7	An Act relating to elections; amending 26 O.S. 2011,
8	Section 7-101, which relates to voting time for employees; extending days upon which employees
9	allowed time to vote to include days on which in- person absentee voting allowed; requiring certain
10	notification; allowing employer to select days and hours for such time; clarifying language; and
11	declaring an emergency.

13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2011, Section 7-101, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	Section 7-101. <u>A.</u> Every corporation, firm, association or
17	individual <u>,</u> hereinafter referred to as "employer" <u>,</u> who , on election
18	day, has a registered voter employed or in his service, shall grant
19	the employee two (2) hours of time during the period when the
20	election is open in which to vote, and if subject to the following
21	provisions:
22	1. Such time to vote shall be allowed on the day of the
23	election or on a day on which in-person absentee voting is allowed
24	by law;

2. If such employee be in the county or is at such distance from the voting place that more than two (2) hours are required in which to attend such elections, then the employee shall be allowed a sufficient time in which to cast a ballot—;

- 3. No such employee shall be entitled to such time to vote unless the employee notifies orally or in writing an employer's representative of the employee's intention to be absent, on the day preceding the election day. Upon proof of voting, such employee shall not be subject to any loss of compensation or other penalty for such absence of the election or the day of in-person absentee voting. Such employer shall select the days and hours which such employees are to be allowed in which to attend such elections, and shall notify each of the employees which days and hours they are to have in which to vote. This section shall not apply to an employee whose work day begins three (3) hours or more subsequent to the time of opening of the polls, or ends three (3) hours or more prior to the time of closing the polls. The employer may change the work hours to allow such three (3) hours before the beginning of work or after the work hours; and
- 4. Upon proof of voting, such employee shall not be subject to any loss of compensation or other penalty for such absence.
- $\underline{\mathtt{B.}}$ Any employer who fails to comply with this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined
