9 An Act relating to cities and towns; creating the
10 Oklahoma Electrical Access and Resiliency Task Force;
11 providing for membership of task force; providing
12 purpose; requiring task force to make recommendations
13 for energy use; requiring submission of report to
14 certain persons by certain date; providing for cease
15 of operations of task force; providing for
16 codification; providing an effective date; and
17 declaring an emergency.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

19 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
20 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 21-223 of Title 11, unless there
21 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

22 A. There is hereby created the Oklahoma Electrical Access and
23 Resiliency (OEAR) Task Force.

24 B. The task force shall consist of thirteen (13) members as
 follows:

 1. The Secretary of Energy, or designee, who shall serve as the
 task force chair;

1 2. Three members appointed by the Governor:

2 a. a representative of an organization representing
3 municipalities,

4 b. a representative of a non-profit public power utility
5 located in this state, and

6 c. a representative of a manager of an electrical grid or
7 power pool;

8 3. A corporation commissioner, or designee;

9 4. Four members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the
10 Senate:

11 a. a representative of an organization representing
12 electrical cooperatives,

13 b. a professional with academic expertise or a minimum of
14 a master's degree in electrical engineering, grid
15 management or a related field, and

16 c. two members of the Oklahoma Senate who are from
17 different political parties and shall serve as ex
18 officio members; and

19 5. Four members appointed by the Speaker of the House of
20 Representatives:

21 a. a representative of a publicly traded electric utility
22 company,

23 b. a member of the public who is not affiliated with the
24 electrical industry, and

1 c. two members of the Oklahoma House of Representatives
2 who are from different political parties and shall
3 serve as ex officio members.

4 C. The task force shall study nationally recognized best
5 practices to provide additional revenues and local control for
6 communities by having a choice in electric energy suppliers and make
7 recommendations regarding:

8 1. The removal of the moratorium on the use of municipal
9 condemnation to acquire electric facilities of an incumbent
10 investor-owned utility as defined in Section 21-222 of Title 11 of
11 the Oklahoma Statutes;

12 2. The authority to give municipal utilities the ability to use
13 the power of eminent domain to allow for community choice of
14 electric energy suppliers;

15 3. The imposition of new growth taxation of two percent (2%)
16 tax on gross sales beginning tax year 2022 on any provider of
17 wholesale sale of electric power to municipal corporations if the
18 providers were not in operation prior to the effective date of this
19 act;

20 4. Strategies to enable community choice of electric energy
21 suppliers, whether legislatively or otherwise; and

22 5. Whether a need exists to provide for ongoing evaluation of
23 the implementation of these rights and, if such a need does exist,
24 the task force shall:

- 1 a. identify the scope and nature of the need, and
2 b. make recommendations on how best to fill that need,
3 whether legislatively or otherwise.

4 D. The task force shall submit a final report of its findings
5 and any recommendations to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore
6 of the Senate and the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of
7 Representatives not later than a year after the effective date of
8 this act.

9 E. The provisions of this section shall cease to have the force
10 and effect of law and the task force shall terminate following the
11 submission of the final report.

12 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2021.

13 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
14 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
15 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
16 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
