8	An Act relating to palliative care; amending Section 44, Chapter 229, O.S.L. 2013, as amended by Section
9	1, Chapter 141, O.S.L. 2014 (63 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 1-103a.1), which relates to Public Health
10	Advisory Councils; providing certain exception; providing for membership on certain Advisory Council;
11	providing for appointing authority; providing for quorum; broadening membership and jurisdiction of
12	certain Advisory Council; removing language relating to travel reimbursement; clarifying language;
13	providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 44, Chapter 229, O.S.L.
18	2013, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 141, O.S.L. 2014 (63 O.S.
19	Supp. 2014, Section 1-103a.1), is amended to read as follows:
20	Section 1-103a.1. A. To assist and advise the State Board of
21	Health and the State Department of Health, there are hereby created:
22	1. The Consumer Protection Licensing Advisory Council;
23	2. The Trauma and Emergency Response Advisory Council;
24	3. The Infant and Children's Health Advisory Council;

4. The Advancement of Wellness Advisory Council; and

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- 5. The Home Care and, Hospice, and Palliative Care Advisory
  Council.
- B. 1. Each Except for the Home Care, Hospice, and Palliative 4 5 Care Advisory Council, each Public Health Advisory Council (Advisory Council) created pursuant to subsection A of this section shall 6 consist of seven (7) members. Two members shall be appointed by the 7 Governor, two members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House 9 of Representatives, two members shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and one member shall be appointed by the 10 11 State Board of Health. Appointments shall be for three-year terms. 12 Members of the Advisory Councils shall serve at the pleasure of and may be removed from office by the appointing authority. Members 13 shall continue to serve until their successors are appointed. 14 15 vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments. Four members shall constitute a quorum. 16
  - 2. The Home Care, Hospice, and Palliative Care Advisory Council shall consist of nine (9) members. Three members shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, three members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and three members shall be appointed by the Governor. Five members shall constitute a quorum.
  - 3. Each Advisory Council shall meet at least twice a year, but no more than four times a year and shall elect a chair, a vice-chair

and a secretary from among its members. Each Advisory Council shall
only meet as required for election of officers, establishment of
meeting dates and times; rule development, review and
recommendation; and adoption of nonbinding resolutions to the State
Department of Health or the State Board of Health concerning matters
brought before the Advisory Council. Special meetings may be called
by the chair or by the concurrence of any three members.

- C. 1. All members of the Consumer Protection Licensing

  Advisory Council shall be knowledgeable of certain consumer issues

  as specified below. The Consumer Protection Licensing Advisory

  Council shall be composed as follows:
  - a. the Governor shall appoint:

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- (1) one member who is a licensed radiologist assistant, and
- (2) one member who is a licensed audiologist,
- b. the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint:
  - (1) one member who is a licensed radiologist, and
  - (2) one member representing the hearing aid fitting industry,
- c. the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint:
  - (1) one member representing the medical micropigmentation industry, and

1	(2) one member representing the hearing-impaired
2	public, and
3	d. the State Board of Health shall appoint one member
4	representing a diagnostic x-ray facility.
5	2. The jurisdiction areas of the Consumer Protection Licensing
6	Advisory Council shall include the hearing-aid-fitting industry, the
7	medical micropigmentation industry, the radiation industry and such
8	other areas as designated by the State Board of Health.
9	D. 1. All members of the Trauma and Emergency Response
LO	Advisory Council shall be knowledgeable of issues that arise in a
L1	hospital setting and issues that arise concerning emergency
L2	response. The Trauma and Emergency Response Advisory Council shall
13	be composed as follows:
L 4	a. the Governor shall appoint:
15	(1) one member who is an administrative director of a
L 6	licensed ambulance service, and
L7	(2) one member who is a Board Certified Emergency
18	Physician,
L9	b. the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint:
20	(1) one member who is a representative from a
21	hospital with trauma and emergency services, and
22	(2) one member who is a trauma surgeon with
23	privileges at a hospital with trauma and

emergency operative services,

1	c. the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
2	appoint:
3	(1) one member representing the trauma registrar of a
4	licensed hospital that is classified as providing
5	trauma and emergency operative services, and
6	(2) one member who is an Emergency Medical
7	Technician, and
8	d. the State Board of Health shall appoint one member who
9	is a critical care nurse.
10	2. The jurisdictional areas of the Trauma and Emergency
11	Response Advisory Council shall include emergency response systems
12	development, injury prevention, catastrophic health emergency,
13	trauma systems improvement and development and such other areas
14	designated by the State Board of Health.
15	E. 1. All members of the Infant and Children's Health Advisory
16	Council shall be knowledgeable of issues that arise in the area of
17	infant and children's health care. The Infant and Children's Health
18	Advisory Council shall be composed as follows:
19	a. the Governor shall appoint:
20	(1) one member who works for the state or for a
21	political subdivision on child abuse issues, and
22	(2) one member who is knowledgeable about childhood
23	immunizations,

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b. the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint:

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- (1) one member who is knowledgeable about newborn screening issues, and
- (2) one member licensed by the state as an optometrist who has knowledge of vision screening for children, and
- (3) one member who is a licensed ophthalmologist in this state with the knowledge of treating visual deficiencies in children,
- c. the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint:
  - (1) one member who is licensed by the state as a physician and works as a pediatrician, and
  - (2) one member who is licensed by the state as a genetic counselor, and
- d. the State Board of Health shall appoint one member who is a physician licensed by the state who specializes in the diagnosis and treatment of childhood injuries in a trauma setting.
- 2. The jurisdictional areas of the Infant and Children's Health Advisory Council shall include all issues that arise in the area of health care for infants and children and such other areas as designated by the State Board of Health.
- F. 1. All members of the Advancement of Wellness Advisory

  Council shall be knowledgeable of issues that arise in the area of

advancing the health of all Oklahomans. The Advancement of Wellness 1 Advisory Council shall be composed as follows: 2 3 the Governor shall appoint: a. (1)one member who is knowledgeable about breast and 4 5 cervical cancer issues, and (2) one member who is knowledgeable about organ donor 6 7 issues, b. the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint: 9 (1)one member who is mayor of a city or town that 10 has been designated a certified healthy community in an urban setting, and 11 one member who is the president or chief 12 (2) 13 operating officer of a business that has been designated a certified healthy business, 14 the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall 15 C. 16 appoint: 17 (1)one member who is the mayor of a city or town that has been designated a certified healthy 18 community in a rural setting, and 19 20 (2) one member who is the president or chief 21 operating officer of a business that has been designated a certified healthy business in an 22 23 urban setting, and

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- d. the State Board of Health shall appoint one member who is the Executive Director of the Tobacco Settlement Endowment Trust.
- 2. The jurisdictional areas of the Advancement of Wellness Advisory Council shall include all issues that arise in the areas of tobacco usage and cessation, organ and tissue donation, the requirements for a city or town in the state to be designated as a certified healthy community, the requirements for a business to be designated as a certified healthy business and such other areas as designated by the State Board of Health.
- G. 1. All members of the Home Care and, Hospice, and

  Palliative Care Advisory Council shall be knowledgeable of issues
  that arise in the administration and practice of home care and,
  hospice, and palliative care services. The Home Care and, Hospice,
  and Palliative Care Advisory Council shall be composed as follows:
  - a. the Governor shall appoint:
    - (1) one member who is the owner or administrator of an entity licensed in accordance with the Oklahoma Hospice Licensing Act, and
    - (2) one member who is an owner or administrator of an entity licensed in accordance with the Oklahoma

      Home Care Act,
  - b. the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint:

22	2. The juri	sdictional areas of the Home Care and, Hospice, and
23	Palliative Care	Advisory Council shall include all issues that arise

in the areas of home care or, hospice or palliative care services, including, but not limited to:

- <u>a.</u> <u>identifying methods that can improve the quality and</u> <u>delivery of home care, hospice, and palliative care,</u>
- <u>b.</u> review best practices from home care, hospice, and palliative care programs in this state,
- c. develop information on home care, hospice, and palliative care issues for the general public, and
- d. such other areas as designated by the State Board of Health.
- H. In addition to other powers and duties assigned to each Advisory Council pursuant to this section, each Advisory Council, within its jurisdictional area, shall:
- 1. Have authority to recommend to the State Board of Health rules on behalf of the State Department of Health. The State Department of Health shall not have standing to recommend to the State Board of Health permanent rules or changes to such rules within the jurisdiction of an Advisory Council which have not been submitted previously to the appropriate Advisory Council for action;
- 2. Before recommending any permanent rules to the State Board of Health, give public notice, offer an opportunity for public comment and conduct a public rulemaking hearing when required by the Administrative Procedures Act;

3. Have the authority to make nonbinding written recommendations to the State Board of Health and/or to the State Department of Health which have been concurred upon by at least a majority of the membership of the Advisory Council;

- 4. Have the authority to provide a public forum for the discussion of issues it considers relevant to its area of jurisdiction, and to:
  - a. pass nonbinding resolutions expressing the sense of the Advisory Council, and
  - b. make recommendations to the State Board of Health or the State Department of Health concerning the need and the desirability of conducting meetings, workshops and seminars; and
- 5. Cooperate with each other Advisory Council, the public, the State Board of Health and the Commissioner of Health in order to coordinate the rules within their respective jurisdictional areas and to achieve maximum efficiency and effectiveness in furthering the objectives of the State Department of Health.
- I. The Advisory Councils shall not recommend rules for promulgation by the State Board of Health unless all applicable requirements of the Administrative Procedures Act have been followed, including, but not limited to, notice, rule-impact statement and rulemaking hearings.

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        J. Members of the Advisory Councils shall serve without
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    compensation but may be reimbursed expenses incurred in the
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    performance of their duties, as provided in the State Travel
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    Reimbursement Act. The Advisory Councils are authorized to utilize
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    the conference rooms of the State Department of Health and obtain
    administrative assistance from the State Department of Health, as
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    required.
        SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2015.
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        SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
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    of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
    declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
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    be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
