10	An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Sections 2602, 2603, as amended by Section 24,
11	Chapter 11, O.S.L. 2012, 2604 and 2605, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 63, O.S.L. 2015 (70
12	O.S. Supp. 2016, Sections 2603 and 2605), which relate to the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Act;
13	updating reference to postsecondary vocational- technical program; specifying program to meet
14	eligibility requirements for federal student aid; modifying eligibility for enrolled students;
15	directing the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education to establish maximum limit on courses;
16	deleting award for cooperative programs; prohibiting award for remedial noncredit-earning courses after
17	specified date; modifying income qualification eligibility for certain students; requiring income
18	qualification to be verified beginning in specified academic year; updating references; providing an
19	effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
23	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 2602, is
24	amended to read as follows:

1 Section 2602. There is hereby created the Oklahoma Higher 2 Learning Access Program. The program shall also be known as "Oklahoma's Promise". The purpose of the program is to provide an 3 4 award to students who meet the criteria set forth in the Oklahoma 5 Higher Learning Access Act, Section 2601 et seq. of this title, and who are pursuing studies in this state leading to an associate or 6 7 baccalaureate degree or who are pursuing studies in a postsecondary vocational-technical career technology program or course that would 8 9 meet the requirements to be eligible for federal student financial 10 aid and is offered pursuant to a duly approved cooperative agreement 11 between by a technology center school and an institution of The 12 Oklahoma State System of Higher Education supervised by the State 13 Board of Career and Technology Education, and who are in good 14 academic standing in the institution of higher education or 15 technology center school in which the student is enrolled, to that 16 will relieve them the student of the burden of paying nonguaranteed 17 resident tuition at institutions of The Oklahoma State System of 18 Higher Education, to relieve them of the burden of paying tuition 19 for enrollment in postsecondary programs of the technology center 20 districts, or to relieve them of some portion of the burden of 21 paying some portion of such fees or tuition, pursuant to the 22 provisions of this act the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Act, as 23 may be required of enrollees at private institutions of higher 24 education which are accredited pursuant to Section 4103 of this

1 title. The further purpose of this program is to establish and 2 maintain a variety of support services whereby a broader range of 3 the general student population of this state will be prepared for 4 success in postsecondary endeavors.

5 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 2603, as 6 amended by Section 24, Chapter 11, O.S.L. 2012 (70 O.S. Supp. 2016, 7 Section 2603), is amended to read as follows:

8 Section 2603. A. Except as otherwise provided for in 9 subsection B of this section and elsewhere in this section, to be 10 eligible to participate in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access 11 Program and to qualify for an award which includes payment of an 12 amount equivalent to resident tuition or other tuition pursuant to 13 Section 2604 of this title for the first semester or other academic 14 unit of postsecondary enrollment, a student shall:

15 1. Be a resident of this state or be enrolled in a school 16 district located in this state that serves students who reside in 17 both this state and an adjacent state pursuant to a contract as 18 authorized in Section 5-117.1 of this title;

19 2. Be a United States citizen or lawfully present in the United 20 States. A student who is not a United States citizen or lawfully 21 present in the United States shall not be eligible to participate in 22 the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program and to qualify for an 23 award notwithstanding the provisions of Section 3242 of this title. 24 The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to any student who

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1 was enrolled in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program prior to 2 the end of the 2006-2007 school year;

3 3. Have a record of satisfactory compliance with agreements
4 executed pursuant to Section 2605 of this title;

4. a. have graduated within the previous three (3) years
from a high school accredited by the State Board of
Education, or the Oklahoma School of Science and
Mathematics with a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point
average on a 4.0 scale for all work attempted in
grades nine through twelve,

11 have graduated within the previous three (3) years b. 12 from a high school not accredited by the State Board 13 of Education with a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point 14 average on a 4.0 scale for all work attempted in 15 grades nine through twelve and have achieved a 16 composite score of 22 or higher on the ACT test, or 17 have satisfactorily completed within the previous с. 18 three (3) years an educational program that was 19 provided through a means other than a public or 20 private school and have achieved a composite score of 21 22 or higher on the ACT test;

5. Have completed the curricular requirements for admission to an institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education and one additional unit or set of competencies in a course that

1 meets college admission requirements. The curriculum requirements shall include two units or sets of competencies in foreign or non-2 3 English language or technology courses that meet the college 4 admission requirements and one unit or set of competencies of a fine 5 arts course. Students shall also have attained a 2.5 grade point average in the core curriculum courses. Students who attended a 6 7 high school which did not offer all the core curriculum courses or students who were educated by other means and were not offered all 8 9 the core curriculum courses shall be allowed to satisfy this 10 curriculum requirement by participating in a program approved by the 11 State Regents for remediation of high school curricular 12 deficiencies;

13 6. Have satisfied admission standards as determined by the 14 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education for first-time-entering 15 students for the appropriate type of institution, or, if attending a 16 private institution, have satisfied admission standards as 17 determined by the private institution. No student participating in 18 the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program shall be admitted into 19 an institution of higher education by special admission standards; 20 7. Have secured admission to, and enrolled in, an institution 21 which is a member of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, 22 a postsecondary vocational-technical program offered pursuant to a 23 duly approved cooperative agreement between by a technology center 24 school and an institution of The Oklahoma State System of Higher

Education that meets the requirements to be eligible for federal student financial aid, or a private institution of higher learning located within this state and accredited pursuant to Section 4103 of this title; and

- 8. a. have established financial need according to the
  provisions of subsection D of Section 2605 of this
  title and standards and provisions promulgated by the
  Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education,
- 9 b. if the student was adopted between birth and twelve 10 (12) years of age while in the permanent custody of 11 the Department of Human Services, in the court-ordered 12 custody of a licensed private nonprofit child-placing 13 agency, or federally recognized Indian tribe, as 14 defined by the federal Indian Child Welfare Act, have 15 established financial need according to the provisions 16 of paragraph 1 of subsection E of Section 2605 of this 17 title and standards and provisions promulgated by the 18 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, or 19 if the student was adopted between thirteen (13) and с. 20 seventeen (17) years of age while in the permanent 21 custody of the Department of Human Services, in the 22 court-ordered custody of a licensed private nonprofit 23 child-placing agency, or federally recognized Indian

tribe, as defined by the federal Indian Child Welfare

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Act, have established financial need according to the provisions of paragraph 2 of subsection E of Section 2605 of this title and standards and provisions promulgated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education.

B. 1. A student shall be eligible to participate in the
Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program and to qualify for an award
which includes payment of an amount equivalent to resident tuition
or other tuition pursuant to Section 2604 of this title for the
first semester or other academic unit of postsecondary enrollment if
the student meets all of the following criteria:

12 a. is a child of any person killed after January 1, 2000, 13 in the line of duty in any branch of the United States 14 Armed Forces or who died after January 1, 2000, as a 15 result of an injury sustained while in the line of 16 duty in any branch of the United States Armed Forces 17 and the person who was killed or died filed an 18 individual or joint Oklahoma income tax return for the 19 tax year prior to the year during which the person was 20 killed or died,

b. is a resident of this state or is enrolled in a school
district located in this state that serves students
who reside in both this state and an adjacent state

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pursuant to a contract as authorized in Section 5-117.1 of this title,

- c. enrolls in an institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education prior to reaching the age of twenty-one (21),
- d. has satisfied admission standards as determined by the 6 7 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education for firsttime-entering students for the appropriate type of 8 9 institution, or, if attending a private institution, 10 has satisfied admission standards as determined by the 11 private institution. No student participating in the 12 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program shall be 13 admitted into an institution of higher education by 14 special admission standards,
- 15 has secured admission to, and enrolled in, an e. 16 institution which is a member of The Oklahoma State 17 System of Higher Education, a postsecondary 18 vocational-technical program offered pursuant to a 19 duly approved cooperative agreement between by a 20 technology center school and an institution of The 21 Oklahoma State System of Higher Education that meets 22 the requirements to be eligible for federal student 23 financial aid, or a private institution of higher
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1 learning located within this state and accredited 2 pursuant to Section 4103 of this title, and f. 3 executes an agreement pursuant to subsection C of Section 2605 of this title. 4 5 2. A student who is eligible to participate in the program pursuant to this subsection shall not be required to meet the 6 7 eligibility requirements set forth in subsection A of this section. 8 C. To retain eligibility while pursuing the program of higher 9 learning in which enrolled, the student shall: 10 1. Achieve a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 on a 11 4.0 scale or its equivalent for courses taken through the student's 12 sophomore year and achieve a minimum grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale or its equivalent for courses taken during the student's 13 14 junior year and thereafter. The provisions of this paragraph shall 15 not apply to any student who has received an Oklahoma Higher 16 Learning Access Program benefit award prior to the 2012-2013 school 17 year Meet the requirements for retention and degree completion as 18 established by the institution in which the student is enrolled; 19 2. Maintain good academic standing and satisfactory academic 20 progress according to standards of the Oklahoma State Regents for 21 Higher Education; 22 3. Maintain satisfactory academic progress as required for

23 eligibility for federal Title IV student financial aid programs.

The provisions of this paragraph shall become effective for the
 2012-2013 school year;

3 4. Comply with the standards related to maintenance of
4 eligibility as promulgated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
5 Education; and

5. Refrain from conduct that leads to expulsion or suspension
of more than one semester from an institution of higher education.
A student who violates the provisions of this paragraph shall
permanently lose eligibility for program benefits. The provisions
of this paragraph shall become effective January 1, 2008.

D. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and the State Board of Career and Technology Education shall promulgate rules relating to maintenance of eligibility under the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Act by a student.

E. It is the intent of the Legislature that students in the ninth grade for the 1992-93 school year who are determined to be eligible Oklahoma Higher Learning Access students pursuant to the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Act shall be the first students eligible for benefits from the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust Fund.

F. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education are authorized to study, develop and propose criteria for determining award eligibility based upon the completion of seven (7) semesters of high school coursework by a student.

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1SECTION 3.AMENDATORY70 O.S. 2011, Section 2604, is2amended to read as follows:

Section 2604. A. Subject to the availability of funds, an
amount equivalent to the nonguaranteed resident tuition for which an
eligible Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program student is
obligated at an institution of The Oklahoma State System of Higher
Education shall be awarded by allocation from the Oklahoma Higher
Learning Access Trust Fund.

9 в. Subject to the availability of funds, for each eligible 10 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program student enrolled at a 11 private institution of higher learning located within this state and 12 accredited pursuant to Section 4103 of this title, the Oklahoma 13 State Regents for Higher Education shall award from the Oklahoma 14 Higher Learning Access Trust Fund an amount equivalent to the amount 15 of resident tuition for which the student would be eligible if the 16 student were enrolled in a comparable program at a comparable 17 institution of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education. 18 Comparability shall be determined by the State Regents.

19 C. Subject to the availability of funds, an amount equivalent 20 to the tuition for any eligible Oklahoma Higher Learning Access 21 Program student enrolled in a public postsecondary vocational-22 technical program or course for the purpose set forth in Section 23 2602 of this title shall be awarded by allocation from the Oklahoma 24 Higher Learning Access Trust Fund. Provided, such allocation shall

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not exceed the amount a student would have received for comparable
 enrollment at a two-year institution within The Oklahoma State
 System of Higher Education.

An award allowed by this section shall not be allowed 4 D. 1. 5 for courses or other postsecondary units taken in excess of the requirements for completion of a baccalaureate program or taken more 6 7 than five (5) years after the student's first semester of postsecondary enrollment. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 8 9 Education may award the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program 10 benefits for courses of postsecondary units taken more than five (5) 11 years after the student's first semester of postsecondary enrollment 12 only in hardship circumstances; provided, however, no Oklahoma 13 Higher Learning Access Program participant may receive benefits 14 beyond a cumulative time period of five (5) years.

15 The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may award 2. 16 the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefits for a student's 17 first semester or other academic unit of postsecondary enrollment 18 taken more than three (3) years after the student graduates from 19 high school or completes an educational program equivalent to high 20 school graduation as authorized in subsection A of Section 2603 of 21 this title or after the student turns twenty-one (21) years of age 22 as authorized in subsection B of Section 2603 of this title if the 23 student is a member of the Armed Forces of the United States, the 24 Reserve Corps of the Armed Forces of the United States, or the

Oklahoma National Guard, and is ordered to active duty or active
 duty for special work or training and due to the duty commitment the
 student is unable to enroll prior to the end of the three-year
 period or before the student reaches twenty-one (21) years of age.
 The period shall be extended by the length of the term of duty.

3. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may shall
establish a maximum limit on the number of courses or other
postsecondary units to which Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program
benefits will apply.

10 4. An award for eligible Oklahoma Higher Learning Access 11 Program students enrolled in cooperative programs pursuant to 12 agreements between technology center schools and institutions of The 13 Oklahoma State System of Higher Education shall be satisfied for 14 both vocational-technical and college work in which enrolled 15 pursuant to such cooperative program.

16 Benefits awarded under the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Е. 17 Program shall be awarded to all eligible applicants without any 18 limitation on the number of awards in any year other than the amount 19 of funds available for the program and the number of eligible 20 applicants. Subject to the provisions of subsection F of this 21 section, if funds are not sufficient to provide awards for all 22 eligible applicants, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education 23 shall make awards on the basis of need. Provided, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall take into consideration 24

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1 other grants and scholarships received by an eligible applicant when
2 making awards.

3 F. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may, at the 4 time an award is made on behalf of an Oklahoma Higher Learning 5 Access Program student, set aside in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust Fund funds for the full commitment made to such Higher 6 7 Learning Access Program student. For all academic years, students who have previously received awards under the provisions of the 8 9 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Act, Section 2601 et seq. of this 10 title, and who have continued at all times to fulfill the 11 requirements for eligibility to receive awards provided pursuant to 12 this program shall be given an absolute priority for continued 13 financial support by the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program 14 superior to any students who are applying for such benefits for the 15 first time.

16 <u>G. Beginning with the 2018-2019 academic year, an award allowed</u> 17 <u>by this section shall not include an amount for payment of remedial</u> 18 <u>noncredit-earning courses taken by an eligible Oklahoma Higher</u> 19 Learning Access Program student.

20SECTION 4.AMENDATORY70 O.S. 2011, Section 2605, as21last amended by Section 1, Chapter 63, O.S.L. 2015 (70 O.S. Supp.)222016, Section 2605), is amended to read as follows:

23 Section 2605. A. Each school year, every fifth- through ninth-24 grade student in the public and private schools of this state and

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1 students who are educated by other means and are in the equivalent 2 of the fifth through ninth grade shall be apprised, together with 3 the parent, custodial parent, or quardian of the student, of the 4 opportunity for access to higher learning under the Oklahoma Higher 5 Learning Access Program. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and the State Board of Education shall develop, promote, 6 7 and coordinate a public awareness program to be utilized in making students and parents aware of the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access 8 9 Program.

10 Β. On a form provided by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 11 Education, every public school district shall designate at least one 12 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program contact person, who shall be 13 a counselor or teacher, at each public school site in this state in 14 which eighth-, ninth- or tenth-grade classes are taught. When 15 requested by the State Regents, the State Board of Education shall 16 assist the State Regents to ensure the designation of contact 17 persons. Private schools shall also designate at least one school 18 official as a contact person. For students who are educated by 19 other means, a parent or guardian or other person approved by the 20 State Regents shall be designated the contact person.

C. 1. Students who qualify on the basis of financial need according to subsection D or E of this section or who meet the eligibility qualification set forth in subparagraph a of paragraph 1 of subsection B of Section 2603 of this title prior to entering the 1 tenth grade or prior to reaching the age of fifteen (15) and the 2 standards and provisions promulgated by the Oklahoma State Regents 3 for Higher Education shall be given the opportunity throughout the 4 eighth-, ninth-, and tenth-grade years, for students enrolled in a 5 public or private school, or between the ages of thirteen (13) and fifteen (15), for students who are educated by other means, to enter 6 7 into participation in the program by agreeing to, throughout the remainder of their school years or educational program: 8

9 a. attend school or an educational program regularly and
10 do homework regularly,

11 b. refrain from substance abuse,

12 c. refrain from commission of crimes or delinquent acts,
13 d. have school work and school records reviewed by

mentors designated pursuant to the program,

- e. provide information requested by the Oklahoma State
   Regents for Higher Education or the State Board of
   Education, and
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f. participate in program activities.

19 2. Students who meet the eligibility qualification set forth in 20 subparagraph a of paragraph 1 of subsection B of Section 2603 of 21 this title after completing the tenth grade or after reaching the 22 age of sixteen (16) shall be given the opportunity prior to reaching 23 the age of twenty-one (21) to enter into participation in the

program and shall execute an agreement with provisions as determined
 by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education.

3 3. The contact person shall maintain the agreements, which 4 shall be executed on forms provided by the Oklahoma State Regents 5 for Higher Education and managed according to regulations promulgated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, and 6 7 the contact person shall monitor compliance of the student with the 8 terms of the agreement. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 9 Education are authorized to process student agreements and verify 10 compliance with the agreements. Students failing to comply with the 11 terms of the agreement shall not be eligible for the awards provided 12 in Section 2604 of this title.

D. Except as otherwise provided for in subsection E of this section and except for students who qualify pursuant to subsection B of Section 2603 of this title, a student shall not be found to be in financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program if:

18 1. At the time the student applies for participation in the 19 Program during the eighth, ninth or tenth grade for students 20 enrolled in a public or private school, or between the ages of 21 thirteen (13) and fifteen (15), for students who are educated by 22 other means, the income from taxable and nontaxable sources of the 23 student's parent(s) exceeds Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per 24 year; and

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1	2. Beginning with eighth-, ninth- or tenth-grade students who
2	are enrolled in a public or private school or students between the
3	ages of thirteen (13) and fifteen (15) who are educated by other
4	means who apply for participation in the Program in the 2017-2018
5	school year, the federal adjusted gross income of the student's
6	parent(s) exceeds Fifty-five Thousand Dollars (\$55,000.00) per year;
7	3. Beginning with eighth-, ninth- or tenth-grade students who
8	are enrolled in a public or private school or students between the
9	ages of thirteen (13) and fifteen (15) who are educated by other
10	means who apply for participation in the Program in the 2021-2022
11	school year, the federal adjusted gross income of the student's
12	parent(s) exceeds Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00) per year;
13	4. At the time the student begins postsecondary education and
14	prior to receiving any Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program
15	benefit award, the federal adjusted gross income of the student's
16	parent(s) exceeds One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) per
17	year <u>; and</u>
18	5. Beginning with the 2018-2019 academic year, prior to
19	receiving any Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award
20	for any year during which the student is enrolled in an institution
21	which is a member of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education,
22	a postsecondary vocational-technical program offered by a technology
23	center school that meets the requirements to be eligible for federal
24	student financial aid or a private institution of higher learning

1	located within this state and accredited pursuant to Section 4103 of
2	this title, the federal adjusted gross income of the student's
3	parent(s) exceeds One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) per
4	<u>year</u> .
5	The determination of financial qualification as set forth in
6	this paragraph paragraphs 4 and 5 of this subsection shall be based
7	on the income of the student, not the income of the parent(s), if a
8	student:
9	a. is determined to be independent of the student's
10	parents for federal financial aid purposes,
11	b. was in the permanent custody of the Department of
12	Human Services at the time the student enrolled in the
13	program, or
14	c. was in the court-ordered custody of a federally
15	recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the federal
16	Indian Child Welfare Act, at the time the student
17	enrolled in the program.
18	The provisions of this paragraph shall <del>not</del> apply to any student
19	who has received an Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit
20	award <del>prior to</del> <u>after</u> the <del>2012-2013</del> <u>2017-2018</u> school year;
21	$\frac{3.6}{1.00}$ The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall
22	review the determination of financial qualification as set forth in
23	paragraph paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of this subsection if the income
24	from taxable and nontaxable sources of the student's parent(s)

1 includes income received from nontaxable military benefits or income received from the federal Social Security Administration due to the 2 3 death or disability of the student's parent(s). A student who was adopted between birth and twelve (12) 13 years of age while in the permanent custody of the Department of 14 Human Services, in the court-ordered custody of a licensed private 15 nonprofit child-placing agency, or federally recognized Indian 16 tribe, as defined by the federal Indian Child Welfare Act, shall not 17 be found to be in financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma Higher 18 Learning Access Program if at the time the student begins 19 postsecondary education and prior to receiving any Oklahoma Higher 20 Learning Access Program benefit award, the federal adjusted gross 21 income of the student's parent(s) exceeds One Hundred Fifty Thousand 22 Dollars (\$150,000.00) per year. The provisions of this paragraph 23 shall not apply to any student who has received an Oklahoma Higher

Learning Access Program benefit award prior to the 2012-2013 school
 year.

3 2. A student who was adopted between thirteen (13) and 4 seventeen (17) years of age while in the permanent custody of the 5 Department of Human Services, in the court-ordered custody of a licensed private nonprofit child-placing agency, or federally 6 7 recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the federal Indian Child Welfare Act, shall not be found to be in financial need for purposes 8 9 of the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program if at the time the 10 student begins postsecondary education and prior to receiving any 11 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award, the federal 12 adjusted gross income of the student's parent(s) exceeds Two Hundred 13 Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) per year. The provisions of this 14 paragraph shall not apply to any student who has received an 15 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award prior to the 16 2012-2013 school year.

17 3. Except for students who qualify pursuant to subsection B of 18 Section 2603 of this title, the determination of financial 19 qualification as set forth in this subsection shall be based on the 20 income of the student, not the income of the parent(s), if the 21 student is determined to be independent of the student's parents for 22 federal financial aid purposes. A determination of financial 23 qualification shall not be required for the student who meets the 24 criteria set forth in this subsection at the time the student

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applies for participation in the program. The provisions of this
 paragraph shall not apply to any student who has received an
 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award prior to the
 2008-2009 school year.

5 F. The financial qualification of a student as set forth in 6 subsections D and E of this section shall be certified by the 7 contact person or by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education 8 on the agreement form provided by the Oklahoma State Regents for 9 Higher Education. The form shall be retained in the permanent 10 record of the student and a copy forwarded to the Oklahoma State 11 Regents for Higher Education.

12 G. Agreements shall be witnessed by the parent, custodial13 parent, or guardian of the student, who shall further agree to:

14 1. Assist the student in achieving compliance with the 15 agreements;

16 2. Confer, when requested to do so, with the school contact 17 person, other school personnel, and program mentors;

Provide information requested by the Oklahoma State Regents
 for Higher Education or the State Board of Education; and

4. Assist the student in completing forms and reports required
for program participation, making applications to institutions and
schools of higher learning, and filing applications for student
grants and scholarships.

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1 н. Students who are enrolled in a school district located in 2 this state that serves students who reside in both this state and an 3 adjacent state pursuant to a contract as authorized in Section 5-4 117.1 of this title, are in the eleventh and twelfth grades during 5 the 2006-2007 school year, and who were denied participation in the program shall be allowed to enter or reenter into participation in 6 7 the program by entering into agreements as set forth in subsections C and D of this section by June 1, 2008. 8

9 I. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall
10 promulgate rules for the determination of student compliance with
11 agreements made pursuant to this section.

J. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall designate personnel to coordinate tracking of program records for the years when students participating in the program are still in the schools or are being educated by other means, provide staff development for contact persons in the schools, and provide liaison with the State Board of Education and local organizations and individuals participating in the program.

19 K. The school district where an Oklahoma Higher Learning Access 20 Program student is enrolled when the student begins participation in 21 the program and any subsequent school district where the student 22 enrolls shall forward information regarding participation by the 23 student in the program to a school to which the student transfers 24 upon the request of the school for the records of the student.

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1	L. Students participating in the Oklahoma Higher Learning
2	Access Program shall provide their social security number or their
3	student identification number used by their school to the Oklahoma
4	State Regents for Higher Education. The Regents shall keep the
5	numbers confidential and use them only for administrative purposes.
6	SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017.
7	SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
8	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
9	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
10	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
