7	An Act relating to palliative care; creating the Advisory Council on Palliative Care and Quality of
8	Life; providing expiration date; stating purpose; providing for appointments; specifying date by which
9	appointments are made; providing for vacancies; providing for designation of cochairs; specifying
10	quorum; providing for meetings and staffing; requiring certain compliance; stating that Advisory
11	Council members shall receive no compensation; providing reimbursement; requiring examination of
12	certain information; requiring report; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and
13	declaring an emergency.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-879.5 of Title 63, unless
19	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
20	A. There is hereby created to continue until September 1, 2017,
21	the Advisory Council on Palliative Care and Quality of Life. The
22	purpose of the Advisory Council shall be to:
23	1. Identify methods that improve the quality and delivery of
24	palliative care;

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1 2. Review best practices from publicly- and privatelyadministered palliative care programs throughout the United States; 2 3 and 3. Develop and publish information on palliative care issues 4 5 for the general public. The Advisory Council shall consist of nine (9) members to be 6 в. 7 appointed as follows: Three shall be appointed by the State Commissioner of Health 8 1. 9 as follows: 10 one shall be a physician licensed in this state a. 11 possessing knowledge of palliative care issues, 12 b. one shall be a nurse practitioner licensed in this state possessing knowledge of palliative care issues, 13 and 14 one shall be an administrator of a long-term care 15 с. facility licensed in this state; 16 2. Three shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the 17 Senate as follows: 18 one shall be a representative of the pharmaceutical 19 a. community, 20 b. one shall be a representative of the religious 21 community, and 22 one shall be a representative of the patient advocacy 23 с. community; 24

3. Three shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of 1 2 Representatives as follows: 3 one shall be representative of the social work a. community, 4 5 b. one shall be family members of persons requiring the use of palliative care services, and 6 7 с. one shall be an administrator of a hospice facility licensed in this state. 8 9 C. Appointments to the Advisory Council shall be made by 10 September 1, 2015. Advisory Council members shall serve at the pleasure of their appointing authorities. A vacancy on the Advisory 11 Council shall be filled by the original appointing authority. 12 13 D. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall each designate a cochair from 14 among the members of the Advisory Council. A majority of the 15 members of the Advisory Council shall constitute a quorum to do 16 17 business. The State Department of Health shall provide staff support to the Advisory Council as necessary to assist the Advisory 18 Council in the performance of its duties. 19 Ε. Members of the Advisory Council shall determine meeting 20 dates, provided that the Advisory Council meets at least twice 21 annually. All meetings shall comply with the provisions of the 22

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1 reimbursed by their appointing authorities for necessary expenses 2 incurred in the performance of their duties, as follows:

Legislative members may be reimbursed for their necessary
 travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in
 accordance with the provisions of Section 456 of Title 74 of the
 Oklahoma Statutes;

Nonlegislative members who are state officers or employees
may be reimbursed by their respective agencies for their necessary
travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in
accordance with the provisions of the State Travel Reimbursement
Act; and

Members who are not legislators or state officers or
 employees of the state may be reimbursed by their appointing
 authorities in accordance with the provisions of the State Travel
 Reimbursement Act.

16 F. The Advisory Council shall include an examination of the 17 following in its assessment and recommendations:

Methods to improve the delivery of palliative care services;
 The state's role in providing palliative care services to
 persons requiring such care;

3. State policy regarding the provision of palliative care; and
 4. Existing services, resources, and availability of palliative
 care services.

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1	G. The Advisory Council shall issue a report of its
2	recommendations to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the
3	Speaker of the House of Representatives and the State Commissioner
4	of Health no later than September 1, 2017.
5	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2015.
6	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
7	of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
8	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
9	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
