10	An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S.
11	2011, Sections 51.1, 51.1a, as amended by Section 700, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012, 51.2, as amended by
12	Section 701, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012, 51.2a, 51.2b, 51.2c, as amended by Section 702, Chapter 304, O.S.L.
13	2012, Section 1, Chapter 54, O.S.L. 2013 and 51.3 (74 O.S. Supp. 2020, Sections 51.1a, 51.2, 51.2c and
14	51.2d), which relate to the Oklahoma Homeland Security Act; creating the Office of Homeland
15	Security within the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management; providing for powers and duties of the
16	Homeland Security Advisor; removing designation requirement for location of the Office of Homeland
17	Security; modifying powers and duties of the Office of Homeland Security; modifying interoperable public
18	safety communications planning; modifying Oklahoma Homeland Security Revolving Fund; modifying emergency
19	preparedness grants; modifying Oklahoma School Security Grant Program Act; modifying Oklahoma School
20	Security Revolving Fund; modifying Oklahoma School Security Institute; modifying regional planning and
21	coordination advisory councils; updating statutory references; and providing an effective date.

24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

1SECTION 1.AMENDATORY74 O.S. 2011, Section 51.1, is2amended to read as follows:

3 Section 51.1. A. There is hereby created within the Oklahoma 4 Department of Emergency Management, the Office of Homeland Security. 5 The Governor Director of the Department shall be the chief officer 6 of the Office and shall appoint a Homeland Security Director Advisor 7 who shall be responsible to the Governor Director for the operation and administration of the Office. The Governor Director shall 8 determine the salary for the Director Advisor in cooperation with 9 10 standards promulgated by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services, and may make such expenditures within the appropriation 11 12 therefor, or from such other available funds as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of the Oklahoma Homeland Security Act and 13 other programs specified by law. 14

B. The Oklahoma Homeland Security Director Advisor shall
possess or obtain a federally recognized Top Secret Level Clearance
clearances as appropriate to perform the duties of the position.

Any employee of state government appointed <u>by the Director</u>
 to the position of Oklahoma Homeland Security Director <u>Advisor</u> shall
 have a right to return to the previously held classified position of
 the employee without any loss of rights, privileges, or benefits
 immediately upon completion of the duties as Oklahoma Homeland
 Security Director <u>Advisor</u>, provided the employee is not otherwise
 disgualified.

1 2. Any person appointed to the position of Oklahoma Homeland 2 Security Director Advisor, if already a member of a state retirement 3 system, shall be eliqible to continue participation in that system. If not a member of a state retirement system, the Director Advisor 4 5 shall be eligible to participate in the Oklahoma Public Employees 6 Retirement System. The Oklahoma Homeland Security Director Advisor 7 shall be eligible for participation in only one retirement system and shall elect in writing the system in which the Director Advisor 8 9 intends to participate.

10 3. The Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety may shall commission the Director of Homeland Security, Advisor and 11 12 designated staff within the agency as specified by the Director, as a peace officer if at the time of appointment the Director is 13 certified peace officers. All commissioned staff must obtain and 14 15 maintain certification as a law enforcement officer officers by the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET) or as a 16 17 state trooper if at the time of appointment the Director is a CLEETcertified officer of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol. 18

C. The Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security shall consist of at
 least three divisions functions:

- 21 1. Prevention and Intelligence;
- 22 2. Response and Recovery Planning; and
- 23 3. Awareness and Preparedness.
- 24

1 The Director shall be authorized to employ personnel D. 2 necessary to achieve the mission of the Office. Other federal, 3 state, and local personnel may be assigned to the Office of Homeland Security pursuant to an interagency agreement. The Covernor shall 4 5 designate at which appropriate state agency the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security shall be located. That agency shall provide 6 7 housing, administrative staff and other support to the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security. All positions and personnel of the 8 9 Office of Homeland Security shall be exempt from the full-time-10 employee limit of the state agency where the Office of Homeland 11 Security is located.

12 Е. The Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Director shall have the duty and responsibility to develop and coordinate the 13 implementation and administration of a comprehensive statewide 14 15 strategy that is integrated into the emergency operations plan to secure the State of Oklahoma from the results of acts of terrorism, 16 from a public health emergency, from cyberterrorism $_{\overline{\tau}}$ and from 17 weapons of mass destruction as that term is defined in 18 U.S.C., 18 Section 2332a, and to perform other duties assigned by the Governor 19 20 Director. These duties shall include but not be limited to:

Representing the State of Oklahoma with federal agencies as
 the state homeland security director <u>Homeland Security Advisor</u> for
 purposes of accessing federal funds and cooperating with federal

1 agencies in the development and implementation of a nationwide
2 homeland security plan of response; and

3 2. Coordinating the Homeland Security efforts within the State of Oklahoma $_{\tau}$ including working with the Director, Governor and 4 5 Legislature, state agencies, and local elected officials and local 6 governments, emergency responder groups, private-sector businesses, educational institutions, volunteer organizations, and the general 7 public. State agencies receiving federal funding for homeland 8 9 security purposes shall report the amount and intended use of those 10 funds to the Oklahoma Homeland Security Director Department to 11 ensure efficient use of funds and to avoid duplication of efforts.

F. Included in the comprehensive statewide strategy and consistent with the National Strategy for Homeland Security, as promulgated by the Office of the President of the United States, or its successor plan or plans, the Oklahoma Homeland Security Director <u>Advisor</u> shall establish the following strategic objectives for Oklahoma:

- 18 1. To prevent terrorist attacks;
- 19 2. To reduce vulnerability to terrorism;

3. To minimize the damage from and to recover from terroristattacks; and

4. Such other duties as the Governor may prescribe.

G. The Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security shall have thefollowing duties:

1 1. Establish a plan for the effective implementation of a 2 statewide emergency All-Hazards response system_{τ} including the duties and responsibilities of regional emergency response teams; 3 2. Create, implement, and administer an advisory system; 4 5 3. Coordinate and prepare applications for federal funds related to homeland security and accessing and distributing the 6 federal funds; and 7

8 4. Cooperate with federal agencies in the development and9 implementation of a nationwide homeland security plan or response.

H. The Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department and any
local government may enter into contracts with each other for
equipment and personnel, or both, to carry out the requirements of
<u>the Homeland Security Act</u>. The contract may include any provisions
agreed upon by the parties and as required by any federal or state
grant, if applicable.

I. All state agencies and political subdivisions of this state 16 and all officers and employees of those agencies and political 17 subdivisions are hereby directed to cooperate with and lend 18 assistance to the Oklahoma Homeland Security Director and Advisor. 19 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 51.1a, as 20 amended by Section 700, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp. 21 2020, Section 51.1a), is amended to read as follows: 22 Section 51.1a. A. In addition to the powers and duties as 23

24 defined elsewhere in statute, the Oklahoma Office of Homeland

Security <u>Department of Emergency Management</u> has the duty and
 responsibility for interoperable public safety communications
 planning within the State of Oklahoma. As part of this duty the
 Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security <u>Department</u> shall:

5 1. Annually develop and report to the Governor, President Pro
6 Tempore of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Representatives,
7 the Statewide Communications Interoperability Plan;

2. Coordinate statewide planning for public safety
9 communication needs of state government and state emergency
10 responders, including a migration plan for state agency use of
11 public safety communications technologies and rendering of aid
12 between state government and its political subdivisions for
13 organizing and use of disparate public safety communications
14 systems;

3. Serve as a focal point for all state-level projects involving public safety communications vendors where the focus of such authority can substantially enhance the state communications plan or savings;

4. Apply for, receive, and hold, or assist state agencies in
applying for, receiving, or holding such authorizations, licenses,
and allocations of channels and frequencies to carry out the
purposes of this section;

23 5. Establish minimum standards and protocols for acquisition, 24 development_{au} or enhancement of public safety communications

technologies. These standards shall be utilized by the Information
 Services Division of the Office of Management and Enterprise
 Services pursuant to the provisions of Section 34.20 of Title 62 of
 the Oklahoma Statutes; and

6. Accomplish such other purposes as may be necessary or
incidental to the administration of its authority or functions
pursuant to law.

It is the intent of the Legislature that all state public 8 Β. 9 entities comply with the provisions of the Statewide Communications 10 Interoperability Plan issued by the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department. All state agencies are required to review the 11 12 provisions of the Statewide Communications Interoperability Plan and the public safety communications standards issued by the Oklahoma 13 Office of Homeland Security Department prior to the purchase, 14 15 acquisition, development, or enhancement of any public safety 16 communications system. Local public safety agencies and political 17 subdivisions of the state are encouraged, but not required, to review the provisions of the Statewide Communications 18 Interoperability Plan and the public safety communications standards 19 issued by the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department prior 20 to the purchase, acquisition, development τ or enhancement of any 21 public safety communications system to assist the local public 22 safety agency or political subdivision in purchasing decisions. 23

C. No state agency shall use state funds or enter into any
 agreement for the acquisition, development, or enhancement of a
 public safety communication system unless the request is consistent
 with the Statewide Communications Interoperability Plan and the
 public safety communications standards issued by the Oklahoma Office
 of Homeland Security Department.

SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 51.2, as
amended by Section 701, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp.
2020, Section 51.2), is amended to read as follows:

10 Section 51.2. A. There is hereby created in the State Treasury 11 a revolving fund for the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security 12 Department of Emergency Management to be designated the "Oklahoma Homeland Security Revolving Fund". The Oklahoma Homeland Security 13 Revolving Fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal 14 year limitations and shall consist of monies received by the 15 Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security or the Department of Public 16 Safety from: 17

Reimbursements from responsible parties for reasonable
 actions taken and costs incurred by a regional team in response to
 an incident or event involving a dangerous substance;

21 2. Reimbursements, grants, or other monies received from other
 22 state agencies and entities of state government;

23 3. Reimbursements, grants, or other monies received by the
 24 Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department or the Department of

Public Safety from the United States government or pursuant to
 proceedings in district court to enforce claims initiated pursuant
 to the Oklahoma Homeland Security Act or the Oklahoma Emergency
 Response Act;

4. Gifts, donations, and bequests;

6 5. Monies appropriated or apportioned by the state; and

6. Receipts from other ancillary services related to incidents
or events related to dangerous substances, not otherwise provided by
9 law.

B. All monies accruing to the credit of the Oklahoma Homeland Security Revolving Fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department for:

Operating expenses <u>relating to homeland security expenses;</u>
 Administrative duties <u>in support of homeland security</u>
 functions; and

17 3. Education and reimbursement for expenses of regional teams,18 including maintenance of equipment.

C. Expenditures from the Oklahoma Homeland Security Revolving Fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

1SECTION 4.AMENDATORY74 O.S. 2011, Section 51.2a, is2amended to read as follows:

Section 51.2a. Contingent upon the availability of designated funding from the United States Department of Homeland Security or state appropriations, the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security <u>Department of Emergency Management</u> shall make grant monies available to:

1. Public schools, private schools, technology center schools, 8 9 and institutions of higher learning in the State of Oklahoma to 10 encourage greater emergency preparedness, including, but not limited 11 to, improvement of plans and procedures for natural and man-made 12 disaster disasters and emergencies, improvement of security on 13 campus, at events, and with regard to buses and other transportation, and improvement of communications strategies and 14 15 equipment; and

16 2. Local law enforcement, emergency management, disaster 17 relief, and public health entities in the State of Oklahoma to 18 encourage the active engagement of such entities with public 19 schools, private schools, technology center schools, and 20 institutions of higher learning in their efforts to improve 21 emergency preparedness.

22 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 51.2b, is 23 amended to read as follows:

Section 51.2b. A. This section shall be known and may be cited
 as the "Oklahoma School Security Grant Program Act".

B. The Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department of
<u>Emergency Management</u> shall solicit proposals for and make grants for
the enhancement of campus security at institutions of higher
learning, technology center schools, public schools, and private
schools.

8 C. The goals and objectives of the Oklahoma School Security9 Grant Program are to:

Increase the awareness of the public and educational
 institutions of the risks, threats, and vulnerabilities of school
 campuses as well as mitigation strategies;

Incentivize participation in school security training
 programs designed to assess campus risks, threats, and
 vulnerabilities;

3. Provide assistance to institutions of higher learning,
 technology center schools, public schools, and private schools
 initiating or implementing school security plans, programs, and
 activities; and

Build upon the success of the pilot Education Grant Program
 established by the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security.

D. The Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department shall
 determine grant project criteria and establish a process for the

consideration of proposals. The proposals shall be considered on a
 statewide competitive basis among peer institutions.

E. On or before January 1, 2010, and each year thereafter, the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department shall prepare an annual report on the Oklahoma School Security Grant Program and submit <u>the report</u> to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

8 SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 51.2c, as 9 amended by Section 702, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp. 10 2020, Section 51.2c), is amended to read as follows:

Section 51.2c. A. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Department of Emergency Management to be designated the "Oklahoma School Security Revolving Fund". The Oklahoma School Security Revolving Fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of monies received by the

17 Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department from:

Reimbursements, grants, or other monies received from other
 state agencies and entities of state government for school security;

2. Reimbursements, grants, or other monies received by the
 Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department from the United
 States government obligated to school security projects;

23 3. Gifts, donations, and bequests; and

24 4. Monies appropriated or apportioned by the state.

1 B. All monies accruing to the credit of the Oklahoma School 2 Security Revolving Fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted 3 and expended by the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department for the administration of the Oklahoma School Security Grant 4 5 Program. Contingent upon the availability of funding, the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department may make grants each year to 6 institutions of higher learning, technology center schools, public 7 schools, and private schools as provided in Section $\frac{51.26}{51.2b}$ 51.2b of 8 9 this title.

10 C. Expenditures from the Oklahoma School Security Revolving 11 Fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer 12 against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the 13 Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and 14 payment.

SECTION 7. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 54, O.S.L. 2013
(74 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 51.2d), is amended to read as follows:
Section 51.2d. A. Upon the effective date of this act July 1,
2013, the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department of
<u>Emergency Management</u> shall designate a division function of their
office its agency as the "Oklahoma School Security Institute".

B. The Oklahoma School Security Institute shall act as the
central repository for the public and private elementary and
secondary schools of this state to contact for information on
resources made available to the schools in their efforts to enhance

school security and assess risks and threats to school campuses.
 The goals and objectives of the Oklahoma School Security Institute
 shall include, but not be limited to:

Maximizing school security training and support to public
 and private elementary and secondary schools as authorized pursuant
 to Section 51.2b of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes this title;

7 2. Assisting and coordinating with public and private
8 elementary and secondary school administrators as required in the
9 development and implementation of safety drills;

Facilitating efforts of public and private elementary and
 secondary schools to utilize any available programs or entities
 specializing in security issues; and

4. Creating and coordinating any working groups when necessary
in order to continue developing and implementing new strategies and
techniques for future recommendations on school security issues.

16 C. The Oklahoma School Security Institute may develop a 17 telephone tip line whereby reports of activity that may compromise 18 school safety can be called in and disseminated to the appropriate 19 parties for additional investigation should it be warranted.

20 SECTION 8. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 51.3, is 21 amended to read as follows:

22 Section 51.3. A. There are hereby created regional planning 23 and coordination advisory councils for homeland security. The 24 Oklahoma Homeland Security Director Department of Emergency

1	Management shall designate the geographical boundaries for each
2	regional advisory council within the state.
3	B. Each regional advisory council shall be composed of the
4	following members:
5	1. A chief of a paid fire department;
6	2. A chief of a volunteer fire department;
7	3. A county sheriff;
8	4. A chief of a police department;
9	5. A physician or hospital administrator;
10	6. An emergency management coordinator;
11	7. An emergency medical services provider;
12	8. A veterinarian;
13	9. A representative of a state or local disaster relief agency;
14	10. A city manager or mayor;
15	11. A county commissioner;
16	12. A public health representative;
17	13. A Council of Government representative;
18	14. A representative of a public school district; and
19	15. A representative of an institution of higher learning.
20	C. The members of the regional advisory councils shall be
21	appointed by the Oklahoma Homeland Security Department of Emergency
22	Management Director. The Director shall appoint from a list of
23	nominees provided to the Director from statewide associations or
24	entities that represent the disciplines to be represented on the

advisory councils. All members can be removed for cause by the
 Director.

D. Each member of a regional advisory council shall reside in or have employment duties within the region to be served by the regional advisory council. Regional advisory council members shall have staggered terms of office not exceeding three (3) years and may be reappointed upon the expiration of a term.

E. Each regional advisory council shall meet at least twice a 8 9 year or more frequently at the discretion of the Director. The 10 Director, or Homeland Security Advisor or designee, from the 11 Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security Department shall attend the 12 meetings of the regional advisory councils. A majority of the 13 members of the regional advisory council shall constitute a quorum. The Office of Homeland Security Department shall establish policies 14 15 and procedures regarding the operation of the regional advisory councils. 16

17 F. The duties and responsibilities of each regional advisory 18 council shall be:

Assessing and documenting the needs of the region related to
 homeland security;

Coordinating and cooperating with the Oklahoma Office of
 Homeland Security Department to achieve the strategic objectives
 prescribed in this act the Oklahoma Homeland Security Act; and

1	3. Other duties and responsibilities as determined by the
2	Oklahoma Homeland Security Director.
3	SECTION 9. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
