- a. The infant is medically or physically unable to receive maternal breast milk or participate in breastfeeding, or

- 3. Such milk is provided by a donor human milk bank that adheres to quality standards of and is accredited by the Human Milk Banking Association of North America or such other standards or accreditation as may be required by the Authority.
- B. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority Board shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section including, but not limited to, establishing infant birth weight and health conditions that may make the provision of pasteurized donor human milk medically necessary and time limits for Medicaid coverage of pasteurized donor human milk. The Board may adopt a policy or procedure to implement the provisions of this section while in the process of promulgating rules; provided, such policy or procedure is posted on the Internet website of the Authority prior to adoption of the policy.
- C. The Authority shall seek any federal approval necessary to implement this section.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2021.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
