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22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:					
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SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 353.1, as amended by Section 6, Chapter 288, O.S.L. 2022 (59 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 353.1), is amended to read as follows: Section 353.1. For the purposes of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act:

⁵ 1. "Accredited program" means those seminars, classes, ⁶ meetings, work projects, and other educational courses approved by ⁷ the Board State Board of Pharmacy for purposes of continuing ⁸ professional education;

2. "Act" means the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act;

3. "Administer" means the direct application of a drug, whether by injection, inhalation, ingestion or any other means, to the body of a patient;

4. "Assistant pharmacist" means any person presently licensed as an assistant pharmacist in the State of Oklahoma by the Board pursuant to Section 353.10 of this title and for the purposes of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act shall be considered the same as a pharmacist, except where otherwise specified;

18 5. "Board" or "State Board" means the State Board of Pharmacy; 19 6. "Certify" or "certification of a prescription" means the 20 review of a filled prescription by a licensed pharmacist or a 21 licensed practitioner with dispensing authority to confirm that the 22 medication, labeling and packaging of the filled prescription are 23 accurate and meet all requirements prescribed by state and federal

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¹ law. For the purposes of this paragraph, "licensed practitioner"
² shall not include optometrists with dispensing authority;

³ 7. "Chemical" means any medicinal substance, whether simple or ⁴ compound or obtained through the process of the science and art of ⁵ chemistry, whether of organic or inorganic origin;

8. "Compounding" means the combining, admixing, mixing,
diluting, pooling, reconstituting or otherwise altering of a drug or
bulk drug substance to create a drug. Compounding includes the
preparation of drugs or devices in anticipation of prescription drug
orders based on routine, regularly observed prescribing patterns;

9. "Continuing professional education" means professional, pharmaceutical education in the general areas of the socioeconomic and legal aspects of health care; the properties and actions of drugs and dosage forms; and the etiology, characteristics and therapeutics of the diseased state;

16 10. "Dangerous drug", "legend drug", "prescription drug" or "Rx 17 Only" means a drug:

a. for human use subject to 21 U.S.C. 353(b)(1), or
b. is labeled "Prescription Only", or labeled with the
following statement: "Caution: Federal law restricts
this drug except for use by or on the order of a
licensed veterinarian.";

11. "Director" means the Executive Director of the State Board of Pharmacy unless context clearly indicates otherwise;

1 12. "Dispense" or "dispensing" means the interpretation, evaluation, and implementation of a prescription drug order including the preparation and delivery of a drug or device to a patient or a patient's agent in a suitable container appropriately labeled for subsequent administration to, or use by, a patient. Dispense includes sell, distribute, leave with, give away, dispose of, deliver or supply;

8 13. "Dispenser" means a retail pharmacy, hospital pharmacy, a 9 group of chain pharmacies under common ownership and control that do 10 not act as a wholesale distributor, or any other person authorized 11 by law to dispense or administer prescription drugs, and the 12 affiliated warehouses or distributions of such entities under common 13 ownership and control that do not act as a wholesale distributor. 14 For the purposes of this paragraph, "dispenser" does not mean a 15 person who dispenses only products to be used in animals in 16 accordance with 21 U.S.C. 360b(a)(5);

17 14. "Distribute" or "distribution" means the sale, purchase, 18 trade, delivery, handling, storage, or receipt of a product, and 19 does not include the dispensing of a product pursuant to a 20 prescription executed in accordance with 21 U.S.C. 353(b)(1) or the 21 dispensing of a product approved under 21 U.S.C. 360b(b); provided, 22 taking actual physical possession of a product or title shall not be 23 required;

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¹ 15. "Doctor of Pharmacy" means a person licensed by the Board ² to engage in the practice of pharmacy. The terms "pharmacist", ³ "D.Ph.", and "Doctor of Pharmacy" shall be interchangeable and shall ⁴ have the same meaning wherever they appear in the Oklahoma Statutes ⁵ and the rules promulgated by the Board;

6 16. "Drug outlet" means all manufacturers, repackagers, 7 outsourcing facilities, wholesale distributors, third-party 8 logistics providers, pharmacies, and all other facilities which are 9 engaged in dispensing, delivery, distribution or storage of 10 dangerous drugs;

11 17. "Drugs" means all medicinal substances and preparations 12 recognized by the United States Pharmacopoeia and National 13 Formulary, or any revision thereof, and all substances and 14 preparations intended for external and/or internal use in the cure, 15 diagnosis, mitigation, treatment or prevention of disease in humans 16 or animals and all substances and preparations, other than food, 17 intended to affect the structure or any function of the body of a 18 human or animals;

19 18. "Drug sample" means a unit of a prescription drug packaged 20 under the authority and responsibility of the manufacturer that is 21 not intended to be sold and is intended to promote the sale of the 22 drug;

23 19. "Durable medical equipment" has the same meaning as 24 provided by Section 2 of this act;

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1 20. "Filled prescription" means a packaged prescription 2 medication to which a label has been affixed which contains such 3 information as is required by the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act; 4 "Hospital" means any institution licensed as a hospital by 21. 5 this state for the care and treatment of patients, or a pharmacy 6 operated by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs; 7 22. "Licensed practitioner" means: 8 an allopathic physician, a. 9 an osteopathic physician, b. 10 a podiatric physician, с. 11 d. a dentist, 12 a veterinarian or, e. 13 f. an optometrist, or 14 a Certified Nurse-Midwife, g. 15 licensed to practice and authorized to prescribe dangerous drugs 16 within the scope of practice of such practitioner; 17 23. "Manufacturer" or "virtual manufacturer" means with respect 18 to a product: 19 a person that holds an application approved under 21 a. 20 U.S.C. 355 or a license issued under 42 U.S.C. 262 for 21 such product, or if such product is not the subject of 22 an approved application or license, the person who 23 manufactured the product, 24 _ _

- b. a co-licensed partner of the person described in subparagraph a that obtains the product directly from a person described in this subparagraph or subparagraph a of this paragraph,
- c. an affiliate of a person described in subparagraph a
 or b who receives the product directly from a person
 described in this subparagraph or in subparagraph a or
 b of this paragraph, or
 - d. ap
- a person who contracts with another to manufacture a product;

11 24. "Manufacturing" means the production, preparation, 12 propagation, compounding, conversion or processing of a device or a 13 drug, either directly or indirectly by extraction from substances of 14 natural origin or independently by means of chemical or biological 15 synthesis and includes any packaging or repackaging of the 16 substances or labeling or relabeling of its container, and the 17 promotion and marketing of such drugs or devices. The term 18 "manufacturing" also includes the preparation and promotion of 19 commercially available products from bulk compounds for resale by 20 licensed pharmacies, licensed practitioners or other persons;

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21 25. "Medical gas" means those gases including those in liquid 22 state upon which the manufacturer or distributor has placed one of 23 several cautions, such as "Rx Only", in compliance with federal law;

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¹ 26. "Medical gas order" means an order for medical gas issued ² by a licensed prescriber;

³ 27. "Medical gas distributor" means a person licensed to ⁴ distribute, transfer, wholesale, deliver or sell medical gases on ⁵ drug orders to suppliers or other entities licensed to use, ⁶ administer or distribute medical gas and may also include a patient ⁷ or ultimate user;

8 28. "Medical gas supplier" means a person who dispenses medical
9 gases on drug orders only to a patient or ultimate user;

10 29. "Medicine" means any drug or combination of drugs which has 11 the property of curing, preventing, treating, diagnosing or 12 mitigating diseases, or which is used for that purpose;

13 "Nonprescription drugs" means medicines or drugs which are 30. 14 sold without a prescription and which are prepackaged for use by the 15 consumer and labeled in accordance with the requirements of the 16 statutes and regulations of this state and the federal government. 17 Such items shall also include medical and dental supplies and 18 bottled or nonbulk chemicals which are sold or offered for sale to 19 the general public if such articles or preparations meet the 20 requirements of the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act, 21 21 U.S.C.A., Section 321 et seq.;

31. "Outsourcing facility" including "virtual outsourcing facility" means a facility at one geographic location or address that:

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2 3 a. is engaged in the compounding of sterile drugs,b. has elected to register as an outsourcing facility,and

4 complies with all requirements of 21 U.S.C. 353b; с. 5 "Package" means the smallest individual saleable unit of 32. 6 product for distribution by a manufacturer or repackager that is 7 intended by the manufacturer for ultimate sale to the dispenser of 8 such product. For the purposes of this paragraph, "individual 9 saleable unit" means the smallest container of a product introduced 10 into commerce by the manufacturer or repackager that is intended by 11 the manufacturer or repackager for individual sale to a dispenser; 12 33. "Person" means an individual, partnership, limited 13 liability company, corporation or association, unless the context

14 otherwise requires;

¹⁵ 34. "Pharmacist-in-charge" or "PIC" means the pharmacist ¹⁶ licensed in this state responsible for the management control of a ¹⁷ pharmacy and all other aspects of the practice of pharmacy in a ¹⁸ licensed pharmacy as defined by Section 353.18 of this title;

¹⁹ 35. "Pharmacy" means a place regularly licensed by the Board of ²⁰ Pharmacy in which prescriptions, drugs, medicines, chemicals and ²¹ poisons are compounded or dispensed or such place where pharmacists ²² practice the profession of pharmacy, or a pharmacy operated by the ²³ Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs;

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¹ 36. "Pharmacy technician", "technician", "Rx tech", or "tech" ² means a person issued a Technician permit by the State Board of ³ Pharmacy to assist the pharmacist and perform nonjudgmental, ⁴ technical, manipulative, non-discretionary functions in the ⁵ prescription department under the immediate and direct supervision ⁶ of a pharmacist;

7 37. "Poison" means any substance which when introduced into the 8 body, either directly or by absorption, produces violent, morbid or 9 fatal changes, or which destroys living tissue with which such 10 substance comes into contact;

- 11 38. "Practice of pharmacy" means:
- a. the interpretation and evaluation of prescription
 orders,
- b. the compounding, dispensing, administering and
 labeling of drugs and devices, except labeling by a
 manufacturer, repackager or distributor of
 nonprescription drugs and commercially packaged legend
 drugs and devices,
- 19 c. the participation in drug selection and drug 20 utilization reviews,
- d. the proper and safe storage of drugs and devices and
 the maintenance of proper records thereof,
- e. the responsibility for advising by counseling and
 providing information, where professionally necessary

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1 or where regulated, of therapeutic values, content, 2 hazards and use of drugs and devices, 3 f. the offering or performing of those acts, services, 4 operations or transactions necessary in the conduct, 5 operation, management and control of a pharmacy, or 6 q. the provision of those acts or services that are 7 necessary to provide pharmaceutical care; 8 39. "Preparation" means an article which may or may not contain 9 sterile products compounded in a licensed pharmacy pursuant to the 10 order of a licensed prescriber; 11 40. "Prescriber" means a person licensed in this state who is 12 authorized to prescribe dangerous drugs within the scope of practice 13 of the person's profession; 14 41. "Prescription" means and includes any order for drug or 15 medical supplies written or signed, or transmitted by word of mouth, 16 telephone or other means of communication: 17 by a licensed prescriber, a. 18 under the supervision of an Oklahoma licensed b. 19 practitioner, an Oklahoma licensed advanced practice 20 registered nurse or an Oklahoma licensed a supervising 21 physician, by a physician assistant, Certified Nurse 22 Practitioner, or Clinical Nurse Specialist licensed in 23 this state, or 24 _ _

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- c. by a Certified Nurse-Midwife licensed in this state,
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<u>d.</u> by an Oklahoma licensed wholesaler or distributor as authorized in Section 353.29.1 of this title;

5 42. "Product" means a prescription drug in a finished dosage 6 form for administration to a patient without substantial further 7 manufacturing, such as capsules, tablets, and lyophilized products 8 before reconstitution. "Product" does not include blood components 9 intended for transfusion, radioactive drugs or biologics and medical 10 gas;

11 43. "Repackager", including "virtual repackager", means a 12 person who owns or operates an establishment that repacks and 13 relabels a product or package for further sale or distribution 14 without further transaction;

¹⁵ 44. "Sterile drug" means a drug that is intended for parenteral administration, an ophthalmic or oral inhalation drug in aqueous format, or a drug that is required to be sterile under state and federal law;

45. "Supervising physician" means an individual holding a
current license to practice as a physician from the State Board of
Medical Licensure and Supervision, pursuant to the provisions of the
Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure and Supervision
Act, or the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners, pursuant to the
provisions of the Oklahoma Osteopathic Medicine Act, who supervises

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an advanced practice registered nurse <u>a Certified Nurse Practitioner</u> or <u>Clinical Nurse Specialist</u> as defined in Section 567.3a of this title, and who is not in training as an intern, resident, or fellow. To be eligible to supervise an advanced practice registered nurse, <u>such The supervising</u> physician shall remain in compliance with the rules promulgated by the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision or the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners;

8 46. "Supportive personnel" means technicians and auxiliary
 9 supportive persons who are regularly paid employees of a pharmacy
 10 who work and perform tasks in the pharmacy as authorized by Section
 11 353.18A of this title;

12 47. "Third-party logistics provider" including "virtual third-13 party logistics provider" means an entity that provides or 14 coordinates warehousing, or other logistics services of a product in 15 interstate commerce on behalf of a manufacturer, wholesale 16 distributor, or dispenser of a product but does not take ownership 17 of the product, nor have responsibility to direct the sale or 18 disposition of the product. For the purposes of this paragraph, 19 "third-party logistics provider" does not include shippers and the 20 United States Postal Service;

21 48. "Wholesale distributor" including "virtual wholesale
22 distributor" means a person other than a manufacturer, a
23 manufacturer's co-licensed partner, a third-party logistics
24 provider, or repackager engaged in wholesale distribution as defined

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1 by 21 U.S.C. 353(e)(4) as amended by the Drug Supply Chain Security
2 Act;

³ 49. "County jail" means a facility operated by a county for the ⁴ physical detention and correction of persons charged with, or ⁵ convicted of, criminal offenses or ordinance violations or persons ⁶ found guilty of civil or criminal contempt;

7 50. "State correctional facility" means a facility or 8 institution that houses a prisoner population under the jurisdiction 9 of the Department of Corrections;

¹⁰ 51. "Unit dose package" means a package that contains a single ¹¹ dose drug with the name, strength, control number, and expiration ¹² date of that drug on the label; and

¹³ 52. "Unit of issue package" means a package that provides ¹⁴ multiple doses of the same drug, but each drug is individually ¹⁵ separated and includes the name, lot number, and expiration date. ¹⁶ SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2021, Section 353.1a, is ¹⁷ amended to read as follows:

Section 353.1a. A. Prescribing <u>1. Prescriptive</u> authority shall be allowed <u>as provided by Section 2-312 of Title 63 of the</u> <u>Oklahoma Statutes</u>, under the medical direction of a supervising physician, for an advanced practice nurse <u>a licensed Advanced</u> <u>Practice Registered Nurse</u> recognized by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing in one of the following categories: <u>advanced registered</u> nurse practitioners, clinical nurse specialists, or certified nurse

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¹ midwives as a Certified Nurse Practitioner or Clinical Nurse
² Specialist.

3	2. Prescriptive authority shall be allowed as provided by
4	Section 2-312 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes, independent of
5	the medical direction of a supervising physician, for a licensed
6	Advanced Practice Registered Nurse recognized by the Oklahoma Board
7	of Nursing as a Certified Nurse-Midwife.

8 в. The advanced practice nurse Advanced Practice Registered 9 Nurse may write or sign, or transmit by word of mouth, telephone or 10 other means of communication an order for drugs or medical supplies 11 that is intended to be filled, compounded, or dispensed by a 12 pharmacist. The supervising physician, if applicable, and the 13 advanced practice nurse prescribing Advanced Practice Registered 14 Nurse shall be identified at the time of origination of the 15 prescription and the name of the advanced practice nurse prescribing 16 Advanced Practice Registered Nurse shall be printed on the 17 prescription label.

B. C. Pharmacists may dispense prescriptions for non-controlled prescription drugs authorized by an advanced practice nurse Advanced Practice Registered Nurse or physician assistant, not located in Oklahoma this state, provided that they are licensed in the state in which they are actively prescribing.

C. D. 1. Pharmacists may only dispense prescriptions for
controlled dangerous substances prescribed by an advanced practice

¹ nurse or physician assistant <u>Advanced Practice Registered Nurse</u>
² licensed in the State of Oklahoma and supervised by an Oklahoma³ licensed practitioner this state who meets the criteria in paragraph

Section 567.3a. As used in the Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act:

13 "The practice of nursing" means the performance of services 2. 14 provided for purposes of nursing diagnosis and treatment of human 15 responses to actual or potential health problems consistent with 16 educational preparation. Knowledge and skill are the basis for 17 assessment, analysis, planning, intervention, and evaluation used in 18 the promotion and maintenance of health and nursing management of 19 illness, injury, infirmity, restoration or optimal function, or 20 death with dignity. Practice is based on understanding the human 21 condition across the human lifespan and understanding the 22 relationship of the individual within the environment. This 23 practice includes execution of the medical regime including the

16	b.	who has passed a national certification examination
17		recognized by the Board that measures the advanced

1 factor for all Advanced Practice Registered Nurses is 2 that a significant component of the education and 3 practice focuses on direct care of individuals, 4 d. whose practice builds on the competencies of 5 Registered Nurses by demonstrating a greater depth and 6 breadth of knowledge, a greater synthesis of data, and 7 increased complexity of skills and interventions, and 8 e. who has obtained a license as an Advanced Practice 9 Registered Nurse in one of the following roles: 10 Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist, Certified 11 Nurse-Midwife, Clinical Nurse Specialist, or Certified 12 Nurse Practitioner.

13 Only those persons who hold a license to practice advanced 14 practice registered nursing in this state shall have the right to 15 use the title "Advanced Practice Registered Nurse" and to use the 16 abbreviation "APRN". Only those persons who have obtained a license 17 in the following disciplines shall have the right to fulfill the 18 roles and use the applicable titles: Certified Registered Nurse 19 Anesthetist and the abbreviation "CRNA", Certified Nurse-Midwife and 20 the abbreviation "CNM", Clinical Nurse Specialist and the 21 abbreviation "CNS", and Certified Nurse Practitioner and the 22 abbreviation "CNP".

It shall be unlawful for any person to assume the role or use the title Advanced Practice Registered Nurse or use the abbreviation 1 "APRN" or use the respective specialty role titles and abbreviations 2 or to use any other titles or abbreviations that would reasonably 3 lead a person to believe the user is an Advanced Practice Registered 4 Nurse, unless permitted by the Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act. Any 5 individual doing so shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, which shall be 6 punishable, upon conviction, by imprisonment in the county jail for 7 not more than one (1) year or by a fine of not less than One Hundred 8 Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or 9 by both such imprisonment and fine for each offense;

10 6. "Certified Nurse Practitioner" is means an Advanced Practice 11 Registered Nurse who performs in an expanded role in the delivery of 12 health care:

- a. consistent with advanced educational preparation as a
 Certified Nurse Practitioner in an area of specialty,
 b. functions within the Certified Nurse Practitioner
 scope of practice for the selected area of
 specialization, and
- c. is in accord with the standards for Certified Nurse
 Practitioners as identified by the certifying body and
 approved by the Board.
