NEW LAW A new section of law not to be 3 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows: 4 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Sergeant Craig 5 Johnson Act". 6 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 173, is 7 amended to read as follows: Section 173. All persons who, after the commission of any 8 9 felony, conceal or aid the offender, with knowledge that he or she 10 has committed a felony, and with intent that he the person may avoid 11 or escape from arrest, trial, conviction, or punishment, are 12 accessories. In the case of murder, a person is accountable under 13 this statute for accessory to murder if the person knew or 14 reasonably should have known that the conduct committed upon the 15 victim could foreseeably result in the death of the victim. 16 SECTION 3. Except as provided in subsection C of this section, any person convicted of the provisions of subsection A of this section 2 3 shall be quilty of a misdemeanor. C. Any person who is convicted of a second or subsequent 4 5 offense pursuant to this section shall be quilty of a felony. D. As used in subsection A of this section: 6 "Personally identifiable information" shall include, but not 7 1. be limited to: 8 9 a. name, b. birth date, 10 11 с. address, telephone number, 12 d. driver license number, 13 e. f. Social Security number, 14 place of employment, 15 q. mother's maiden name, or 16 h. a photograph or any other realistic likeness; 17 i. 2. "Family or household member" shall mean parents including 18 grandparents, stepparents, adoptive parents and foster parents; 19 children including grandchildren, stepchildren, adopted children and 20 foster children; and persons otherwise related by blood or marriage 21 living in the same household; and 22 3. "Law enforcement officer" shall mean any officer, agent or 23 employee of a state, unit of local government, or an Indian tribe 24
