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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-227.9, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 1-227.9. A. There is hereby created within the
16	Oklahoma Commission on Children and Youth the Child Abuse Training
17	and Coordination Council.
18	B. The Oklahoma Commission on Children and Youth shall appoint
19	a Child Abuse Training and Coordination Council which shall be
20	composed of twenty-two (22) members, as follows:
21	1. One member shall be a representative of child welfare
22	services within the Department of Human Services;
23	2. One member shall be a representative of juvenile services
24	within the Office of Juvenile Affairs;

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1 3. One member shall be a representative of maternal and child health services within the State Department of Health; 2 3 4. One member shall be a representative of the State Department of Health; 4 5 5. One member shall be a representative of the State Department of Education; 6 7 6. One member shall be a representative of the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services; 8 9 7. One member shall be a representative of a statewide medical 10 association and shall be a member of a state chapter of a national academy of pediatrics; 11 12 8. One member shall be a representative of the judiciary; 9. One member shall be a representative of a statewide 13 association of osteopathic physicians and shall be a pediatric 14 15 osteopathic physician; 10. One member shall be a representative of a statewide 16 coalition on domestic violence and sexual assault; 17 One member shall be a representative of the District 18 11. Attorneys Council; 19 12. One member shall be a representative of the Council on Law 20 Enforcement Education and Training; 21 13. One member shall be a representative of the Department of 22 Corrections; 23 24

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1 14. One member shall be a representative of Court Appointed 2 Special Advocates; 3 One member shall be a representative of the Oklahoma Bar 15. Association; 4 5 16. One member shall be a representative of a statewide association of psychologists; 6 One member shall be a representative of a local chapter of 7 17. a national association of social workers; 8 9 18. One member shall be a representative of a statewide 10 association of youth services agencies; 19. 11 One member shall be a representative of an Indian child 12 welfare association; 13 20. One member shall be a representative of an advisory task force on child abuse and neglect; 14 21. One member shall be a representative of a postadjudication 15 review board program; and 16 One member shall be a representative of nationally 17 22. accredited child advocacy centers nominated to the Oklahoma 18 Commission for Children and Youth Commission. Eligible nominees may 19 be anyone selected by a majority of the members of the nationally 20 accredited child advocacy centers located in Oklahoma. 21 C. Each member of the Child Abuse Training and Coordination 22 Council is authorized to have one designee. 23 24

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D. The appointed members shall be persons having expertise in the dynamics, identification and treatment of child abuse and neglect and child sexual abuse.

E. The Child Abuse Training and Coordination Council shall:
1. Establish objective criteria and guidelines for
multidisciplinary and, as appropriate for each discipline,
discipline-specific training on child abuse and neglect for
professionals with responsibilities affecting children, youth and
families;

Review curricula and make recommendations to state agencies
 and professional organizations and associations regarding available
 curricula and curricula having high standards of professional merit;

Review curricula regarding child abuse and neglect used in
 law enforcement officer training by the Oklahoma Council on Law
 Enforcement Education and Training (CLEET) and make recommendations
 regarding the curricula to CLEET;

Cooperate with and assist professional organizations and
 associations in the development and implementation of ongoing
 training programs and strategies to encourage professionals to
 participate in such training programs;

5. Make reports and recommendations regarding the continued development and improvement of such training programs to the State Commissioner of Health, the Oklahoma Commission on Children and Youth, and each affected agency, organization and association;

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1	6. Prepare and issue a model protocol for multidisciplinary
2	teams regarding the investigation and prosecution of child sexual
З	abuse, child physical abuse and neglect cases;
4	7. Review and approve protocols prepared by the local
5	multidisciplinary teams;
6	8. Advise multidisciplinary teams on team development;
7	9. Collect data on the operation and cases reviewed by the
8	multidisciplinary teams;
9	10. Issue annual reports; and
10	11. Annually approve the list of functioning multidisciplinary
11	teams in the state.
12	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
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
