18 10. Acquisitions by rural water, sewer, gas, or solid waste 19 management districts created pursuant to the Rural Water, Sewer, Gas 20 and Solid Waste Management Districts Act;

11. Acquisitions by the Oklahoma Ordnance Works Authority, the
Northeast Oklahoma Public Facilities Authority, or the Midwestern
Oklahoma Development Authority;

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1 12. Contracts entered into by the Oklahoma Industrial Finance 2 Authority for the services of an appraiser or for acquisition of 3 insurance when the Authority's Board of Directors determines that an 4 emergency exists, and contracts for the services of legal counsel 5 when approved by the Attorney General;

6 13. Expenditure of monies appropriated to the State Board of
7 Education for Local and State Supported Financial Support of Public
8 Schools, except monies allocated therefrom for the Administrative
9 and Support Functions of the State Department of Education;

10 14. Expenditure of monies appropriated to the State Department 11 of Rehabilitation Services for educational programs or educational 12 materials for the Oklahoma School for the Blind and the Oklahoma 13 School for the Deaf;

14 15. Contracts entered into by the Oklahoma Department of Career 15 and Technology Education for the development, revision, or updating 16 of vocational curriculum materials, and contracts entered into by 17 the Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education for 18 training and supportive services that address the needs of new or 19 expanding industries;

20 16. Contracts entered into by the Oklahoma Center for the
21 Advancement of Science and Technology for professional services;

22 17. Contracts entered into by the Oklahoma Department of23 Commerce pursuant to the provisions of Section 5066.4 of this title;

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1 18. Acquisitions made by the Oklahoma Historical Society from
 2 monies used to administer the White Hair Memorial;

19. Acquisitions available to an agency through a General
Services Administration (GSA) contract or other federal contract if
the acquisition is on current statewide contract and the terms of
the GSA or other federal contract, as determined by the State
Purchasing Director, are more favorable to the agency than the terms
of a statewide contract for the same products;

9 20. Purchases of pharmaceuticals available through a multistate 10 or multigovernmental contract if such pharmaceuticals are or have 11 been on state contract within the last fiscal year, and the terms of 12 such contract are more favorable to the state or agency than the 13 terms of a state contract for the same products, as determined by the State Purchasing Director. The state entity designated by law, 14 as specified in Section 1010.3 of Title 56 of the Oklahoma Statutes, 15 shall participate in the purchase of pharmaceuticals available 16 17 through such contracts;

18 21. Contracts for managed health care services entered into by 19 the state entity designated by law or the Department of Human 20 Services, as specified in paragraph 1 of subsection A of Section 21 1010.3 of Title 56 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

22 22. Acquisitions by the Forestry Service of the Oklahoma
23 Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry as authorized by the
24 federal General Services Administration through a General Services

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Administration contract or other federal contract if the acquisitions are not on current statewide contract or the terms of the federal contract are more favorable to the agency than the terms of a statewide contract for the same products;

5 23. Acquisitions of clothing for clients of the Department of
6 Human Services and acquisitions of food for group homes operated by
7 the Department of Human Services;

24. Acquisitions by the Oklahoma Energy Resources Board;

9 25. Acquisitions of clothing for juveniles in the custody of
10 the Office of Juvenile Affairs and acquisitions of food for group
11 homes operated by the Office of Juvenile Affairs;

12 26. State contracts for flexible benefits plans pursuant to the 13 Oklahoma State Employees Benefits Act, Section 1361 et seq. of this 14 title;

15 27. Acquisitions by the Department of Securities to 16 investigate, initiate, or pursue administrative, civil, or criminal 17 proceedings involving potential violations of the acts under the 18 Department's jurisdiction and acquisitions by the Department of 19 Securities for its investor education program;

28. Acquisitions by the Native American Cultural and
Educational Authority and acquisitions by the Oklahoma Department of
Commerce to assist the Native American Cultural and Educational
Authority pursuant to Section 5017 of this title;

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29. Acquisitions for resale in and through canteens operated
 pursuant to Section 537 of Title 57 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

3 30. Acquisitions by the Oklahoma Boll Weevil Eradication 4 Organization for employment and personnel services, and for 5 acquiring sprayers, blowers, traps, and attractants related to the 6 eradication of boll weevils in this state or as part of a national 7 or regional boll weevil eradication program;

8 31. Contracts entered into by the Oklahoma Indigent Defense
9 System for expert services pursuant to the provisions of subsection
10 D of Section 1355.4 of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

11 32. Acquisitions by the Oklahoma Correctional Industries and 12 the Agri-Services programs of the Department of Corrections of raw 13 materials, component parts and other products, any equipment 14 excluding vehicles, and any services excluding computer consultant 15 services used to produce goods or services for resale and for the 16 production of agricultural products;

33. Contracts entered into by the Department of Human Services
for provision of supported living services to members of the
plaintiff class in Homeward Bound, Inc., et al. v. The Hissom
Memorial Center, et al., Case Number 85-C-437-E, United States
District Court for the Northern District of Oklahoma;

34. Contracts negotiated by the Office of Juvenile Affairs with
designated Youth Services Agencies and the Oklahoma Association of
Youth Services, or another Oklahoma nonprofit corporation whose

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membership consists solely of Youth Services Agencies and of whom at least a majority of Youth Services Agencies are members, pursuant to the provisions of Section 2-7-306 of Title 10A of the Oklahoma Statutes and contracts entered into by the Department of Human Services pursuant to Section 1-9-110 of Title 10A of the Oklahoma Statutes with designated Youth Services Agencies;

7 35. Contracts not to exceed One Hundred Thousand Dollars 8 (\$100,000.00) entered into by the Department of Environmental 9 Quality for engineering services to assist qualifying small 10 municipalities or rural water or sewer districts with engineering 11 reports or plans and specifications needed for construction or 12 repairs to achieve compliance with federal and state public water 13 supply or wastewater laws and regulations; and

14 36. Contracts for annuities for structured settlements provided 15 for in Section 158 of Title 51 of the Oklahoma Statutes<u>; and</u>

16 <u>37. Contracts entered into by the State Department of Education</u>
17 <u>with current or retired employees of Oklahoma public school</u>
18 districts to assist the Department when the expertise and

19 <u>qualifications of an Oklahoma certified educator are required, as</u> 20 provided for in Section 1 of this act.

C. Pursuant to the terms of a contract the State Purchasing
Director enters into or awards, a state agency, common school,
municipality, rural fire protection district, county officer, or any
program contract, purchase, acquisition or expenditure that is not

1 subject to the provisions of The Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act, 2 may, unless acting pursuant to a contract with the state that 3 specifies otherwise, make use of statewide contracts and the services of the Purchasing Division and the State Purchasing 4 Director. Any political subdivision or rural fire protection 5 district may designate the State Purchasing Director as its agent 6 7 for any acquisition from a statewide contract or otherwise available to the state. 8

9 D. The State Purchasing Director shall make periodic audits of 10 the purchasing procedures of the Oklahoma Ordnance Works Authority, 11 the Northeast Oklahoma Public Facilities Authority, the University 12 Hospitals Authority, and the Midwestern Oklahoma Development 13 Authority to ensure that the procedures are being followed. SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017. 14 15 SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby 16 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and 17 be in full force from and after its passage and approval. 18 19 20 21 22 23 24
