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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
14	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
15	A. There is hereby created the Joint Legislative Work Schedule
16	Task Force to begin after the effective date of this act and
17	continue until December 15, 2017, or until the distribution of the
18	required report, whichever is later.
19	B. The members of the Task Force shall consist of the principle
20	authors of this act from the Senate and the House of
21	Representatives, the Senate legislative members of the Business,
22	Commerce and Tourism Committee, the House of Representative
23	legislative members of the Business, Labor and Retirement Laws
24	Committee, and the Commissioner of Labor, or designee. The members

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of the Task Force shall meet at the call of either legislative chair of the Senate or House Committees assigned as members of this Task Force. The Task Force shall conclude its meetings and study on or before December 15, 2017. A report of the work, findings and recommendations of the Task Force shall be prepared by the Senate or House staff members and distributed to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Commissioner of Labor, and the members of the Task Force not later than December 31, 2017.

- C. The Task Force shall study and evaluate the effects of an Oklahoma employer changing work hours and/or work schedules with little or no notice on hourly or salaried employees and the impact on employers, employees, and the community job markets. The Task Force shall further study and evaluate any relevant or collateral issues pertaining to work hours, schedules, childcare, transportation to and from work or other matters arising within the discussions and investigations of this study.
- D. Staffing for the Task Force shall be provided by the Senate and House staff to its respective members during the study. The Task Force shall be chaired jointly by the chairs of the legislative committees. The Commissioner of Labor may provide additional assistance and support upon request.

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        E. Legislative members may receive travel reimbursement for
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    official meetings as authorized by law. No other payments or
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    reimbursements shall be authorized.
        SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2017.
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        SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
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    of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
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    declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
    be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
