6	AS INTRODUCED
7	An Act relating to professions and occupations; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Sections 1013, 1686 and
8	1850.90, which relate to apprentices for plumbing, electrical and mechanical professions; modifying
9	language; providing for apprentice application and renewals; prohibiting work without certain apprentice
10	registration; providing for certain forms and document submissions; providing certain grace period
11	for registration or examination; allowing apprentice registration during grace period without disciplinary
12	action; excepting certain persons during grace period from apprentice registration requirements for
13	examination; providing certain retest within certain period; providing certain wait period for failure to
14	pass examination within certain grace period; construing violations after certain grace period;
15	construing effects of grace period on certain rules and laws; providing for codification; and providing
16	an effective date.

19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
20	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1013, is
21	amended to read as follows:
22	Section 1013. A. The Construction Industries Board shall, upon
23	proper application and payment of fee, register as a plumber's
24	apprentice, and shall issue a certificate of registration to,

1 persons who furnish proof satisfactory to the Board that they are 2 sixteen (16) years of age or older and are enrolled in a recognized 3 school or training course for plumber apprentices, or have arranged for employment as a plumber's apprentice with a licensed plumbing 4 5 contractor. The certificate of an apprentice shall expire at the end of one (1) year from date of issuance, at which time the Board 6 7 may issue a renewal certificate upon payment of the renewal fee the apprentice may reregister and receive, upon payment of the 8 9 apprentice registration renewal fee, a renewal certificate. No 10 person shall act as, or perform the work of, a plumber's apprentice 11 without a current and valid certificate of registration or other 12 proof of proper application acceptable to the Board. B. All applications or renewals shall be made in writing to the 13 Board on forms provided, if necessary, by the Board. All 14 15 applications or renewals shall be accompanied by the appropriate 16 fee. C. Applicants and apprentices, when required by the Board, 17 shall provide such documents, statements or other information as may 18 be necessary to submit to a national criminal history record check 19 as defined by Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 20 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1013.1 of Title 59, unless there 22 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 23

A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law concerning the
 plumbing profession:

3 Ninety (90) days from and after the effective date of this 1. act it shall be unlawful and a misdemeanor for any person to act as, 4 5 or perform the work of, a plumber's apprentice, as defined in Section 1003 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, until such person 6 7 has registered as a plumber's apprentice as provided in Section 1013 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes and received a certificate of 8 9 registration from the Construction Industries Board. A current and 10 valid certificate of registration, or proof of proper application acceptable to the Board, shall be required at all times while acting 11 as, or performing the work of, a plumber's apprentice. 12

2. Ninety (90) days from and after the effective date of this 13 act it shall be unlawful and a misdemeanor for any person, firm, 14 partnership, association or corporation to employ or offer 15 employment, work or any job to a person as a plumber's apprentice, 16 17 as defined in Section 1003 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, until such person shall have registered and received a certification 18 of registration as a plumber's apprentice as required by Section 19 1013 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes. A copy of the current 20 and valid certificate of registration or proof of proper application 21 for each person acting as, or performing the work of, a plumber's 22 apprentice shall be on file for inspection at the person's, firm's, 23 partnership's, association's or corporation's primary place of 24

business. Failure to obtain a copy of each person's certificate of
 registration or proof of application as a plumber's apprentice shall
 constitute a violation of The Plumbing License Law of 1955.

Within the ninety-day period provided in this act, a person 4 Β. 5 who is not registered or has not been continuously registered as a plumber's apprentice, and who is currently and has been continuously 6 7 acting as, or performing continuously the work of, a plumber's apprentice for a period of three (3) years or more under the 8 9 supervision of a licensed plumbing contractor in this state, or who 10 has a military exemption from apprentice registration as allowed by 11 the Construction Industries Board, may make application to take the 12 examination for journeyman plumber upon submission of an affidavit 13 from his or her current employer and other documents or proofs required by the Oklahoma State Committee of Plumbing Examiners and 14 the Construction Industries Board. The examination shall be 15 conducted within the ninety-day period with only one retest allowed 16 after thirty (30) days from the date of a failed examination within 17 the same ninety-day period. Any applicant failing to pass the 18 examination, including the one allowable retest, within the ninety-19 day period shall not be permitted to take any subsequent examination 20 for a period of three (3) years and only after proper registration 21 as an apprentice as required by Section 1013 of Title 59 of the 22 Oklahoma Statutes for a continuous three-year period. 23

1 C. The provisions of this section provide a one-time grace 2 period for persons acting as or performing the work of an apprentice 3 who are not properly registered. Persons acting as or performing the work of an apprentice who are not properly registered shall be 4 5 allowed to either register as required by Section 1013 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes without disciplinary action for failure to 6 be properly registered, or apply and take the journeyman plumber 7 examination within the ninety-day grace period. On the effective 8 9 date of this act, any person who is acting as, or performing the 10 work of, a plumber's apprentice and who fails to register as a 11 plumber's apprentice or fails to successfully pass the journeyman examination within the ninety-day grace period shall be deemed in 12 violation of The Plumbing Licensing Law of 1955 for each day the 13 person was not or is not registered or licensed. 14

D. Nothing in this section shall be construed to alter, modify 15 or amend any law or rule regarding experience qualifications or 16 other requirements for examination except as specifically authorized 17 in the ninety-day grace period for persons not properly registered 18 as an apprentice. Such grace period shall not be extended, and 19 except for military exemptions authorized by the Construction 20 Industries Board by law or rule, no other exceptions shall be 21 authorized. 22

23 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1686, is 24 amended to read as follows:

Section 1686. A. The Construction Industries Board shall, upon proper application and payment of fee, register as an electrical apprentice and issue a certificate of such registration to any person who furnishes satisfactory proof to the Board that the applicant is:

1. Sixteen (16) years of age or over;

2. Enrolled in a school or federal training program for 7 electrical apprentices recognized by the Board, or employed as an 8 9 electrical apprentice with an active licensed electrical contractor. 10 The certificate of an apprentice shall expire at the end of one 11 (1) year from date of issuance, at which time the apprentice may 12 reregister and receive, upon payment of the apprentice registration renewal fee, a renewal certificate. No person shall act as, or 13 perform the work of, an electrical apprentice without a current and 14 valid certificate of registration or other proof of proper 15 16 application acceptable to the Board.

B. All applications for examination, license or renewal of
license renewals shall be made in writing to the Board on forms
provided, if necessary, by the Board. All applications <u>or renewals</u>
shall be accompanied by the appropriate fee.

C. Apprentices Applicants and apprentices, when required by the Board, shall provide such documents, statements or other information as may be necessary to submit to a national criminal history record

check as defined by Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma
 Statutes.

3 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1686.1 of Title 59, unless there 5 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law concerning the7 electrical profession:

1. Ninety (90) days from and after the effective date of this 8 9 act it shall be unlawful and a misdemeanor for any person to act as, 10 or perform the work of, an electrical apprentice, as defined in 11 Section 1682 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, until such person has registered as an electrical apprentice as provided in Section 12 13 1686 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes and received a certificate of registration from the Construction Industries Board. A current 14 15 and valid certificate of registration, or proof of proper application acceptable to the Board, shall be required at all times 16 while acting as or performing the work of an electrical apprentice. 17 2. Ninety (90) days from and after the effective date of this 18 act it shall be unlawful and a misdemeanor for any person, firm, 19 partnership, association or corporation to employ or offer 20 employment, work or any job to a person as an electrical apprentice, 21 as defined in Section 1682 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, 22 until such person shall have registered and received a certification 23 of registration as an electrical apprentice as required by Section 24

1 1686 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes. A copy of the current 2 and valid certificate of registration or proof of proper application 3 for each person acting as or performing the work of an electrical apprentice shall be on file for inspection at the person's, firm's, 4 5 partnership's, association's or corporation's primary place of business. Failure to obtain a copy of each person's certificate of 6 registration or proof of application as an electrical apprentice 7 shall constitute a violation of the Electrical License Act. 8

9 Β. Within the ninety-day period provided in this act, a person 10 who is not registered ,or has not been continuously registered, as an electrical apprentice, and who is currently and has been 11 12 continuously acting as, or performing continuously the work of, an electrical apprentice for a period of three (3) years or more under 13 the supervision of a licensed electrical contractor in this state, 14 or who has a military exemption from apprentice registration as 15 allowed by the Construction Industries Board, may make application 16 to take the examination for journeyman electrician upon submission 17 of an affidavit from his or her current employer and other documents 18 or proofs required by the Committee of Electrical Examiners and the 19 Construction Industries Board. The examination shall be conducted 20 within the ninety-day period with only one retest allowed after 21 thirty (30) days from the date of a failed examination within the 22 same ninety-day period. Any applicant failing to pass the 23 examination, including the one allowable retest, within the ninety-24

1 day period shall not be permitted to take any subsequent examination 2 for a period of three (3) years and only after proper registration 3 as an apprentice as required by Section 1686 of Title 59 of the 4 Oklahoma Statutes for a continuous three-year period.

5 С. The provisions of this section provide a one-time grace period for persons acting as, or performing the work of, an 6 7 apprentice who are not properly registered. Persons acting as, or performing the work of, an apprentice who are not properly 8 9 registered shall be allowed to either register as required by Section 1686 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes without 10 11 disciplinary action for failure to be properly registered, or apply 12 and take the journeyman electrician examination within the ninetyday grace period. On the effective date of this act, any person who 13 is acting as, or performing the work of, an electrical apprentice 14 and who fails to register as an electrician's apprentice or fails to 15 successfully pass the journeyman examination within the ninety-day 16 grace period shall be deemed in violation of the Electrical License 17 Act for each day the person was not or is not registered or 18 licensed. 19

D. Nothing in this section shall be construed to alter, modify or amend any law or rule regarding experience qualifications or other requirements for examination except as specifically authorized in the ninety-day grace period for persons not properly registered as an apprentice. Such grace period shall not be extended, and

except for military exemptions authorized by the Construction
 Industries Board by law or rule, no other exceptions shall be
 authorized.

4 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1850.9, is 5 amended to read as follows:

6 Section 1850.9. A. The Construction Industries Board, upon 7 proper application and payment of an apprentice registration fee, 8 shall register as a mechanical apprentice and issue a certificate of 9 such registration to any person who furnishes satisfactory proof to 10 the Board that the applicant is:

1. Sixteen (16) years of age or older; and

Enrolled in a school or training course for mechanical
 apprentices recognized by the Board or has arranged for employment
 as a mechanical apprentice with a licensed mechanical contractor.

B. Apprentice registration certificates shall expire one (1)
year after date of registration, at which time the apprentice may
reregister and receive, upon payment of the apprentice registration
renewal fee, a renewal certificate.

<u>C. No person shall act as, or perform the work of, a mechanical</u>
 <u>apprentice without a current and valid certificate of registration,</u>
 <u>or other proof of proper application acceptable to the Board.</u>

D. All applications or renewals shall be made in writing to the
 Board on forms provided, if necessary, by the Board. All

1 applications or renewals shall be accompanied by the appropriate
2 fee.

3 E. Applicants and apprentices, when required by the Board, 4 shall provide such documents, statements or other information as may 5 be necessary to submit to a national criminal history record check as defined by Section 150.9 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 6 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 7 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1850.9A of Title 59, unless 8 9 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 10 Α. Notwithstanding any other provision of law concerning the mechanical profession: 11 12 1. Ninety (90) days from and after the effective date of this act it shall be unlawful and a misdemeanor for any person to act as, 13 or perform the work of, a mechanical apprentice, as defined in 14 Section 1850.2 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, until such 15 person has registered as a mechanical apprentice as provided in 16 17 Section 1850.9 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes and received a certificate of registration from the Construction Industries Board. 18 A current and valid certificate of registration, or proof of proper 19 application acceptable to the Board, shall be required at all times 20 while acting as, or performing the work of, a mechanical apprentice. 21 2. Ninety (90) days from and after the effective date of this 22 act it shall be unlawful and a misdemeanor for any person, firm, 23

24 partnership, association or corporation to employ or offer

1 employment, work or any job to a person as a mechanical apprentice, as defined in Section 1850.2 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes, 2 3 until such person shall have registered and received a certification of registration as a mechanical apprentice as required by Section 4 5 1850.9 of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes. A copy of the current and valid certificate of registration or other proof of application 6 for each person acting as or performing the work of a mechanical 7 apprentice shall be on file for inspection at the person's, firm's, 8 9 partnership's, association's or corporation's primary place of 10 business. Failure to obtain a copy of each person's certificate of 11 registration or proof of application as a mechanical apprentice shall constitute a violation of the Mechanical Licensing Act. 12

Within the ninety-day period provided in this act, a person 13 в. who is not registered or has not been continuously registered as a 14 mechanical apprentice, and who is currently and has been 15 continuously acting as, or performing continuously the work of, a 16 mechanical apprentice for a period of three (3) years or more under 17 the supervision of a licensed mechanical contractor in this state, 18 or who has a military exemption from apprentice registration as 19 allowed by the Construction Industries Board, may make application 20 to take the examination for mechanical journeyman upon submission of 21 an affidavit from his or her current employer and other documents or 22 proofs required by the Committee of Mechanical Examiners and the 23 Construction Industries Board. The examination shall be conducted 24

1 within the ninety-day period with only one retest allowed after thirty (30) days from the date of a failed examination within the 2 3 same ninety-day period. Any applicant failing to pass the examination, including the one allowable retest, within the ninety-4 5 day period shall not be permitted to take any subsequent examination for a period of three (3) years and only after proper registration 6 as an apprentice as required by Section 1850.9 of Title 59 of the 7 Oklahoma Statutes for a continuous three-year period. 8

9 C. The provisions of this section provide a one-time grace period for persons acting as or performing the work of an apprentice 10 11 who are not properly registered. Persons acting as or performing the work of an apprentice who are not properly registered shall be 12 allowed to either register as required by Section 1850.9 of Title 59 13 of the Oklahoma Statutes without disciplinary action for failure to 14 be properly registered, or apply and take the mechanical journeyman 15 examination within the ninety-day grace period. On the effective 16 date of this act, any person who is acting as, or performing the 17 work of, a mechanical apprentice and who fails to register as a 18 mechanical apprentice or fails to successfully pass the mechanical 19 journeyman examination within the ninety-day grace period shall be 20 deemed in violation of the Mechanical Licensing Act for each day the 21 person was not, or is not, registered or licensed. 22

D. Nothing in this section shall be construed to alter, modifyor amend any law or rule regarding experience qualifications or

7	SECTION 7. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
