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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:			
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1722, is			
15	amended to read as follows:			
16	Section 1722. As used in the Licensed Dietitian Act:			
17	1. "Board" means the State Board of Medical Licensure and			
18	Supervision.			
19	2. "Committee" means the Advisory Committee on Dietetic			
20	Registration of the State Board of Medical Examiners.			
21	3. "Dietetics" means the <del>professional discipline of applying</del>			
22	and integrating scientific principles of nutrition pursuant to			
23	different health, social, cultural, physical, psychological, and			

economic conditions to the proper nourishment, care, and education

22	SECTION 2	. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
23	in the Oklaho	ma Statutes as Section 1740 of Title 59, unless there
24	is created a	duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Nothing in the Licensed Dietitian Act shall be construed as to affect or prevent:

- 1. A student enrolled in an approved academic program in dietetics or nutrition from engaging in the practice of dietetics/nutrition, if such practice constitutes a part of a supervised course of study, and if the student is designated by a title which clearly indicates his or her status as a student or trainee, or from engaging in the practice of dietetics or nutrition under the supervision of a licensed dietitian/nutritionist;
- 2. A dietitian or nutritionist who is serving in the Armed Forces or any other federal agency from engaging in the practice of dietetics or nutrition, provided such practice is related to service or employment;
- 3. Persons licensed to practice the professions of dentistry, medicine, osteopathy, chiropractic, nursing or pharmacy from engaging in the practice of dietetics or nutrition when incidental to the practice of their profession, except that such persons may not use the titles "dietitian", "dietician", or "nutritionist";
- 4. A person from marketing or distributing food, food materials or food supplements or a person from engaging in an explanation of the use or preparation of these products or from furnishing general nutrition information related to such products in connection with the marketing or distribution of such products, if that person does not represent himself or herself as a dietitian or nutritionist; or

- 5. A person from providing weight control services through a program which has been reviewed by, consultation is available from, and no program change can be initiated without prior approval by a licensed dietitian or nutritionist, a dietitian or nutritionist licensed in another state which has licensure requirements at least as stringent as the requirements for licensure specified herein or a dietitian registered by the Commission on Dietetic Registration of the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1741 of Title 59, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. Any person who violates any provision of the Licensed Dietitian Act shall, upon conviction thereof, be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) and not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment for a period not exceeding six (6) months or both.
- B. In addition to any other penalty or remedy pursuant to the Licensed Dietitian Act or administrative rule adopted hereunder, any violation of this act or regulation adopted hereunder shall be punishable by a fine not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) and not to exceed Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00). Each day of violation shall constitute a separate offense.
- C. In addition to any other fine or penalty that may be imposed against any person found to have violated any provision of the

1	Licensed Dietitian Act, the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and
2	Supervision may assess and collect all costs incurred in connection
3	with disciplinary actions including, but not limited to,
4	investigator fees, stenographer fees, attorney fees, and hearing
5	costs.
6	SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
