7	An Act relating to cities and towns; amending 11 O.S. 2011, Section 51-104, as last amended by Section 7,
8	Chapter 15, O.S.L. 2013 (11 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 51-104), which relates to the Public Employees
9	Relations Board; re-creating the Public Employees Relations Board; and declaring an emergency.
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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 11 O.S. 2011, Section 51-104, as
15	last amended by Section 7, Chapter 15, O.S.L. 2013 (11 O.S. Supp.
16	2016, Section 51-104), is amended to read as follows:
17	Section 51-104. A. There is hereby re-created, to continue
18	until July 1, <del>2016</del> <u>2020</u> , in accordance with the provisions of the
19	Oklahoma Sunset Law, the Public Employees Relations Board, which
20	shall be composed of five (5) members to be appointed or selected as
21	follows:
22	1. One appointed by the Governor shall be an impartial
23	appointment and designated as Chairman;
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1 2. Two appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the State Senate, one of whom shall be an impartial appointment and one of 2 whom shall be a representative from the labor industry chosen from a 3 list of four nominees to be submitted jointly by an Oklahoma 4 5 organization the primary purpose of which is to provide services to members who are municipal police officers, which shall provide two 6 nominees, and by an Oklahoma organization the primary purpose of 7 which is to provide services to members who are municipal 8 9 firefighters, which shall provide two nominees; and

10 3. Two appointed by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of 11 Representatives, one of whom shall be an impartial appointment and 12 one of whom shall be a representative of a municipality to be 13 selected from a list of four nominees submitted by a statewide 14 organization the membership of which consists primarily of 15 incorporated cities and towns within Oklahoma.

The Chairman shall be appointed for a term of five (5) 16 Β. years, commencing from July 1, 1972. The other members shall be 17 appointed for terms of one (1) and three (3) years, respectively, 18 from July 1, 1972, but their successors shall be appointed for terms 19 of three (3) years. No member shall serve on the Board for more 20 than two terms. No impartial member appointed by either the 21 President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate or by the Speaker 22 of the Oklahoma House of Representatives shall, within two (2) years 23 of being appointed to the Board or while serving on the Board, have 24

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served or worked in a capacity as an advocate, be a member or receive compensation from a labor union group association or its subordinate affiliates or have served or worked in a capacity as an advocate, appointed or elected official of or received compensation from a municipality or municipalities.

Three members of the Board shall constitute a quorum. 6 С. Any 7 individual chosen to fill a vacancy on the Board shall be appointed only for the unexpired term. The Chairman and members of the Board 8 9 shall not receive a salary but shall receive compensation in lieu of 10 expenses in the amount of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) per day for any 11 meeting or the conduct of official duties, whether acting singly or 12 collectively.

To accomplish the objectives and to perform the duties 13 D. prescribed by this article, the Board may subpoena witnesses, issue 14 15 subpoenas to require the production of books, papers, records, and documents which may be needed as evidence of any matter under 16 inquiry, and administer oaths and affirmations. In cases of neglect 17 or refusal to obey a subpoena issued to any person, the district 18 court of the county in which the investigations or the public 19 hearings are taking place, upon application by the Board, may issue 20 an order requiring such person to appear before the Board and 21 produce evidence about the matter under investigation. A failure to 22 obey such order may be punished by the court as a contempt. 23

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E. Any subpoena, notice of hearing, or other process or notice 1 2 of the Board issued under the provisions of this article may be 3 served personally, by registered mail, or by leaving a copy at the principal office of the person required to be served. A return made 4 5 and verified by the individual making such service and setting forth the manner of such service is proof of service, and a returned post 6 7 office receipt, when registered or certified mail is used, is proof of service. 8

9 F. The Board shall adopt, promulgate, amend, or rescind such rules as it deems necessary to carry out the provisions of this 10 11 article. Public hearings shall be held by the Board on any proposed 12 rule of general applicability designed to implement, interpret, or prescribe policy, procedure or practice requirements under the 13 provisions of this article and on any proposed change to such 14 existing rule. Reasonable notice shall be given prior to such 15 hearings, which shall include the time, place, and nature of such 16 hearing and the terms or substance of the proposed rule or the 17 changes to such rule. 18

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
