SENATE BILL 572 By: Bullard

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to school curriculum; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 11-103.6b, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 257, O.S.L. 2018 (70 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 11-103.6b), which relates to social studies curriculum and textbooks; requiring the United States history component of certain curriculum to include certain information about the original intent of the founding fathers; allowing teachers to discuss the role of religion; encouraging teachers to use certain sources and quotes; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 11-103.6b,

as amended by Section 1, Chapter 257, O.S.L. 2018 (70 O.S. Supp.

2018, Section 11-103.6b), is amended to read as follows:

Section 11-103.6b. A. The State Board of Education shall adopt a social studies core curriculum with courses of instruction for all students enrolled in the public schools that reflect the racial, ethnic, religious, and cultural diversity of the United States of America. The United States history and Oklahoma history components required in the social studies curriculum for all students shall

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include, but not be limited to, African Americans, Native Americans,
and Hispanic Americans. The United States history component
required in the social studies curriculum for all students shall
include information:

1. Information about Juneteenth commemorating emancipation of enslaved African Americans; and

- 2. Information regarding the original intent of the founding fathers while constructing the United States Constitution. Teachers of United States history may discuss the role of religion, including but not limited to Christianity and the Bible, while discussing the foundational documents and principles of the United States if presented objectively as part of a secular program of education.

 Teachers shall be encouraged to use primary sources and direct quotes from the founding fathers, including but not limited to the writings of Noah Webster, Joseph Story and John Adams.
- B. The State Textbook Committee, when adopting textbooks, shall incorporate the provisions of subsection A of this section into the criteria used to evaluate United States history and Oklahoma history textbooks. Any United States history or Oklahoma history textbook on the state adopted textbook list shall conform to the purposes of this section. The State Textbook Committee shall ensure that all social studies textbooks and supplementary materials selected to be purchased with state funds for use in Oklahoma classrooms reflect

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the racial, ethnic, religious, and cultural diversity of the United States.

- C. It is the intent of the Legislature that a portion of the state funds appropriated for professional development in local school districts be used for workshops, seminars, guest lecturers, and other methods which further the purposes of this section.
- D. As used in this section, "curriculum" means the subject matter standards adopted by the State Board of Education pursuant to Section 11-103.6 of this title. School districts shall exclusively determine instruction, specific course curricula, reading lists and instructional materials pursuant to subsection F of Section 11-103.6a of this title.
 - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019.
- SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
