an employer may prohibit a human resource employee, supervisor or

other employee whose job responsibilities require and allow access

information except as may be required or allowed in the legitimate

to other employees' wage information from disclosing such

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- 1 exercise of their job responsibilities or an employer may discipline or discharge such employee for disclosing any prohibited wage 2
- information. 3
- The provisions of this section shall apply only to employers 4 5 having twenty-five or more employees.
- SECTION 2. 40 O.S. 2011, Section 198.2, is 6 AMENDATORY amended to read as follows: 7
- Section 198.2. It shall be the duty of the Commissioner of 8 9 Labor to enforce the provisions of this act Section 198.1 of this 10 title and Section 1 of this act. Whenever the Commissioner is 11 informed of any alleged violations thereof, it shall be his or her 12 duty to investigate same and, in his discretion, said. The Commissioner is hereby authorized to institute proceedings for the 13 enforcement of penalties herein provided before any court of 14 15 competent jurisdiction. Any employer who violates the provisions of 16 this act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall upon conviction thereof, be punished by violations of the provisions of 17 Section 198.1 of this title and Section 1 of this act. The 18 Commissioner is authorized to impose a fine of not less than Twenty-19 five Dollars (\$25.00) One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than 20 One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for each 21 separate violation per pay period. In addition, upon a finding by 22 23 the Commissioner of Labor of a violation under this act, the employer shall pay any back pay found to be owed to the employee.
