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11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
12	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
13	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 720.1 of Title 17, unless there
14	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
15	A. Prior to the installation of any advanced metering
16	infrastructure (AMI), a public utility operating in this state and
17	regulated under the authority of the Corporation Commission shall be
18	required to provide residential and commercial customers with an AMI
19	product disclosure, requiring a signature of acceptance by the
20	customer authorized as required by the Commission.
21	B. The required disclosure shall contain the following:
22	1. A list of possible benefits to the customer requesting an
23	AMI meter;
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2. A privacy disclosure listing the amount and type of data
 collected by an AMI meter and specific parties with whom the data
 may be shared;

A list of the known biological effects that occur with lowfrequency radio-frequency radiation (RF) and electromagnetic fields
(EMF) as documented in the BioInitiative 2012 Report, A Rationale
for Biologically-based Exposure Standards for Low-intensity
Electromagnetic Radiation; and

9 4. A statement as follows: "In some instances AMI meters have10 overheated and ignited."

11 C. The public utility, upon written request, shall provide an 12 existing customer with previously installed AMI a copy of an AMI 13 product disclosure.

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 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.

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
