SENATE BILL NO.625 By: Kirt

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AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to arts education; creating a task force to study and make recommendations regarding arts education in public schools; establishing expiration date; providing for membership; requiring appointments by certain date; providing for filling of vacancies; requiring organizational meeting by certain date; providing for election of chair and vice chair; specifying quorum; providing for frequency of meetings; subjecting meetings to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act and the Oklahoma Open Records Act; prohibiting compensation or travel reimbursement for members; providing for staff support; requiring submission of certain reports by certain dates; providing for contents of report; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-103.12 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. There is hereby created until December 31, 2022, the Arts Education Task Force to determine the current status of arts education in public schools in this state and make recommendations to ensure equitable access to fine arts education for all students.

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Arts education shall mean instruction and programming in any art disciplines including but not limited to dance, music, visual arts, drama and media arts.

- B. The task force shall be comprised of fifteen (15) members to be appointed as follows:
- 1. One member who represents a statewide music education association, appointed by the Governor;
- 2. One member who represents a county having less than one hundred thousand (100,000) population according to the latest Federal Decennial Census, appointed by the Governor;
- 3. One member who represents a statewide organization representing school administrators, appointed by the Governor;
- 4. One member representing a non-profit organization that operates a fine arts institute for high school students and a continuing education program, appointed by the Governor;
- 5. One member of the Senate, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate;
- 6. One member who represents a statewide non-profit organization that works with community arts organizations and advocates on behalf of arts funding and arts education, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate;
- 7. One member who represents a statewide visual arts education association, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate;

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1 8. One member of the House of Representatives, appointed by the 2 Speaker of the House of Representatives; 3 9. One member who represents a statewide entity that supports 4 school-wide improvement through arts-focused, experiential 5 curriculum, appointed by the Speaker of the House of 6 Representatives; 7 8 9

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- 10. One member who represents a county having more than three hundred thousand (300,000) population according to the latest Federal Decennial Census, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- The State Superintendent of Public Instruction or a designee;
 - 12. The Chancellor of Higher Education or a designee;
 - 13. The Secretary of Education or a designee;
- The executive director of the Office of Educational Quality 14. and Accountability or a designee; and
- The executive director of the Oklahoma Arts Council or a 15. designee.
- C. Appointments to the task force shall be made within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this act. A vacancy on the task force shall be filled by the appointing authority.
- The task force shall conduct an organizational meeting no later than October 1, 2019. The chair and vice chair of the task

Req. No. 1110 Page 3 force shall be elected from among the membership at the organizational meeting.

- E. A quorum of the task force shall be required to approve any final action of the task force. For purposes of this section, seven members shall constitute a quorum.
- F. The task force may meet as often as may be required to perform the duties imposed upon it.
- G. The task force shall be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act and the Oklahoma Open Records Act.
- H. Members of the task force shall receive no compensation or travel reimbursement.
- I. The Senate, the State Department of Education and the Oklahoma Arts Council shall provide staff support for the task force.
- J. The task force shall submit interim reports of findings and recommendations by December 31, 2020, and December 31, 2021, to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The task force shall submit a final report of its findings and recommendations by December 31, 2022, to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The interim reports and final reports shall include recommendations regarding policy, regulations, accountability, resource allocation and ways to improve access to reliable data to better inform policy and practice.

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1	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019.
2	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
3	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
4	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
5	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
