7	An Act relating to investigations of child care facilities; providing definitions; requiring
8	Department of Human Services to solicit certain information when receiving complaints regarding
9	certain facilities; requiring Department to inform persons reporting complaints of certain procedures;
10	requiring Department to refer certain information to certain entities under certain circumstances;
11	permitting Department to forego investigations under certain circumstances; permitting certain persons to
12	protect certain information; prohibiting disclosure of certain information until after completion of
13	investigations; permitting certain information to be confidential indefinitely; providing for
14	codification; and providing an effective date.
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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 404.1a of Title 10, unless there
20	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
21	A. For the purposes of this act:
22	1. "Anonymous complaint" means a complaint received by the
23	Department of Human Services made by a person who refuses to
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1 identify himself or herself to the Department by using the person's
2 full name;

3 2. "Confidential complaint" means a complaint made to the
4 Department by a person providing the minimum information necessary
5 including, but not limited to, the person's full name; and

3. "Subject of the complaint" means a child care facility
7 licensed pursuant to the provisions of Sections 401 et seq. of Title
8 10 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

9 B. When receiving a complaint regarding a child care facility 10 licensed in this state, the Department of Human Services shall, at a 11 minimum:

12 1. Solicit information from the person reporting the complaint 13 to determine whether the suggested actions or conditions that could 14 pose a serious risk to the safety and well-being of children in the 15 facility;

16 2. Encourage the person reporting the complaint to disclose the 17 minimum information necessary to establish the person's identity so 18 the Department may subsequently communicate with the person 19 reporting the compliant;

Inform the person reporting the complaint that the
 Department may not investigate an anonymous complaint;

4. Inform the person reporting the complaint that the identity
of a person reporting a complaint may be withheld from the owner or
operator of a facility that is the subject of the complaint;

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5. Inform the person reporting the complaint that the
 Department may be limited in its use of the information provided by
 the person reporting the complaint; and

6. Inform the person reporting the complaint that a submission
of false information contained in a reported complaint may be a
violation of state law.

7 C. In the event a person reporting a complaint elects to do so 8 anonymously, or if the complaint is made regarding events occurring 9 more than six (6) weeks before the person reporting the complaint 10 contacts the Department, the Department:

Shall refer the information contained in the complaint to
 the appropriate personnel within the Department, law enforcement or
 any other appropriate agency if the complaint suggests actions or
 conditions which could pose a serious risk to the safety or well being of a child;

May not investigate or substantiate the complaint; and
 May, during a regularly scheduled annual investigation,
 inform the licensee, owner or operator of a child care facility who
 is the subject of the complaint of allegations or concerns
 communicated during an anonymous complaint.

D. In the event a person reporting a complaint elects to report a confidential complaint, the Department shall permit the person reporting the confidential complaint to elect if the complaint shall remain confidential only until the investigation of the complaint

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has been completed or if such complaint shall be confidential
 indefinitely.

3 In the event of a confidential complaint in which the person Ε. 4 reporting the complaint elects to remain confidential until the 5 completion of an investigation of the complaint, the Department shall only disclose the name of the person reporting the complaint 6 7 to the subject of the complaint at the completion of the investigation. If the person reporting the confidential complaint 8 9 elects to remain confidential indefinitely, the Department shall not 10 disclose the name of the person reporting the complaint to the subject of the complaint and may not use information provided by the 11 person reporting the complaint to substantiate an alleged violation 12 13 of state law or Department rule unless the Department independently 14 corroborates the reported information.
