AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 353.1, as 8 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 106, O.S.L. 2018 (59 O.S. Supp. 9 2020, Section 353.1), is amended to read as follows: 10 Section 353.1. For the purposes of the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act: 11 1. "Accredited program" means those seminars, classes, 12 meetings, work projects, and other educational courses approved by 13 the Board State Board of Pharmacy for purposes of continuing 14 professional education; 15 2. "Act" means the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act; 16 3. "Administer" means the direct application of a drug, whether 17 by injection, inhalation, ingestion or any other means, to the body 18 of a patient; 19 "Assistant pharmacist" means any person presently licensed 4. 20 as an assistant pharmacist in the State of Oklahoma by the Board 21 pursuant to Section 353.10 of this title and for the purposes of the 22 Oklahoma Pharmacy Act shall be considered the same as a pharmacist, 23 except where otherwise specified; 24 5. "Board" or "State Board" means the State Board of Pharmacy;

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6. "Certify" or "certification of a prescription" means the review of a filled prescription by a licensed pharmacist or a licensed practitioner with dispensing authority to confirm that the medication, labeling and packaging of the filled prescription are accurate and meet all requirements prescribed by state and federal law. For the purposes of this paragraph, "licensed practitioner" shall not include optometrists with dispensing authority;

8 7. "Chemical" means any medicinal substance, whether simple or 9 compound or obtained through the process of the science and art of 10 chemistry, whether of organic or inorganic origin;

11 8. "Compounding" means the combining, admixing, mixing, 12 diluting, pooling, reconstituting or otherwise altering of a drug or 13 bulk drug substance to create a drug. Compounding includes the 14 preparation of drugs or devices in anticipation of prescription drug 15 orders based on routine, regularly observed prescribing patterns;

9. "Continuing professional education" means professional, pharmaceutical education in the general areas of the socioeconomic and legal aspects of health care; the properties and actions of drugs and dosage forms; and the etiology, characteristics and therapeutics of the diseased state;

21 10. "Dangerous drug", "legend drug", "prescription drug" or "Rx 22 Only" means a drug:

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b. is labeled "Prescription Only", or labeled with the following statement: "Caution: Federal law restricts this drug except for use by or on the order of a licensed veterinarian".

<sup>5</sup> 11. "Director" means the Executive Director of the State Board
 <sup>6</sup> of Pharmacy unless context clearly indicates otherwise;

7 12. "Dispense" or "dispensing" means the interpretation, 8 evaluation, and implementation of a prescription drug order, 9 including the preparation and delivery of a drug or device to a 10 patient or a patient's agent in a suitable container appropriately 11 labeled for subsequent administration to, or use by, a patient. 12 Dispense includes sell, distribute, leave with, give away, dispose 13 of, deliver or supply;

14 13. "Dispenser" means a retail pharmacy, hospital pharmacy, a 15 group of chain pharmacies under common ownership and control that do 16 not act as a wholesale distributor, or any other person authorized 17 by law to dispense or administer prescription drugs, and the 18 affiliated warehouses or distributions of such entities under common 19 ownership and control that do not act as a wholesale distributor. 20 For the purposes of this paragraph, "dispenser" does not mean a 21 person who dispenses only products to be used in animals in 22 accordance with 21 U.S.C. 360b(a)(5);

14. "Distribute" or "distribution" means the sale, purchase, trade, delivery, handling, storage, or receipt of a product, and <sup>1</sup> does not include the dispensing of a product pursuant to a <sup>2</sup> prescription executed in accordance with 21 U.S.C. 353(b)(1) or the <sup>3</sup> dispensing of a product approved under 21 U.S.C. 360b(b); provided, <sup>4</sup> taking actual physical possession of a product or title shall not be <sup>5</sup> required;

6 15. "Doctor of Pharmacy" means a person licensed by the Board 7 to engage in the practice of pharmacy. The terms "pharmacist", 8 "D.Ph.", and "Doctor of Pharmacy" shall be interchangeable and shall 9 have the same meaning wherever they appear in the Oklahoma Statutes 10 and the rules promulgated by the Board;

11 16. "Drug outlet" means all manufacturers, repackagers, 12 outsourcing facilities, wholesale distributors, third-party 13 logistics providers, pharmacies, and all other facilities which are 14 engaged in dispensing, delivery, distribution or storage of 15 dangerous drugs;

16 17. "Drugs" means all medicinal substances and preparations 17 recognized by the United States Pharmacopoeia and National 18 Formulary, or any revision thereof, and all substances and 19 preparations intended for external and/or internal use in the cure, 20 diagnosis, mitigation, treatment or prevention of disease in humans 21 or animals and all substances and preparations, other than food, 22 intended to affect the structure or any function of the body of a 23 human or animals;

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1 18. "Drug sample" means a unit of a prescription drug packaged 2 under the authority and responsibility of the manufacturer that is 3 not intended to be sold and is intended to promote the sale of the 4 drug;

5 19. "Filled prescription" means a packaged prescription 6 medication to which a label has been affixed which contains such 7 information as is required by the Oklahoma Pharmacy Act;

8 20. "Hospital" means any institution licensed as a hospital by
 9 this state for the care and treatment of patients, or a pharmacy
 10 operated by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs;

- 11 21. "Licensed practitioner" means:
- 12 a. an allopathic physician,
- b. an osteopathic physician,
- c. a podiatric physician,
- 15 <u>d.</u> <u>a</u> dentist,
- 16 e. a veterinarian <del>or</del>,
- 17 <u>f.</u> an optometrist, or
- 18 g. <u>a Certified Nurse Practitioner who has obtained</u> 19 independent prescriptive authority,

<sup>20</sup> licensed to practice and authorized to prescribe dangerous drugs <sup>21</sup> within the scope of practice of such practitioner;

22 22. "Manufacturer" or "virtual manufacturer" means with respect 23 to a product:

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- a. a person that holds an application approved under 21 U.S.C. 355 or a license issued under 42 U.S.C. 262 for such product, or if such product is not the subject of an approved application or license, the person who manufactured the product,
- b. a co-licensed partner of the person described in
  subparagraph a that obtains the product directly from
  a person described in this subparagraph or
  subparagraph a,
- 10 c. an affiliate of a person described in subparagraph a 11 or b who receives the product directly from a person 12 described in this subparagraph or in subparagraph a or 13 b; or
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d. a person who contracts with another to manufacture a product;

16 23. "Manufacturing" means the production, preparation,

<sup>17</sup> propagation, compounding, conversion or processing of a device or a <sup>18</sup> drug, either directly or indirectly by extraction from substances of <sup>19</sup> natural origin or independently by means of chemical or biological <sup>20</sup> synthesis and includes any packaging or repackaging of the <sup>21</sup> substances or labeling or relabeling of its container, and the <sup>22</sup> promotion and marketing of such drugs or devices. The term <sup>23</sup> "manufacturing" also includes the preparation and promotion of

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1 commercially available products from bulk compounds for resale by 2 licensed pharmacies, licensed practitioners or other persons;

<sup>3</sup> 24. "Medical gas" means those gases including those in liquid <sup>4</sup> state upon which the manufacturer or distributor has placed one of <sup>5</sup> several cautions, such as "Rx Only", in compliance with federal law;

<sup>6</sup> 25. "Medical gas order" means an order for medical gas issued <sup>7</sup> by a licensed prescriber;

8 26. "Medical gas distributor" means a person licensed to 9 distribute, transfer, wholesale, deliver or sell medical gases on 10 drug orders to suppliers or other entities licensed to use, 11 administer or distribute medical gas and may also include a patient 12 or ultimate user;

13 27. "Medical gas supplier" means a person who dispenses medical 14 gases on drug orders only to a patient or ultimate user;

<sup>15</sup> 28. "Medicine" means any drug or combination of drugs which has <sup>16</sup> the property of curing, preventing, treating, diagnosing or <sup>17</sup> mitigating diseases, or which is used for that purpose;

18 29. "Nonprescription drugs" means medicines or drugs which are 19 sold without a prescription and which are prepackaged for use by the 20 consumer and labeled in accordance with the requirements of the 21 statutes and regulations of this state and the federal government. 22 Such items shall also include medical and dental supplies and 23 bottled or nonbulk chemicals which are sold or offered for sale to 24 the general public if such articles or preparations meet the

3 30. "Outsourcing facility" $_{\tau}$  including "virtual outsourcing 4 facility" means a facility at one geographic location or address 5 that:

a. is engaged in the compounding of sterile drugs,
b. has elected to register as an outsourcing facility,
and

9 complies with all requirements of 21 U.S.C. 353b; с. 10 "Package" means the smallest individual saleable unit of 31. 11 product for distribution by a manufacturer or repackager that is 12 intended by the manufacturer for ultimate sale to the dispenser of 13 such product. For the purposes of this paragraph, "individual 14 saleable unit" means the smallest container of a product introduced 15 into commerce by the manufacturer or repackager that is intended by 16 the manufacturer or repackager for individual sale to a dispenser;

Section 353.1a. A. Prescribing <u>Prescriptive</u> authority shall be allowed, under the medical direction of a supervising physician, for an advanced practice nurse <u>Advanced Practice Registered Nurse</u> recognized by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing <u>in one of the following</u> categories: advanced registered nurse practitioners, clinical nurse specialists, or certified nurse-midwives <u>as a Clinical Nurse</u> Specialist or Certified Nurse-Midwife.

17 B. 1. Prescriptive authority shall be allowed, under the 18 medical direction of a supervising physician, for an Advanced 19 Practice Registered Nurse recognized by the Oklahoma Board of 20 Nursing as a Certified Nurse Practitioner who chooses to practice 21 under the supervision of a physician or who is undergoing a 22 mentorship as provided by Section 5 of this act. 23 2. Prescriptive authority shall be allowed, independent of the 24 medical direction of a supervising physician, for an Advanced

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Practice Registered Nurse recognized by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing as a Certified Nurse Practitioner who has obtained independent prescriptive authority as provided by Section 5 of this act.

5 C. The advanced practice nurse Advanced Practice Registered 6 Nurse may write or sign, or transmit by word of mouth, telephone or 7 other means of communication an order for drugs or medical supplies 8 that is intended to be filled, compounded, or dispensed by a 9 pharmacist. The supervising physician, if applicable, and the 10 advanced practice nurse Advanced Practice Registered Nurse shall be 11 identified at the time of origination of the prescription and the 12 name of the advanced practice nurse Advanced Practice Registered 13 Nurse shall be printed on the prescription label.

<sup>14</sup> B. D. Pharmacists may dispense prescriptions for non-controlled <sup>15</sup> prescription drugs authorized by an advanced practice nurse <u>Advanced</u> <sup>16</sup> <u>Practice Registered Nurse</u> or physician assistant, not located in <sup>17</sup> Oklahoma, provided that they are licensed in the state in which they <sup>18</sup> are actively prescribing.

19 C. E. 1. Pharmacists may only dispense prescriptions for 20 controlled dangerous substances prescribed by an advanced practice 21 nurse or physician assistant <u>Advanced Practice Registered Nurse</u> 22 licensed in the State of Oklahoma and supervised by an Oklahoma-23 licensed practitioner <u>this state who meets the criteria in</u> 24 subsection A or B of this section.

Section 567.3a. As used in the Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act:

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1. "Board" means the Oklahoma Board of Nursing;

10 "The practice of nursing" means the performance of services 2. 11 provided for purposes of nursing diagnosis and treatment of human 12 responses to actual or potential health problems consistent with 13 educational preparation. Knowledge and skill are the basis for 14 assessment, analysis, planning, intervention, and evaluation used in 15 the promotion and maintenance of health and nursing management of 16 illness, injury, infirmity, restoration or optimal function, or 17 death with dignity. Practice is based on understanding the human 18 condition across the human lifespan and understanding the 19 relationship of the individual within the environment. This 20 practice includes execution of the medical regime including the 21 administration of medications and treatments prescribed by any 22 person authorized by state law to so prescribe;

F. The State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision may establish a fee for the review of initial and renewal applications for independent prescriptive authority, not to exceed the fee amount established for initial application for licensure of physician assistants.

G. 1. A Certified Nurse Practitioner who obtains independent prescriptive authority under this section and practices unsupervised shall only practice in one or more geographic areas that have been designated as Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSAs) for primary care by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services; provided, however:

a. a Certified Nurse Practitioner licensed on or before
 the effective date of this act may continue to

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practice at any physical address or addresses where the Certified Nurse Practitioner practices as of the effective date of this act regardless of whether the address or addresses are located in a geographic area or areas that are not designated as HPSAs by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services as of the effective date of this act, or whether such geographic area or areas subsequently lose the HPSA designation for primary care; and

10 a Certified Nurse Practitioner licensed after the b. 11 effective date of this act may continue to practice at 12 any physical address or addresses where the Certified 13 Nurse Practitioner practices as of the date of 14 obtainment of initial independent prescriptive 15 authority that are located in a geographic area or 16 areas that have been designated as HPSAs for primary 17 care by the U.S. Department of Health and Human 18 Services as of the date of obtainment of initial 19 independent prescriptive authority regardless of 20 whether the geographic area or areas where the address 21 or addresses are located subsequently lose the HPSA 22 designation for primary care.

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1 2. The requirements provided by paragraph 1 shall not apply to 2 a Certified Nurse Practitioner who holds a doctorate degree in 3 nursing.

H. The provisions of this section shall apply to an Advanced
Practice Registered Nurse licensed by endorsement as a Certified
Nurse Practitioner by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing as provided by
Section 567.5a of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

8 SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 567.7, as
 9 amended by Section 1, Chapter 190, O.S.L. 2016 (59 O.S. Supp. 2020,
 10 Section 567.7), is amended to read as follows:

Section 567.7. A. Upon expiration of an initial license or certificate issued pursuant to the Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act, a license or certificate shall be renewed every two (2) years according to a schedule published by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing, provided that the application is complete and qualifying criteria continues to be met.

B. A licensee or certificate holder who applies for
 reinstatement of a license or certificate shall meet such
 requirements as the Board may prescribe in its rules.

C. Any licensee or certificate holder who desires to retire temporarily from the practice of nursing in this state shall submit a written request to that effect to the Board. It shall be the duty of the Board to place the name of such licensee or certificate holder upon the nonpracticing list in accordance with the rules of

the Board. During the period of temporary retirement, the licensee or certificate holder shall not practice nursing, Advanced Practice Registered Nursing or practice as an Advanced Unlicensed Assistant nor be subject to the payment of any renewal fees. When the licensee or certificate holder desires to resume practice, such licensee or certificate holder shall meet such requirements as the Board may prescribe in its rules.

8 D. The Board is authorized to establish by rule fees to be 9 charged for the purpose of implementing and enforcing the provisions 10 of the Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act; provided, however, no single 11 fee for an initial application for licensure or certification, or 12 for renewal, reinstatement or return to active practice shall exceed 13 One Hundred Twenty-five Dollars (\$125.00). The application fee for 14 a multistate license issued pursuant to Section 5 of this act shall 15 be One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00). The biennial multistate 16 license renewal fee shall be One Hundred Twenty-five Dollars 17 (\$125.00); provided, however, that contingent upon implementation of 18 the Nurse Licensure Compact and the Board's revolving fund balance 19 being reconciled at less than the average of three (3) months of 20 expenditures, the biennial renewal fee set forth in Oklahoma 21 Administrative Code 485:10-1-3(a)(2) shall increase by Ten Dollars 22 (\$10.00) by operation of law. The Board may reduce the biennial 23 renewal fees on a pro rata basis for the specific Registered Nurse 24 and Licensed Practical Nurse biennial renewal period. \_ \_

Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the renewal fee for a Certified Nurse Practitioner who has obtained independent prescriptive authority as provided by Section 5 of this act shall be an amount equivalent to the licensure renewal fee imposed on steopathic physicians.

6 Ε. The Executive Director of the Board shall suspend the 7 license or certificate of a person who submits a check, money draft, 8 or similar instrument for payment of a fee which is not honored by 9 the financial institution named. The suspension becomes effective 10 ten (10) days following delivery by certified mail of written notice 11 of the dishonor and the impending suspension to the person's address 12 on file. Upon notification of suspension, the person may reinstate 13 the authorization to practice upon payment of the fees and any and 14 all costs associated with notice and collection. The suspension 15 shall be exempt from the Administrative Procedures Act.

SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 567.27 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

An Advanced Practice Registered Nurse, or his or her employer on his or her behalf, shall be required to carry malpractice insurance or demonstrate proof of financial responsibility in a minimum amount of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence and Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) in the aggregate per year.

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SECTION 8. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 2-312, is amended to read as follows:

3 Section 2-312. A. A physician, podiatrist, optometrist or a 4 dentist who has complied with the registration requirements of the 5 Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act, in good faith and in 6 the course of such person's professional practice only, may 7 prescribe and administer controlled dangerous substances, or may 8 cause the same to be administered by medical or paramedical 9 personnel acting under the direction and supervision of the 10 physician, podiatrist, optometrist or dentist, and only may dispense 11 controlled dangerous substances pursuant to the provisions of 12 Sections 355, 355.1 and 355.2 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

B. A veterinarian who has complied with the registration requirements of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act, in good faith and in the course of the professional practice of the veterinarian only, and not for use by a human being, may prescribe, administer, and dispense controlled dangerous substances and may cause them to be administered by an assistant or orderly under the direction and supervision of the veterinarian.

C. An advanced practice nurse Advanced Practice Registered
Nurse who is recognized to prescribe by the Oklahoma Board of
Nursing as an advanced registered nurse practitioner, clinical nurse
specialist or certified nurse-midwife, a Clinical Nurse Specialist
or a Certified Nurse-Midwife who is subject to medical direction by

<sup>1</sup> a supervising physician, pursuant to Section 567.3a of Title 59 of <sup>2</sup> the Oklahoma Statutes, and who has complied with the registration <sup>3</sup> requirements of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act, in <sup>4</sup> good faith and in the course of professional practice only, may <sup>5</sup> prescribe and administer Schedule III, IV and V controlled dangerous <sup>6</sup> substances.

7 D. 1. An Advanced Practice Registered Nurse who is recognized 8 to prescribe by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing as a Certified Nurse 9 Practitioner who chooses to practice under the supervision of a 10 physician or who is undergoing a mentorship as provided by Section 5 11 of this act and therefore is subject to medical direction by a 12 supervising physician pursuant to Section 567.3a of Title 59 of the 13 Oklahoma Statutes, and has complied with the registration 14 requirements of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act, in 15 good faith and in the course of professional practice only, may 16 prescribe and administer Schedule III, IV and V controlled dangerous 17 substances. 18 2. An Advanced Practice Registered Nurse who is recognized to 19 prescribe by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing as a Certified Nurse 20 Practitioner and has obtained independent prescriptive authority as 21 provided by Section 5 of this act, and has complied with the 22 registration requirements of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous 23 Substances Act, in good faith and in the course of professional 24 practice only, may prescribe and administer Schedule III, IV and V \_ \_

An advanced practice nurse Advanced Practice Registered 6 Nurse who is recognized to order, select, obtain and administer 7 drugs by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing as a certified registered 8 nurse anesthetist Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist pursuant to 9 Section 353.1b of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes and who has 10 complied with the registration requirements of the Uniform 11 Controlled Dangerous Substances Act, in good faith and in the course 12 of such practitioner's professional practice only, may order, 13 select, obtain and administer Schedules II through, III, IV and V 14 controlled dangerous substances in a preanesthetic preparation or 15 evaluation; anesthesia induction, maintenance or emergence; or 16 postanesthesia care setting only. A certified registered nurse 17 anesthetist Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist may order, 18 select, obtain and administer such drugs only during the 19 perioperative or periobstetrical period.

E. F. A physician assistant who is recognized to prescribe by the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision under the medical direction of a supervising physician, pursuant to subsection D of Section 519.6 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and who has complied with the registration requirements of the Uniform
