AMENDATORY 12 amended to read as follows: 13 Section 11-705.1. A. The driver of a vehicle meeting or 14 overtaking a church bus or bus owned and operated by a nonprofit 15 charitable organization that is stopped to take on or discharge 16 passengers, and on which the red loading signals are in operation, 17 is to stop the vehicle before it reaches the <del>church</del> bus and not 18 proceed until the loading signals are deactivated and then proceed 19 past such bus at a speed which is reasonable and with due caution 20 for the safety of such occupants. 21 Β. If the church bus or bus owned and operated by a nonprofit 22 charitable organization is equipped with visual signals meeting the 23 requirements of Section 12-228 of this title, the signals shall be 24 actuated by the driver of said church the bus whenever, but only ENGR. whenever, such vehicle is stopped on the highway for the purpose of
 receiving or discharging passengers.

C. The driver of a vehicle upon a highway with separate roadways need not stop upon meeting or passing a church bus <u>or bus</u> <u>owned and operated by a non-profit charitable organization</u> which is on a different roadway or when upon a controlled-access highway and the <del>church</del> bus is stopped in a loading zone which is a part of or adjacent to such highway and where pedestrians are not permitted to cross the roadway.

10SECTION 2.AMENDATORY47 O.S. 2011, Section 12-228, is11amended to read as follows:

12 Section 12-228. A. In addition to any other equipment and distinctive markings required by this title, every school bus and 13 every church bus shall be equipped with signal lamps mounted as high 14 and as widely spaced laterally as practicable, which shall display 15 to the front two alternately flashing red lights located at the same 16 level and to the rear two alternately flashing red lights located at 17 the same level. These lights shall be visible at five hundred (500) 18 feet in normal sunlight. 19

B. Every school bus shall bear upon the front and rear thereof plainly visible signs containing the words "SCHOOL BUS" in letters not less than eight (8) inches in height, located between the warning signal lights as high as possible without impairing visibility of the lettering, and have no other lettering on the

front or rear of the vehicle, except as required by 47 C.F.R., Part
 571.

C. Every church bus shall bear upon the front and rear thereof plainly visible signs containing the words "CHURCH BUS" in letters not less than eight (8) inches in height, located between the warning signal lights as high as possible without impairing visibility of the lettering. In addition, such church bus may be equipped with visual signals meeting the requirements of subsection A of this section.

D. Every school bus manufactured on or after September 1, 1992, shall be equipped with a stop signal arm that complies with 49 C.F.R., Section 571.131.

In addition to the lights required by subsection A of this 13 Ε. section, any school bus shall be equipped with amber signal lamps 14 mounted near each of the four red lamps and at the same level but 15 closer to the vertical center line of the bus, which shall display 16 two alternately flashing amber lights to the front and two 17 alternately flashing amber lights to the rear. These lights shall 18 be visible at five hundred (500) feet in normal sunlight. These 19 lights shall be displayed by the school bus driver at least one 20 hundred (100) feet, but not more than five hundred (500) feet, 21 before every stop at which the alternately flashing red lights 22 required by subsection A will be actuated. 23

1 F. The State Board of Education, with the approval of the Commissioner of Public Safety, is authorized to adopt standards and 2 specifications applicable to lighting equipment on and special 3 warning devices to be carried by school buses consistent with, and 4 5 supplemental to, the provisions of this chapter. Such standards and specifications shall be identical to any Federal Motor Vehicle 6 Safety Standard which regulates the same aspect of performance of 7 the same equipment or device. Where there is no applicable Federal 8 9 Motor Vehicle Safety Standard, the standards and specifications 10 shall conform to the greatest extent feasible with any other relevant standard issued or endorsed by federal agencies or 11 12 recognized standard-setting organizations.

G. During the time any school bus or church bus is operating,the school bus or church bus shall have its headlights activated.

H. It shall be unlawful to operate any red flashing warning
signal light on any school bus except when any said such school bus
is stopped on a highway for the purpose of permitting school
children to board or discharge from said the school bus.

I. It shall be unlawful to operate any red flashing warning
 signal light on any church bus except when any said such bus is
 stopped on a highway for the purpose of permitting passengers to
 board or discharge from said the bus.

J. The use of the signal equipment described herein shall impose upon drivers of other vehicles the obligation to yield right-

1	of-way and stop for school buses, as prescribed in Section 11-705 of
2	this title, and for church buses or buses used by nonprofit
3	charitable organizations for the purpose of transporting children,
4	as prescribed in Section 11-705.1 of this title.
5	K. The loading lamps on school buses converted for purposes
6	other than transporting pupils to or from school shall be
7	disconnected, except for buses purchased for use by religious
8	organizations as church buses or buses used by nonprofit charitable
9	organizations for the purpose of transporting children.
10	SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
