8	An Act relating to elections; amending 26 O.S. 2011, Section 7-101, which relates to voting time for
9	employees; extending days upon which employees allowed time to vote to include days on which in-
10	person absentee voting allowed; requiring certain notification; allowing employer to select days and
11	hours for such time; clarifying language; and declaring an emergency.

14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2011, Section 7-101, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	Section 7-101. <u>A.</u> Every corporation, firm, association or
18	individual, hereinafter referred to as "employer", who, on election
19	day, has a registered voter employed or in his service, shall grant
20	the employee two (2) hours of time during the period when the
21	election is open in which to vote, and if subject to the following
22	provisions:

1 <u>1. Such time to vote shall be allowed on the day of the</u> 2 <u>election or on a day on which in-person absentee voting is allowed</u> 3 <u>by law;</u>

4 <u>2. If</u> such employee be in the county or is at such distance
5 from the voting place that more than two (2) hours are required in
6 which to attend such elections, then the employee shall be allowed a
7 sufficient time in which to cast a ballot-;

3. No such employee shall be entitled to such time to vote 8 9 unless the employee notifies orally or in writing an employer's 10 representative of the employee's intention to be absent, on the day preceding the election day. Upon proof of voting, such employee 11 12 shall not be subject to any loss of compensation or other penalty for such absence of the election or the day of in-person absentee 13 voting. Such employer shall select the days and hours which such 14 employees are to be allowed in which to attend such elections, and 15 shall notify each of the employees which days and hours they are to 16 have in which to vote. This section shall not apply to an employee 17 whose work day begins three (3) hours or more subsequent to the time 18 of opening of the polls, or ends three (3) hours or more prior to 19 the time of closing the polls. The employer may change the work 20 hours to allow such three (3) hours before the beginning of work or 21 after the work hours; and 22

4. Upon proof of voting, such employee shall not be subject to
any loss of compensation or other penalty for such absence.

1	\underline{B} . Any employer who fails to comply with this section shall be
2	deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined
3	not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than One Hundred
4	Dollars (\$100.00).
5	SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
6	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
7	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
8	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
