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6	An Act relating to Rules of the Ethics Commission;
7	amending Rules 2.100, 2.105, 2.107 and 2.108 of the Rules of the Ethics Commission (74 O.S. Supp. 2016,
, 8	Ch. 62, App. I), which relate to campaign expenditure reporting; requiring persons or other entities making
-	certain expenditures to file quarterly reports;
9	modifying information to be reported; deleting exemption from filing certain reports for
10	individuals; and providing an effective date.
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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Rule 2.100 of the Rules of the
15	Ethics Commission (74 O.S. Supp. 2016, Ch. 62, App. I), is amended
16	to read as follows:
17	Rule 2.100. <u>A.</u> Each state political party committee, political
18	action committee and, candidate committee shall file a quarterly
19	Report of Contributions and Expenditures:
20	(1) no earlier than January 1 nor later than January 31 for the
21	period beginning October 1 and ending December 31 of the immediately
22	preceding year;
23	(2) no earlier than April 1 nor later than April 30 for the
24	period beginning January 1 and ending March 31 of the same year;

1	(3) no earlier than July 1 nor later than July 31 for the
2	period beginning April 1 and ending June 30 of the same year and
3	(4) no earlier than October 1 nor later than October 31 for the
4	period beginning July 1 and ending September 30 of the same year.
5	B. Any person or other entity who:
6	(1) makes independent expenditures or electioneering
7	<pre>communications;</pre>
8	(2) makes expenditures for the purpose of advocating the
9	approval or defeat of a state question; or
10	(3) makes expenditures publishing or otherwise offering
11	educational information regarding a state question;
12	in excess of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) shall file a Report
13	of Contributions and Expenditures as required in subsection A of
14	this section for any quarter for which such expenditures are made.
15	<u>C.</u> Except for good cause shown, any committee that files more
16	than one quarterly Report of Contributions and Expenditures after
17	the date it is due in any calendar year shall be deemed to have
18	intentionally failed to file the report in violation of these Rules.
19	D. Candidates for election or retention to judicial offices who
20	are prohibited from soliciting or accepting contributions more than
21	sixty (60) days after the last election in which the candidate
22	participated under the Code of Judicial Conduct shall not be
23	required to file Reports of Contributions and Expenditures following
24	the expiration of the sixty (60) day period until such time as they

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are permitted to solicit and accept contributions prior to the next
 filing period under the Code of Judicial Conduct.

3 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Rule 2.105 of the Rules of the 4 Ethics Commission (74 O.S. Supp. 2016, Ch. 62, App. I), is amended 5 to read as follows:

Rule 2.105. A Report of Contributions and Expenditures by a
political action committee <u>or other person or other entity</u> shall
include, but not be limited to, the following information:

9 A. (1) the name of the committee, person or other entity and 10 the time period covered by the report;

(2) the total of all monetary contributions accepted during the time period covered by the report, and the aggregate total of all monetary contributions accepted during the calendar year of the time period covered by the report;

(3) the total of all monetary contributions from other political action committees accepted during the time period covered by the report, and the aggregate total of all monetary contributions from other political action committees accepted during the calendar year of the time period covered by the report;

(4) the total of all other funds accepted during the time period covered by the report, including transfers from an associated political action committee, and the aggregate total of all such other funds accepted during the calendar year of the time period covered by the report;

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(5) the total of all monetary contributions or funds accepted
 from any source during the time period covered by the report, and
 the aggregate total of all monetary contributions or funds accepted
 during the calendar year of the time period covered by the report;

5 (6) the total value of all in-kind contributions accepted 6 during the time period covered by the report, and the aggregate 7 total value of all in-kind contributions accepted during the 8 calendar year of the time period covered by the report;

9 (7) the total of all expenditures (other than contributions to 10 candidate committees, independent expenditures or electioneering 11 communications) made during the time period covered by the report, 12 and the aggregate total of all such expenditures made during the 13 calendar year of the time period covered by the report;

14 (8) the total of all refunds made during the time period
15 covered by the report, and the aggregate total of all refunds made
16 during the calendar year of the time period covered by the report;

(9) the total of all transfers made to or received from an associated political action committee during the time period covered by the report and the date of each transfer, and the aggregate total of all such transfers made during the calendar year of the time period covered by the report;

(10) the total amount of all contributions made by the committee to a candidate committee during the time period covered by

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the report, and the aggregate total of all such contributions made
 during the calendar year of the time period covered by the report;

3 (11) the total amount of all independent expenditures made by 4 the committee during the time period covered by the report, and the 5 aggregate total of all such independent expenditures made during the 6 calendar year of the time period covered by the report;

7 (12) the total amount of funds spent on electioneering 8 communications made by the committee during the time period covered 9 by the report, and the aggregate total of funds spent on 10 electioneering communications made during the calendar year of the 11 time period covered by the report;

(13) the beginning balance of the committee account for the reporting period, and the closing balance of the committee account at the end of the reporting period;

(14) for limited committees affiliated with a corporation or 15 labor union, the total amount of funds spent by the corporation or 16 labor union during the time period covered by the report for the 17 costs of establishment of, administration of and solicitation of 18 contributions to the committee; and the aggregate total of funds 19 spent on the costs of establishment of, administration of and 20 solicitation of contributions to the committee made during the 21 calendar year. 22

B. (1) The name, address, occupation and employer of any
person other than a political action committee making a contribution

or contributions exceeding Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) in value in the aggregate, the date and amount of any monetary or in-kind contributions made during the time period covered by the report, and the aggregate total of all contributions accepted from the person during the calendar year of the time period covered by the report;

6 (2) the total of all contributions accepted during the time
7 period covered by the report from contributors making contributions
8 of no more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) in the aggregate, and the
9 aggregate total of all such contributions during the calendar year
10 of the time period covered by the report;

(3) the name and Commission identification number of a political action committee making a contribution or contributions, the date and amount of any monetary or in-kind contributions made during the time period covered by the report, and the aggregate total of all contributions accepted from the political action committee during the calendar year of the time period covered by the report;

the name, address, occupation and employer, if applicable, 18 (4) of a contributor to whom a refund was made during the time period 19 covered by the report, the date and amount of the refund, and the 20 aggregate total of all contributions refunded to the contributor 21 during the calendar year of the time period covered by the report; 22 (5) loans made to the committee during the time period covered 23 by the report, including loans by commercial financial institutions; 24

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1 the name, address and, if applicable, occupation and employer, of 2 the person making the loan; the amount of the loan, the date the 3 loan was made, the interest rate for the loan, the repayment terms for the loan and the total of all loans made to the committee; any 4 5 payments on loans during the time period covered by the report, the 6 amount of the payment, the date the payment was made and the remaining balance of the loan following the payment; and the total 7 of all payments made on all loans to the committee and the remaining 8 9 balance on all loans to the committee during the calendar year of 10 the time period covered by the report;

the name and address of any person or entity to whom an 11 (6) 12 expenditure of more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) in the 13 aggregate was made during the time period covered by the report, a description of the goods or services purchased with the expenditure, 14 15 and the aggregate total of all expenditures made to the person or entity during the calendar year of the time period covered by the 16 Split purchasing for the purpose of evading reporting an 17 report. expenditure shall be prohibited. Expenditures made to compensate 18 political consultants and similar consultants shall be reported by 19 identifying the type of services provided to the campaign by the 20 consultants. Expenditures made by political consultants and other 21 third parties on behalf of the committee shall be reported as if the 22 expenditures were made by the committee. Expenditures made by using 23

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a credit card shall be reported by itemizing each individual
 expenditure of more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).

Contributions accepted from a limited liability company shall be 3 reported as contributions from the individual members of the limited 4 5 liability company in proportions equal to their ownership interest in the limited liability company. Contributions accepted from a 6 partnership shall be reported as contributions from the individual 7 partners of the partnership in proportions equal to their ownership 8 9 interest in the partnership. As used in this section, "associated 10 political action committee" shall mean a political action committee 11 registered with the Federal Election Commission when the connected or affiliated entities of the two committees share a formal business 12 relationship such as the national and state organizations of a 13 professional or business organization or labor union. Transfers 14 between a political action committee and an associated political 15 action committee shall not be considered as contributions or 16 expenditures. 17

18 C. The Report of Contributions and Expenditures for Non-19 Oklahoma Committees shall include, but not be limited to, the 20 following information:

21 (1) the name of the committee and the time period covered by 22 the report;

(2) the total amount of all contributions made by the committeeto an Oklahoma state candidate committee during the time period

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1 covered by the report, and the aggregate total of all such 2 contributions made during the calendar year of the time period 3 covered by the report;

4 (3) the total amount of all independent expenditures made by
5 the committee during the time period covered by the report, and the
6 aggregate total of all such independent expenditures made during the
7 calendar year of the time period covered by the report;

8 (4) the total amount of funds spent on electioneering 9 communications made by the committee during the time period covered 10 by the report, and the aggregate total of funds spent on 11 electioneering communications made during the calendar year of the 12 time period covered by the report;

13 (5) The name, address, occupation and employer of any Oklahoma 14 resident making a contribution or contributions exceeding Fifty 15 Dollars (\$50.00) in value in the aggregate, the date and amount of 16 any monetary or in-kind contributions made during the time period 17 covered by the report, and the aggregate total of all contributions 18 accepted from the person during the calendar year of the time period 19 covered by the report.

20 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY Rule 2.107 of the Rules of the 21 Ethics Commission (74 O.S. Supp. 2016, Ch. 62, App. I), is amended 22 to read as follows:

Rule 2.107. (A) Any person other than an individual, including
a political action committee, that makes an independent expenditure

of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or more in the aggregate at least fifteen (15) days prior to any election shall be required to file a report with the Commission at the same time that candidate committees are required to file pre-election reports for the applicable election.

6 (B) Any person other than an individual, including a political 7 action committee, that makes an independent expenditure of Five 8 Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or more in the aggregate during the 9 period beginning no more than fourteen (14) days prior to any 10 election and ending on the day of the election shall make a report 11 to the Commission no later than the business day following the day 12 the expenditure is made.

13 (C) Each report filed by a person other than a political action 14 committee shall include the name and address of the person making 15 the independent expenditure and the name, street address, telephone 16 number, and office or title of the individual filing the report.

(D) Each report filed shall include the name of the political action committee or the person making the independent expenditure; the amount, date and a brief description or statement of each independent expenditure; and the name and office of the candidate supported or opposed, indicating whether the candidate was supported or opposed.

(E) If the person making the independent expenditure, otherthan a political action committee, received funds from any other

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1 person for the purpose of making an independent expenditure or 2 expenditures, the report shall include the name, address and 3 principal business activity of each person contributing funds in excess of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) in the aggregate and the amount of 4 5 any such contribution or contributions that have not been previously reported, together with a cumulative total of all contributions made 6 7 by each person since the first report was filed for the election for which the independent expenditure is being made. As used in this 8 9 section, "for the purpose of" means that the funds are either (1) 10 received by an organization or corporation in response to a 11 solicitation specifically requesting funds to pay for an independent expenditure or electioneering communication or (2) specifically 12 13 designated for independent expenditures or electioneering communications by the donor. 14

If the person making the independent expenditure is a non-15 (F) profit corporation that has not been officially approved by the 16 17 United States Internal Revenue Service for tax exempt status under Section 501(c) of Title 26 of the United States Code as it currently 18 exists or as it may be amended, the report shall include the name, 19 address and principal business activity of each person contributing 20 funds in excess of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) in the aggregate to the 21 corporation during the current calendar year and the preceding 22 calendar year and the amount of any such contribution or 23 contributions that have not been previously reported, together with 24

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a cumulative total of all contributions made by each person since
 the first report was filed for the election for which the
 independent expenditure is being made.

4 (G) Reports required by this section shall not relieve the
5 person making the report from filing other reports required by these
6 Rules.

7 (H) If any person makes, or contracts to make, any expenditure 8 for an independent expenditure and such expenditure is coordinated 9 with a candidate or a candidate committee in any way, the 10 expenditure shall be considered as a contribution to the candidate 11 committee and as an expenditure by the candidate committee.

12 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY Rule 2.108 of the Rules of the 13 Ethics Commission (74 O.S. Supp. 2016, Ch. 62, App. I), is amended 14 to read as follows:

Rule 2.108. (A) Any person other than an individual, including a political action committee, that makes an electioneering communication of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or more in the aggregate at least fifteen (15) days prior to any election shall be required to file a report with the Commission at the same time that candidate committees are required to file pre-election reports for the applicable election.

(B) Any person other than an individual, including a political
action committee, that makes an electioneering communication of Five
Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or more in the aggregate during the

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period beginning no more than fourteen (14) days prior to any election and ending on the day of the election shall make a report to the Commission no later than the business day following the day the electioneering communication is made.

(C) Each report filed by a person other than a political action
committee shall include the name and address of the person making
the electioneering communication and the name, street address,
telephone number, and office or title of the individual filing the
report.

(D) Each report filed shall include the name of the political action committee or the person making the electioneering communication; the amount, date and a brief description or statement of each electioneering communication, and the name and office of the candidate or candidates identified in the electioneering communication.

If the person making the electioneering communication, 16 (E) other than a political action committee, received funds from any 17 other person for the purpose of making an electioneering 18 communication or communications, the report shall include the name, 19 address and principal business activity of each person contributing 20 funds in excess of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) in the aggregate and the 21 amount of any such contribution or contributions that have not been 22 previously reported, together with a cumulative total of all 23 contributions made by each person since the first report was filed 24

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for the election for which the electioneering communication is being made. As used in this section, "for the purpose of" means that the funds are either: (1) received by an organization or corporation in response to a solicitation specifically requesting funds to pay for an electioneering communication or independent expenditure or (2) specifically designated for electioneering communications or independent expenditures by the donor.

If the person making the electioneering communication is a 8 (F) 9 non-profit corporation that has not been officially approved by the 10 United States Internal Revenue Service for tax exempt status under Section 501(c) of Title 26 of the United States Code as it currently 11 12 exists or as it may be amended, the report shall include the name, address and principal business activity of each person contributing 13 funds in excess of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) in the aggregate to the 14 15 corporation during the current calendar year and the preceding calendar year and the amount of any such contribution or 16 contributions that have not been previously reported, together with 17 a cumulative total of all contributions made by each person since 18 the first report was filed for the election for which the 19 electioneering communication is being made. 20

(G) Reports required by this section shall not relieve the person making the report from filing other reports required by these Rules.

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1	(H) If any person makes, or contracts to make, any expenditure
2	for an electioneering communication and such expenditure is
3	coordinated with a candidate or a candidate committee in any way,
4	the expenditure shall be considered as a contribution to the
5	candidate committee and as an expenditure by the candidate
6	committee.
7	SECTION 5. This act shall become effective in accordance with
8	the provisions of Section 58 of Article V of the Oklahoma
9	Constitution.
